Brad publishes the attractive new zine BORN TO DIP, a refreshing rightish zine that offers 2-week-deadline black press openings, along with regular openings. Drop them each a stamp and ask for a sample. Getting into a game in a new zine is a nice experience for all, except when the thing drops from under you after 8 issues. These ere both witty and look promising, tho. (That fast black press game sounds tempting, but I'm already in too much...) If you would like to expand your hobby involvement, NOW is the time to do it: these newcomers are eager to get customers, and will often give you a cost break. Next year should be the year of the average dipzeen going to 50-60s, so sign up now and do both of you a favor. ERIC 020G doesn't publish to my knowledge, but some of you veteran subscribers may remember his name from the heyday of the Tretick exposures, where Eric was one of those rare birds allying himself with "Bernie". I hope Bric is both older and wiser now, but in any case, may perhaps offer us some views from the 'other side' in letters or something. Again, I encourage all of you to write in with your views on all issues: that is what keeps BB worth reading.

FRANCOIS CUERRIER has set a new record with his recent issue of PASSCHENDAELE that ran to an astounding 104 pages. Not all useless crap either; quite an accomplishment. My issue took quite a while in arriving due to it having to be mailed at virtually book rate. Those large envelopes travel by truck, not plane. An impressive project. If you don't get it, send at least a buck to Box 32 Station A, Ottawa, Ontario KIN 0T9 The 12 page BB review didn't sound exactly accurate to me-possibly dated—but at over

a page, who can complain?

Speaking of complaints, that darn ERUX LINSKY put out another issue that not only starts ANOTHER new game (his 5th in 2 issues), but reprints the entire 1 page of Robrt Bryan Lipton's MIXUMAXU CAZETTE #115 with his commentary on it, just as I was planning

to do! Mr Lipton folded MMG some years ago and now only uses it as a flyer to send game results out on. During its normal life, it was one of my initial favorites. The issue in question contains one of those hobby-has-gone-to-hell-since-my-goodold-days editorials that usually make the author look dumb and out of it; this one was no exception. Someone sent me a courtesy copy, as I was mentioned in it ("Is John Michalski any more to you than a right-winger?"). And then here Linsey comes along and runs it ahead of me. What is the BULLETIN coming to? It used to be that no one except Konrad Baumeister would steal a headline from me... Other stuff brought up by Linsey includes further wild extrapolations of possible "ambiguous" orders that readily show Linsey's programming background. It seems he puts himself in place of the computers he works with, and as CM, tries (successfully) to come up with problems and "ambiguities" that no normal human mind could possibly concoct. It makes for interesting reading if you too are a machine and cannot tell the difference or irrelevence between a blank and a zero, for instance. On the other hand, if you take it all as a parody of logic, it can be funny. If you take it seriously, seek professional help. Next issue of VD may contain an expose' of the ambiguities caused by Tyr for both Tyrolia and Tyrhennian Sea... Ah, one more item. I and a few others were mentioned/assailed for having a higher rate for new subscribers than for old, with the added plea of "give the novice a break". Well. ·I for one cannot agree. The only way one could make such a case would be if (a) one seeks to expand on current circulation considerably (b) you don't care who subscribes individually, only in gross, and (c) you look at it more as a business or an advertising campaign than as a hobby project. None of those are true with me.

The present size of BB is actually about 25% more than I'd really prefer to handle; however, I really cannot turn away paying customers, even at lower rates. With an ever-increasing % of the costs of BB coming \$-for-\$ out of my own pocket, incoming checks are needed in a fairly steady rate. Therefore I don't want to TURN AWAY new faces, but on the other hand. I couldn't handle 125 subbers. Half that many is something of a chore already, but possible. Why encourage faster growth then, when I already am slowly growing a tad faster than some old faces are falling away? Next, novices already can get a break here with very cheap games, since a sub to BB is OPTIONAL. For \$3.50 total cost, you can get into 2 or 3 games that will appear here right now. I challenge anyone except Andy Lischett to beat that cost. On the other hand, why give them (or anyone) any more of a break than they're already getting? Whether at 33 or 43¢ each, a 22 page BB mailed 3d class would be \$1.70 at COST if done commercially at 72 a copy. For the moment, copying costs are only ("only") my gas costs to and fro to Midwest City if and whenever I can get it run off, and I'm already passing on the savings. I always have. If any novice (or anyone else) thinks these rates are too high for receiving an average of about 44 pages of material a month, they can frankly go take a flying leap. Finally, the smaller cost for veteran subbers is a gesture of thanks for sticking around with me. I view publishing to some extent as a newsletter between friends, as well as a public platform and/or 'business' of running games. Therefore, if I can afford to make such a gesture to the veterans, I will. I hope this explains the matter to any interested. (I don't have time to write when I have a BB due out, so I'll kill two birds with one stone and write back to Bruxus here and make an editorial of it. Lazy, hey?)

