LETTERS this issue have forced me to go almost without a cover! My count came up a bit too high, but I can't often get myself to leave out a thing, so I'm putting the 'cover' and note on the back of one of Jack Frost's CANAL DRECS. That way all I will have to leave out of thi issue will be Iid/Nid and a couple of odd filler items that can wait. Nid, the second Blind Madman game, is hard to print up, since the madman units are gone and there is usually no press, so I have nothing to publish except deadlines! It is in endgame though, and it's entire history will be coming out in a couple of issues, I'm guessing. 79Iid, the first blind madman game, is further along in time, but still has a fairly fluid situation: no one has a lock on it yet, though there are contenders. With my luck, they'll both end at the same time... And speaking of the variant games, this issue sees the first publication of a two man game between Brux Linsey and George Leritte, who are playing FRT vs EGI with A in CD. They pretty much arranged it between themselves and are just using my GMing services Originally, Bruce was to play Curtis Gibson, but there was no agreement on the rules of play, so that fell through. George Leritte stepped in, and 80Lji shows 1901 inside.

BIG ISSUES are spreading, and may do so further as the idea of sending them at 20¢ third class as I do spreads. Ron Brown's MURDRIN MINISTERS #19 was a double weight one (1528 El Sereno, Bakersfied, CA 93304), and Michael Mills' latest EMHAIN MACHA used light paper aside from the cover to run an 8 sheet issue that got by for 15¢. I'm glad to be getting BB again. And what do I see?? Curt Gibson leaping from lunacy to lunacy.

Anyone tempted to believe that astrology has anything in common with the scientific disciplines should read Ike Asimov's "Stars in Their Courses", published in his essay collection of the same name, and also in the March 1970 F&SF. There is no independently verifiable experimental evidence which validates any of the suppositions on which astrology is alleged to work. The term "science" cannot be applied to any area for which such evidence is lacking.

Gibby's contention that the Biblical condemnation of astrologers was not a condemnation of astrology is hysterical. No doubt Nero and Diocletian also approved of Christianity whilst zapping every Christian within reach. The official position of Yahwism and of Judaism condemned astrology because it was an adjunct of pagan cults. That did not keep various Kings of Israel and Judah from keeping astrologers about.

That the Chaldeans, Babylonians, and Sumerians dabbled in astrology proves nothing. They also believed the world was flat and lay at the center of the universe. In any event, what does the Book of Daniel have to do with it? That is a work of didactic and apocolyptic fiction written in or about 164 B.C....using it as an historical source is no more to be recommended than using Lord of the Rings.

Reincarnation is a subject in which I can work up no particular interest. If it is, or if it ain't, so what? There is no way to understand the subject properly unless we get a direct revelation from God Herself. Should that happen, I will sit up and take notice; otherwise, I can only be amused at all these fools pretending to know all about it.

But: As usual, Gibby is busily citing nonexistent evidence. Reincarnation has never been a belief nor a doctrine in the Judaeo-Christian churches and tradition, and no reputable Biblical scholar would assert otherwise. There is no textual evidence whatsoever for any other conclusion, and the texts cited by Gibby are plainly irrelevant. The notion of reincarnation is inconsistent with the notion of resurrection as the latter was construed by post-Exilic Judaism and by early Christianity. Pre-Exilic Yahwism, by the way, seems to have believed that death was the end of everything.

Gibby's comments on the Essenes give ample evidence of his wide-ranging ignorance. We know that sect better than any other, thanks to the Dead Sea Scrolls, and there is no evidence they believed in reincarnation. Nor is there any evidence that Jesus and his followers were Essenes...in fact, the liklihood is that they were not. Jesus seems to have shared some beliefs in common with the sect, but these same beliefs were common to Galileeans generally and are known in other northern sects. The Essenes themselves were a whole collection of sects; the term is roughly the equivalent of "Protestant" in that sense. Jesus may have belonged to one of these groups, the Nazoraeans, but there is no positive evidence. One reason to doubt Jesus belonged to any sect: we have to remember who he was. What did he need of sects and their teachings?

If Jesus actually believed in reincarnation, he went to great lengths to conceal that belief. Strikingly uncharacteristic of him, wouldn't you say? For whatever reason, he had nothing to say on the subject.

