



I believe I sent in my game fee the same day. At no point was I anything but enthusiastic about the format. The short deadlines not only adapt well to postal play, but allow for a more wide open game as timing becomes a more crucial and ever present factor. It much more reminded me of the style of a FTF game where actions seems to dictate alliances rather than tradition and writing style. John's efficiency and fairness plus his "hard-line" seemed to be the glue that held this almost chaotic game together.

I have nothing bad to say about any of the players, so from that (and probably many other) standpoint this letter will be boring. Sorry guys. About the drawing alliance between Bill and myself... It was not nutured from the beginning of the game. In fact, I was trying my best to ignor him and keep him busy with the Russian. The grounds for an alliance was purely situational and was cemented by a couple mutually complimenting moves. Soon thereafter we had letters cross in the mail that outlined our independently arrived at visions for the rest of the game; they were essentially identical. From that point on the game was more or less tactical, we really never had any "issues" to discuss. That was a tremendous advantage in the 10 day format as it took the other players (me included) about a month to recognize the A-T spectre. That was over 3 game seasons and by then there was little anyone could do to stop us.

At the game s beginning there was a 3-way "pen-pal" sort of alliance between Mitchell, Kelley and myself. We exchanged a flurry of letters (an aspect of postal diplomacy I like). The monkeywrench that ended our bliss was the fact that the best player in the game was playing Italy. To point out a contrast in styles, Becker and I only talked once on the phone and that was to clean up the mess my leaving for a two week vacation created. We conducted the entire game via the mail, such as it is. Frost, on the other, hand, not only was lightyears ahead of me in his analysis of the game of Diplomacy, but he already appearantly understood the impact of a well timed phonecall. He totally awed me in our first conversation. My reaction ... I'd better ally with this boy! His action after our conversation awed me even more; he stabbed me. Communication ceased but his moves continued to amaze me as his position continued to improve despite be surrounded by the "triple alliance" of A/G/F. About '03 or '04 the A-T alliance started to take shape and I figured my problems with Frost were over. But what's this? Frost calls me for the second time in the game and announce he's on to the A-T alliance (I mean I was barely on to it) and tries to undo me again. Awed again, but not duped. Having to deal with a "genius" as my main nemesis was the highlight of the game and I had mixed emotions when he was finally eliminated. The other highlight was that the action and fast pace of the game could actually form an alliance itself. I think both Bill and I were surprised when the ramifications of an A-T became appearant. We had no time to really pound out an agreement, but we both acted on the situation and, presto, the game was in our hands. With longer deadlines the other players may have smelled the rat and formed a counteralliance. But, as it was, they continued to scrap and the once very exciting game became a yawner. Thanks to all for a great game. When's the next 10 DAY, John?

Endgame Statement (John Kelley, France) for 1979-CK:

Boy, was this a strange experience. Ten days, indeed! I wondered if I would even be able to keep up with the thing, let alone work up a good position.

Well, things started out on a fairly good note. Somehow, from the beginning, I felt Russia was doomed. No disrespect to Dave, of course; but it was a premonition. Yup, sure enough, down he went. Over in France I was quite bewildered. Letters came from most everyone; but the one from Tom Henthorn over in Austria impressed me most. John Michalski, GM: Never in my life have I seen any GM so prompt, excellent, knowledgeable, and outright fun to play under than John Michalski. He never failed to give us the maximum time possible with these short deadlines, and even though I got wiped out, this game was well worth my money. Here's to John Michalski, one of the hobby's outstanding GMs.

We are on the borderline of being a second-rate strategic power right now, and will be one in 10 years if something isn't done now!