PEAFL #1 is the latest fake that I think Jack Masters has put out, attributing the the thing to our own David Perlmutter. What would seem to be 2 supported attacks on each other have an entirely different result here than you might think at first glance, so here is what transpired. 1. Italian A Tri supports A Ven, so no matter what, A Ven is not dislodged. 2. Germany orders A PIE to support A TYO to VEN, not Tyo S A Pie-Ven. Since support from Tyo might be cut from Vienna, this is the tactically "right" way to order it. 3. DIP is not a strict tactical game, however. Italy (seemingly) planned accordingly and ordered Ven to support Vie-Tyo. Had it been reversed, or, had Germany reversed his orders, both sides would have locked up, as each supporting unit would have its support cut from an outside province. Here, though, the German is caught by the gamerule that says "a unit cannot cut the support of a unit attacking IT". This is fair and proper, as A BUR S A RUH-MUN, A RUH-MUN should not fail because the other guy orders A MUN-BUR. Bur support will not be cut, and Ruh-MUN succeeds. The fact that Tyo-Ven here was supported has no effect, for Tri S A Ven holds it back. Then Ven S A Vie-Tyo SUCCEEDS. That's the mechanics of it. It was either good strategy, or, dumb luck...



The GOP majority does not consist purely of conservatives; indeed, the older moderates like Baker, Hatfield, Packwood, STevens, etc, all have major chairmanships. Still, a few of our boys did get chairs: Tower, Thurmond, McClure, Garn (I personally regard Helms as too far right even for my blood, but suppose that he belongs here). They will be able to attrit the Great Society-to knock down the extreme regs and programs-to balance the budget although probably not before '82-to eventually abolish the departments of Energy and Education (say before 84)-to make significant but not huge increases in military budgets and readiness although probably not the MX and hopefully not the B1 as well-to pass Kemp-Roth in one form or another. To bring inflation down to earth and reduce the government share of the GNP while cutting government social engineering quite a bit.

What it doesn't it mean-a giant crackdown on lifestyle issues-abortion, drugs, gays, etc. Doubtful if anyone wants to touch this. A definite easing of federal intervention in state and local laws on the subject can be expected however, as well as slightly stronger Hyde amendments-constitutional ammendments on school prayer, bussing, and balanced budgets are possible. Right to life and such probably not, no repeal of the basic structure of the New Deal-Fair Deal economic-social formatting, that to most Americans alive today are the way things always were. Almost certainly no major tinkering with the entitlement programs except perhaps on the fringes of the welfare end-too many benificiaries and far too easy for an uneducated public and a liberal media to let the dems demagogue on this one-besides the votes just aren't there. This is especially true of Social Security, Veterans, govt pensions, etc-no attacks of the union structure although some attrition at the fringes of their power-especially in the Chrysler type-this is a regional issue like Conrail cutting across lib-con or party lines. Some attempts to aid industrialiazation-technology-growth against the envirnment but not too far except in the west as this is the one popular initiative of of the last twenty liberal years (key exceptions would be federal lands policies at variance with the wishes of majorities in a state (ex Alaska) or protection of tiny species like dam in Tennessee or energy). Probably waffling on the nuke issue. Again, cuts across party lines. With a majority they can throw away in 82, folks are more likely to settle for what can be done now than worry pie in the sky like repealing OSHA or EPA-but a possible sleeper would be repeal of either the excess profits tax (substituting a straight tariff on imported petro/gas) or the entire estate tax-which is a middle class issue where with inflation there is virtually no way to preserve a family business or farm. Biggest difference besides economy and social engineering is likely to be foreign affairs. Not a more military foreign policyif anything, probably less so at first as our side knows just how unprepared we really are. However, fewer sellouts of unpleasant allies for unknown "improvements" EX: Iran or Nicaragua. Probably a more consistant Mideast policy that will ≟attempt to get the Egypt-Israel talks going by not constantly threatening to **s**ell Israel out to Arrafat (this President's brother isn't on Libya's payroll-interesting sidelight: will Billy boy ever pay off his loans?) -try for a deal on Gaza if nothing else-could be a first point. End of tilt towards Iran in current war.. More realistic, defend them from Russia and if they think they are, they are welcome to welcome to stop doing us favors-probably a harder line in general towards Europe and and Japan who have gotten far too long a free ride from us. Should be interesting times.