Not that I read the Bible much (at all) or anything, but if one of the prods Jesus had at his disposal was the threat of having someone come back in another life as a mule. a cockroach, a liberal, or an earthworm, I'm sure one of those preachers somewhere along the line would have told me about it. Instead, the one big lesson I seem to have drawn is that to do well in your next life, a handful of bucks in the collection basket is one

I wanted to comment on your remarks about poor people and gambling. I saw a sizable. article on this some time back and I wish I had it in front of Anyhow, it did show that Low Income (LI --- not really the same as poor, but I assume thats what you mean) people are more likely to gamble than middle income and high income, tho the difference was not all that great. A LI gambler gambled more frequently than a non-LI, a more pronounced difference. However, if you look at the amount of \$55 gambled, then its by FAR the other way around. This is because LI gambling tends to be for much samller stakes. In this area, you can bet on the (illegal) numbers for as little as 25%, and office pools can get as low as 10% I've heard. So it depend Berch, conclusion

s on what you measure. If you use the frequency of perople whose lives are seriously damaged by gambling, then on a per capita basis its a much more serious problem in the miggdle income gambler. Actually, there are other variables that are much more highly correlated than income. The strong beleif in religion, as I recall, particularly fundimentalist religion, was strongly correlated with non-gambling, as was living in a completely rural area.

However, I think it is a mistake to try to isolate gambling per se. For example, a VERY strong case can be made that for the vast majority of ordinary investors, investing in the stock market, and especially in options and in commodities, is just a form of gambling. Yes there is skill invalved, but the average investors skill level is so far below that of his real competition (professionals who handle accounts for institutions, such as pension plans, insurance companies) that it really just amounts to a gamble. Further, there is a skill level in many forms of gambling, too. A good card counter can, for example, beat the house odds at blackjack. Not counting stock market investing as gambling is really a cultural matter. And of course there are som tax advantages available for losses there not abaliable to thowho must reort to the numbers for their gambles.

Further, much of gambling must be considered in the context of entertainment. There is very little difference between the mother who spends , say, \$5 for a few hours of bingo, and her son who blows a like amount on pinball machines. I am told that betting on sports games adds to the enjoyment of watching the game. For a 50% number you can have a day's worth of fantasy's of sudden wealth. Its not a high price.

I was amused, but not surprised by your solution: "keep gambling suppressed. This is a typical right wing response. You guys love to scream about big government regulating every aspect of our lives, quashing free enterprise (making illegal is the ultimate in regulation of a business) and generally acting like Big Brother Who Knows whats Best for You ---- except whit comes to something that you don't personally approve of. Then all the sudden you want the gov't to put a stop to it. Gambling laws are by and largunenforceable. I have been in hundreds of illegal poker games. Sporadic enforcement of such laws promotes disrespect for law in general. Making itil-legal reduces the payoff to the gambler, and provides a steady source of \$55 for the thugs who run some of these outfits (and who enforce repayment require ints) and for the corrupting of policemen, bribed just to make sure they look the other way.

I suspect that many people have what might be called a budget --- money that goes for one or more of booze, hookers, drugs, cigarrett. gambling. If you choke off one, people will just switch their \$5 to others. The irony is that of those on that list, the two most legal (booze and cigaretts) are probably the most harmful

I was amused by your asking for your IDA dues back. Have you ever heard of an organization refunding its dues --- any organization?

((The request was purely protest; I have learned that the IDA is good for nothing except bullshit, at which it excels.

My preference for continued suppresssion was like my support for Social Security: it goes against the grain of the conservative belief of self-reliance, but as a practical matter, it recognizes that MANY people are total incompetents at wiping their own butt. Thus, SS is needed to handle the elderly who never saved a dime, and suppression (at least superficial) helps keep down the number of people who would irresponsibly throw away everything. Such governmental morality shoved down people's throat isn't nice, but then, if we did away with government making people's decisions for them, your own liberal philosophy would be wiped away in this country overnight.))

Your Taxes at Work

Some military recruiters, trying to make their quotas, are telling potential recruits to "tough it out" in the service for 90 days. Then if they want to, they can quit and collect unemployment compensation. Recruits seem to be taking that advice: The General Accounting Office says that, over a recent four-year period, over 444,000 recruits failed to complete their initial enlistments. The cost to the government of these early-outs: \$5.2 billion—\$167.3 million in unemployment compensation alone.

Parents of black schoolchildren in Gees Bend, Ala., are fighting a court-ordered busing plan that condemned the children to being shuttled 100 miles daily. When federal judges rejected Gees Bend's pleas to end the busing, which has gone on for 11 years now, the community decided to sue state and federal officials for \$3 billion in damages to parents and students from the "dehumanizing" bus trips. Ironically, because of "white flight" in the wake of the forced busing, the school the black students are being bused to is now all black. (submitted by Donald E. Burns)

Over seven years, Tom Holmberg of Waltham, Mass., built his transportation service for the handicappedcalled "Handicab"-from nothing into a seven-vehicle, \$132,000 success. But now he says he will have to sell out. A similar operation, Medicab, has already filed for bankruptcy. Both owners say they were forced out of business by competition from nonprofit groups receiving funds from the federal Urban Mass Transportation Administration. The subsidized nonprofits can afford to charge much less than the privately owned services, though their real costs are as high. Handicab, Medicab and other private businesses never had a chance to bid for the federal money; the Massachusetts transportation officials who handled the grant "felt that a nonprofit company would do a better job of operating the service than a profitmaking company would."