### HOW TO SWIM WITH SHARKS A PRIMER

#### Forward

Actually, nobody wants to swim with sharks. It is not an acknowledged sport, and it is neither enjoyable nor exhibitating. These instructions are written primarily for the benefit of those who, by virtue of their occupation, find they must swim and find that the water is infested with sharks.

It is of obvious importance to learn that the waters are shark infested before commencing to swim. It is safe to assume that this initial determination has already been made. If the waters were clearly not shark-infested, this would be of little interest or value. If the waters were shark infested, the naive swimmer is by now probably beyond help; at the very least he has doubtless lost any interest in learning how to swim with sharks.

Finally, swimming with sharks is like any other skill; it cannot be learned from books alone; the novice must practice in order to develop the skill. The following rules simply set forth the fundamental principles which, if followed, will make it possible to survive while becoming expert through practice.

#### Rules

- 1. Assume unidentified fish are sharks. Not all sharks look like sharks and some fish which are not sharks sometimes act like sharks. Unless you have witnessed docide behavior in the presence of shed blood on more than one occasion, it is best to assume an unknown species is a shark. Inexperienced swimmers have been badly mangled by assuming that docide behavior in the absence of blood indicates that the fish is not a shark.
- 2. Do not bleed. It is a cardinal principle that if you are injured either by accident or by intent that you must not bleed. Experience shows that bleeding prompts an even more aggressive attack and will often provoke the participation of sharks which are uninvolved or, as noted above, are usually docile.
- \*Little is known about the author who died in Paris in 1812. He may have been a descendent of Francois Voltaire and an ancestor of Jacques Cousteau. Apparently this essay was written for sponge divers. Because it may have broader implications, it was translated from the French by Richard J. Johns, an obscure French scholar.

Admittedly, it is difficult not to bleed when injured. Indeed, at first this may seem impossible. Diligent practice, however, will permit the experienced swimmer to sustain a serious laceration without bleeding and without even exhibiting any loss of composure. This hemostatic reflex can in part be conditioned, but there may be constitutional aspects as well. Those who cannot learn to control their bleeding should not attempt to swim with sharks, for the peril is too great.

The control of bleeding has a positive protective element for the swimmer. The shark will be confused as to whether or not his attack has injured you, and confusion is to the swimmer's advantage. On the other hand, the shark may know he has injured you and be puzzled as to why you do not bleed or show distress. This also has a profound effect on sharks. They begin questioning their own potency or, alternatively, believe the swimmer to have supernatural powers.

3. Counter any aggression promptly. Sharks rarely attack a swimmer without warning. Usually there is some tentative, exploratory agressive action. It is important that the swimmer recognizes that this behavior is a prelude to an attack and takes prompt and vigorous remedial action. The appropriate countermove is a sharp blow to the nose. Almost invariably this will prevent a full scale attack, for it makes it clear that you understand the shark's intentions and are prepared to use whatever force is necessary to repel his aggressive actions.

Some swimmers mistakenly believe that an ingratiating attitude will dispel an attack under these circumstances. This is not correct; such a response provokes a shark attack. Those who hold this erroneous view can usually be identified by their missing limb.

4. Get out if someone is bleeding. If a swimmer (or a shark) has been injured and is bleeding, get out of the water promptly. The presence of blood and the thrashing of water will elicit aggressive behavior even in the most docile of sharks. This latter group, poorly skilled in attacking, often behave irrationally and may attack uninvolved swimmers or sharks. Some are so inept that in the confusion they injure themselves.

No useful purpose is served in attempting to rescue the injured swimmer. He either will or will not survive the attack and your intervention cannot protect him once blood has been shed. Those who survive such an attack rarely venture to swim with sharks again, an attitude which is readily understandable.

The lack of effective countermeasures to a fully developed shark attack—emphasizes the importance of the earlier rules.

5. Use anticipatory retaliation. A constant danger to the skilled swimmer is that the shark will forget that he is skilled and may attack in error. Some sharks have notoriously poor memories in this regard. This memory loss can be prevented by a program of anticipatory retaliation. The skilled swimmer should engage in these activities periodically, and the periods should be less than the memory span of the shark. Thus, it is not possible to state fixed intervals. The procedure may need to be repeated frequently with forgetful sharks and need be done only once for

sharks with total recall.