Last summer was a good year for the birds nesting on the tidal marshes near Imperial Beach, Calif., and an even better year for mosquitoes. It was the worst mosquito season in recent years, and at least 20 children and four adults had to get medical treatment. When residents, backed up by public health authorities, wanted to spray the marsh to kill the mosquito larvae, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service vetoed the idea: The pesticide might harm endangered bird species. Only in October, two months after the birds had moved on, did Fish and Wildlife lift the ban-but by then, mosquito season was over anyway.

How has Jimmy Carter been doing on his campaign promise to slim down the federal government? Well, when he took office, there were 352,000 federal workers in the Washington, D.C., area; today, there are 365,000.

Manpower ceilings do exist—but the bureaucrats have found ways around them. One much-used ploy is to hire two part-timers (who don't show up in employment figures) to do the work of one full-timer. Another gambit is to drop workers from the payroll during the two-week period when the government counts its personnel, and then rehire them immediately afterwards.

Here's an example of how "controlling the bureaucracy" has worked in practice. At first glance, HEW is a middle-sized department, with only 145,000 employees—compared to the Pentagon's roster of over a million. But wait! Besides its full-time workers. HEW money pays for contractors, researchers at universities and think tanks, and state and local government employees working in HEW-funded programs. The hidden work force amounts to 981,200, sending the total who are dependent on HEW to 1,126,000. (submitted by Harold R. Sproul) The National Science Foundation has awarded the University of California at Berkeley \$9,356 for a year-long study entitled "The Logic of Laws Which Admit Exception."

Brandeis University is getting \$43,255 for a restudy of the Rungus of Northern Borneo. (And we haven't got around to reading the first study yet.)

And, the University of Wisconsin received \$78,356 for research on "Election Campaigns and Preadult Political Socialization."

The food stamp program costs tax-payers \$10 billion a year—but you'd never suspect it from reading these cheerful corn-shaped bookmarks, with their message that food stamps "do not cost anything." Ohio's Department of Welfare printed and distributed 50,000 of these advertising gimmicks to lure more takers to the program. On the side, they also publicize the International Year of the Child. Maybe the guiding idea behind IYC is that people should never have to grow up because their bureaucracies will take care of them.

For reasons which hardly need explanation, I must refuse your request for refund of your IDA dues. Indeed, I suspect that were it to become known that refunds of IDA dues were available there would be more requests than money in the treasury.

The IDA is not the type organization that can function by committee/group decisions. Responsibility must be delegated to appropriate individuals and he/she must have a free hand to carry on as he deems best. During the past two years, ideas of members of the IDA Council have been blown out of all proportion: in fact instead of dealing with ideas we have had to deal with "howling zeal." Discussions have become unimaginable blood baths.

For example: Robert Sacks was appointed Chairman of a committee to rewrite our constitution. Contrary to the wishes of the other members of the committee he insisted upon a document replete with such checks and balances and complexity that one would think we were preparing a charter for a federated United Nations or writing a doctoral thesis in political science. All we need is a simple charter which will help our officers function as expeditiously as possible.

Most past members of the IDA Councils, for instance-Rod Walker & Fred Davis--are aware of the difficulties
of the present Council system of doing business by
Committee action. But their efforts to get anything
accomplished were constantly thwarted by parliamentary
obstructionism of certain Council members who were
more interested in procedures than in substance. The
ringleader of this New York City clique was Bob Sacks.

The most recent development is that Bob Sacks, acting President of the IDA, has declared the appointment/election of Rod Walker as U. S. Projects Representative on the IDA to be illegal and stripped Walker of his vote on the IDA Council. What Sacks overlooked was that if Walker's appointment/election was not valid, then neither was Sacks' as President. Now, apparently, a new election is to be held for all IDA offices.

Rod Walker of Encinitas, California, will run against Sacks for President; Fred Davis will run for Ombudsman; I will run for U. S. Projects Representative; Eric Verheiden of Azusa, California, will run for Treasurer. If elected our aim will be to free the IDA of political bickering and concentrate upon freeing the responsible persons to spend their time taking care of the service projects: placement of orphan games, Boardman numbers assignment, a novice packet etc. Dick Martin

with the Orphan games and Lee Kendter Sr with the Boardman numbers already are doing fine: we would simply encourage their good work and give some financial support. We anticipate as few changes as possible, making no waves.

All dues are paid to January 1, 1981. By then we hope to have set a new course without political machinations indicating a simplified IDA with individual rather than

committee responsibilities. We will merely be supporting various hobby services without any grandiose schemes for hobby manipulation.

We need input from you and the other Zine publishers because you publishers are the backbone of the hobby. The average time of a publisher's acitvity is only about 5 years, perhaps less. Thus you can see that new publishers should participate without delay. We need to know what services you publishers deem most worthwhile and who is available to take on the various chores. Whoever is willing to serve should be free to work without interference.