The procedure is essentially the same as described under rule 3—a sharp blow to the nose. Here, however the blow is unexpected and serves to remind the shark that you are both alert and unafraid. Swimmers should take care not to injure the shark and draw blood during this exercise for two reasons: First, sharks often bleed profusely and this leads to the chaotic situation described under rule 4. Second, if swimmers act in this fashion it may not be possible to distinguish swimmers from sharks. Indeed, renegade swimmers are far worse than sharks, for none of the rules or measures described here are effective in controlling their aggressive behavior.

6. Disorganize an organized attack. Usually sharks are sufficiently self-centered that they do not act in concert against a swimmer. This lack of organization greatly reduces the risk of swimming among sharks. However, upon occasion the sharks may launch a coordinated attack upon a swimmer or even upon one of their number. While the latter event is of no particular concern to a swimmer, it is essential that one know how to handle an organized shark attack directed against a swimmer.

The proper strategy is diversion. Sharks can be diverted from their organized attack in one of two ways. First, sharks as a group are especially prone to internal dissention. An experienced swimmer can divert an organized attack by introducing something, often something minor or trivial, which sets the sharks to fighting among themselves. Usually by the time the internal conflict is settled the sharks cannot even recall what they were setting about to do, much less get organized to do it.

A second mechanism of diversion is to introduce something which so enrages the group that they begin to lash out in all directions, even attacking inanimate objects in their fury.

What should be introduced? Unfortunately, different things prompt internal dissention or blind fury in different groups of sharks. Here one must be experienced in dealing with a given group of sharks, for what enrages one group will pass unnoted by another.

It is scarcely necessary to state that it is unethical for a swimmer under attack by a group of sharks to counter the attack by diverting them to another swimmer. It is, however, common to see this done by novice swimmers and by sharks when they fall under a concerted attack.

You wondered how so many actually survived concentration camps. Then I was an undergraduate I met someone whose mother had survived such a death camp. Her story might shed some light on this.

39 of the 42 members of her extended family were suddenly rounded up, and sent on a three day train ride across part of Rumania (they were gypsie who were treated much the same as Jews by Witler) to a campa there they were searched lightly for weapons. But finding the more valuable items like jewels and gold would take a very tedious search, as such things can be swallowed, etc So the entire group, about 700, were put in a huge walled compound and given neither food nor water. If they wanted that, valuables had to be presented for barter. This was done for 12 days, to shakeloose whatever valuables people were not willing to die for. Then the guards came and pulled out around 60 of the most able bodied of the survivors (incidently, the food was distributed by the inmetes; only a few people were delegated to make the exchanges on behalf of the group, as the guards wanted to limit the spread of disease). The Remainder were shot over a period of two days. She and two cousins were amoung the 60, who joined a work force culled from earlier batches of prisoners. Their main job was to dig huge burial trenches (The camp had one bulldozer, but the work crew had managed to sabatogue it, fearing for their jobs/life). In addition, they were given whatever other jobs they could be trusted with, This included pulling fillings from the teeth of the dead bodies, shaving hair hair (for wigs); working in the brothel and in the garden, keeping the rail tracks in good order and general camp work (except in the kitchen). Life was still very precarious for the Work Force. Fordwas very limited, and those who could no longer work fully were shot because there would always be a fresh batch of victims coming in. Discipline was very harsh --- any offense was settled by death --- again, there would always be more bodies coming in. Every few weeks a new set of arrivals would arrive by train and the cycle would begin again. Anyhow, at one point they decided to make an escape. force was a little under 150 at that point. About 20 were killed as suspected stooges for the guards. There was disagreement as to which was the best way out, so they broke into two groups. Hers had 77 members (selected 77 is somehow considered to be a lucky number). Of those, 6 actually survived the guns and got out, but 2 had to be abandoned a short time later due to the seriousness of their wounds, and a third becamse crazy and wandered off. The other three made their way to greece where they waited out the war as best they could. As it turned out, the family had agreed that if they were dispersed they would try to get together via contacting a cousin in Canada. One of the 3 not caught up in the initial sweep also survived. He too was grabbed, but managed to get hold of a Russian uniform (by killing its owner, I suspect) and them persuading the captors that there had been a bad mistake and that he was really a P.O.W. He had been sent to the same camp that she was, but then they ent him to a P.O.W. camp in Germany where he spent the rest of the wer doing lunteer"work for I.G. Farben. So of the 42 gypsies, 2 survived.

In reality, there were two kinds of camps going under the general effection camps. One kind was a series of slave camps. These were ated mainly byPOWs, political dissidents, religious dissidents, common als, and, at the beginning, volunteers ("Freiarbiten"). There were Jews too, but they were there by and large because they were unrecognized as yet even these had an aspect of being a death camp. Food was so limited work so hard, that many were in effect worked to death, even the teause may have been sucumming to disease in their weakened state. here were the extermination camps. These are an hisotorical fact, dismiss them just because the Russians got there first. These were the east, specifically Poland becase Apparently Hitler felt that the

th lesser amounts of gypsies and some scattered Jehova's Witnesses. These are the groups that Hitler wanted exterminated. There was no work output from hese camps. Please remember that the Nazis were meticulous record keepers. he Nuremburg trials were based primarily on their own records. This is the main reason that most relied on the I-was-following-orders defense, rather than I-didn't-do-it. Records showed shipments of poison gas. Memoranda showed now fast people could be executed and cremated, so that the incoming amounts of people by train could be balanced against anticipated ability to deal with them. This is not to day of course that there wasn t physical evidence. When carbolic acid injectmions proved too bothersome, the stuff just lay around till the wars end. Or old trucks (usually woth broken axles or something) which had the ex haust fed into the back of the truck. Now, what do you suppose that was used for? I could go on but it is nausieting.

Of course, even these camps had some aspect or work camps, as there were jobs for work crews, ande up mostly of prisoners at the camp. These people, along with escapees and those there when camps were liberated, formed the great bulk of the survivors.

Yes, it is true that thousands of Jews survived these camps, and many of them survived the true death camps, the extermination camps. But these are mere thousands out of millions. Look at the result. Before the war, the Jewish population of non-Soviet was estimated at 5-7 million. Some escaped in the late 30s, and some were smuggled out fluring the war. But the Jewish population was worse than decimated, it was virtually eliminated. This did not happen to Catholics or Lutherins or Greek Orthodox, and it is not because Jews are so much physically weaker that they could not survive the rigors that others could. They were selectively exterminated becase that was the intention of the Mazis.

This theory that people were somehow embarrased because they survived a work camp is absolutely obscene. The only code --- regardless of the precise nature of how people came to die at the camps --- was to survive with whatever dignity could be salvaged. Did you see "Playing for Time" on TV? In it, the central character criticizes her friend, who is selling her body for some additional food. Its not the exchange itself that is criticized --- that is recorgnized as part of her attempt to survive. Its that she doesn't share some of the extra food, to lend a little dignity to what she is doing.

((I'm very appreciative, and impressed, with much of what you had to say here. I think that your arguments concerning the Nazi defense pleas is probably the strongest; the acid and train record's items are, while unsupported here, certainly strong-sounding. And while some will tend to poo-pooh the personal tales, I place more value in them, even if, to apply a coldly impersonal standard to a very personal story, only because it indicates truth via the reasoning of: 'why tell the relatives a cooked-up story?'. Oh, there are some weaknesses, but you have come through with what I was looking for in the first place: some solid responses to the solid challenges being made. Stories about the exhaust trucks always abound, but on its face, one can see that if injection: were too bothersome, would running a truck for an hour to kill10-20 puking victims be any better? And why run the truck to kill Jews when latter Germany didn't have enough fuel for its own tanks in the field, e.g.? You also touch on the largest question: if there were originally "5-7 million Jews" in Russia then, how many are there today? It is easy to say "they were decimated" like it is easy to say "it is a historical fact! but to say so doesn't make it so. If that were true after all, why would Russia have the trouble with the Jews that we've been seeing these past few years? Whether the

Russians got to the camps first or not does make a big difference, now that the western powers who occupy the old western concentration camps have them open and do not/cannot claim that the tiny incinerators there were somehow part of a vast crematoria system. All the places that really were the baddies of a sorry lot were in the east, closed to public view. As I said in an earlier item though, I think the fact that Auschwitz really was levelled by the Nazis is itself anstrong argument that it actually was an extermination camp. There are those odd items like the German Justice Ministry carrying on a running inquiry/battle with the SS heirarchy over "allegations of exterminations" going on at Auschwitz, an investigation that only ended (albeit abruptly) in 1944 when the SS took over control of the Justice Ministry. Aside from that, though, what are the implications of such an inquiry being pursued if one follows the popular notion of a state hellbent on rounding up and wiping out the Jews? Seems kind of odd.

Anyhow, I do appreciate your taking the time and effort to share your thoughts/knowledge with us on this. You've made some effective points, probably the best to
