The master turned up later after being misplaced. My apologies to the players (who I presume did notice? No one has mentioned it to date...). I wonder if anyone would notice if I dropped all the games altogether sometime, or reduced them all the way I have two PERILS OF PAULINA and one season of 80D of mine this time?

I don't know where it is now. If any of you have it, I'd appreciate it if you would return it. I have one request for it here already, and I haven't the faintest idea of where it is. I'd appreciate it if anyone out there could find it and return it.

EMILY POST DEPT II: Bill Shaffer brought up a question some time ago that I was unable to give an answer to. I pose it to the readership then as a puzzle. Here's the situation: If you, like he, were a computer maintenance man, bugged all the time by curious customers looking over your shoulders, which of the two approaches to getting rid of them is the more courteous? 1. I'm not familiar with any, altho I vaguely remember the Eichmann business making headlines some years back. In his circumstances—being abducted, put on 'trial' by a country that didn't exist at the time of his crimes, etc—I don't think one could gather much. As I recall, he was executed promptly when the international community began raising questions about the legitimacy of the, uh, "procedure". Perhaps those involved more deeply with this could answer or elaborate on this point? The defense offered by Keitel and Jodl and the like would have little relevance to the Holocaust stories. We have a lot of material from Marukiewicz on that in this issue.

EVERYTHING #46 is going to be superceded by #47 if I don't get that overview of it done and printed quick, so, here it comes:

This breakdown is based on 37 regular postal dipgames reported in #46, the sine of the Boardman Number Custodian Lee Kendler Sr. EVERYTHING is a basic stat-sine published by Lee and printed up by Bob Sergeant, who also publishes ST GEORGE AND THE DRAGON. Analysis is based on the use of the Calhauer point system, whereby a win is counted as 1.0 pts, a three-way draw equals 1/3 of a point each, and so forth. The total of all points accumulated by each country in this way, based again on the 37 games reported, are as follows:

Austria, 4.27 England, 5.10 France, 3.82 Germany, 6.15 Italy, 2.48 Russia, 8.08 Turkey, 7.10  
On the average, each country "should" have accumulated 5.29 points (37\*7) if all things were equal. Clearly, they were not. Austria was a little below average, as one might expect; England is just a tad below average when I would have expected it to be a tad above. France, which is always one of, if not the most sought-after country, is WAY down. Germany continues to do quite well here, as it has done in about the last 3 or 4 issues, although I can't understand why. I hate playing Germany. Italy is as dismal as I would expect, while Russia is way above average, as I would also expect. I can't understand Turkey doing so well though, as Turkey has such limited options and is terribly boring to play. Taking the results above as a percentage of the 5.29 norm, we get this indication of how much each power is 'up' or 'down' from the average of all:

Austria, -19% England, -4% France, -28% Germany, +16% Italy, -53% Russia, +53% Turkey, +34%  
One of the biggest surprises for me is the fact that half of the games ended in outright WINS, 18 out of the 37. As for finishes, irrespective of point value (that is, the number of times that a given power made it into any kind of a draw or win, compared to the total number of drawing or winning powers in all games) resulted in an average of 10.71. In other words, if all wins and draws, of whatever size, were spread evenly among the seven powers, each "should" have 10.71 parts of a win. The actual results were:

Austria, 9, England, 13 France, 8 Germany, 11 Italy, 8 Russia, 11 Turkey, 15  
The only surprise there is the poor showing France made this time, making the end only 8 times, including 2 wins. England is above average, Turkey WAY above average, the others either average or just a little weak (Aus, Italy). Total wins for the others are, Austria 2, England 1, Germany 4(1), Italy 0, Russia 6, Turkey 3. Clearly, these results show that the hobby is going to hell fast, and it is all due to Dick Martin not being able to name his zen the same thing for two issues straight. Contributing items are the many novices coming in, and the pervasive incompetence fostered by a handful of sick GMs who pronounce seen as "sein". C'mon, Postal Dippy, shape up!

DIPLOMACY is a game invented by Alan Calhauer and copyrighted by the Avalon Hill Game Company of Baltimore, who charges you 12-15 dollars for the game when it is only \$9.95 on the shelf at Toys 'R' Us. Avalon Hill also produces RUSSIAN CAMPAIGN that Pilant will get the hang of one of these years (shortly after I run out of neat tricks to keep pulling on him); BATTLE OF THE BULGE that I just managed to stoop ol' Bill Shaffer's allies in on Monday; and other assorted games for people to play while the plumber stares incredulously at you for, while writing you up a \$37.37 bill for 4 minute's work chang ing a fixture in the upstairs bathroom. "Sure wish I could play games" he said to Fluff and I today. "Sure wish I could knock off \$40 for a 20 minute drive and 5 minute's work", I thought....

LATE NOTE: I now understand that postal rates won't change until about March 1, instead of the original January 1. All this scurrying for nothing. 'Nothing' other than getting out still another fast issue, anyway.....

I am also sending under seperate cover a little present for Christmas, a copy of Rassinier's book, The Drama of the European Jews. In this delightful Christmas offering he tries to prove that Hitler obviously didn't exterminate the Jews since most of them were still there at the end of the war. He has some good points, at least enough to make one suspicious of the published statistics; but I detect one major flaw in his arguments. I would be interested in seeing if you come up with the same point after your reading of the book. Please let me know.

Also inclosed is a copy of Hitler's biorhythms! Prepared at taxpayers expense at the Great Lakes Naval Training Stations computer by a friend of ~~Franklin D. Roosevelt~~. If they only knew in the Pentagon.

It seems like <sup>I</sup> am fixated on the Jewish Question, but that is only because I have been getting hold of some interesting material on the subject recently. I just got the CIA report which made the news last year with its aerial photos of Auschwitz taken in 1944 and another book by Rassinier, which I think is a real block buster, about his experiences in Buchenwald and Dora, the V-2 slave labor factory.

The CIA report is more provocative then informative. They have photos taken on four dates in the summer of 1944 when the Hungarian Jews were supposed to be getting it. Photos taken during the high point of the extermination. There is even a photo of a train pulled in the station at Birkenau, people walking along the track heading for either their bath and delousing or gassing. The gate to the showers or gas chamber is open. The act, whichever it is, is actually in process. And we can't tell one way or the other from the photos. Its fascinating yet frustrating. Photographic evidence lays on the table right before me, yet doesn't seem to help. The only evidence one way or the other I think the photos show is the fact, noted in the report itself, that while "eyewitnesses" reported that the crematoria belched smoke and fire day and night, on the four seerate days that photos exist there is no smoke. How interesting. Also, although it certainly is not hard evidence one way or the other, I was a bit amazed at the size of the barracks complex at Birkenau. The photos of 1944 show hundreds of barracks which housed I believe 50 to a hundred people, and more are under construction. Since this is supposed to be the one part of the entire Auschwitz complex where people were actually being gassed right off the trains, why all of the barracks? There shouldn't be any need for that many if you only last half a day at

Mazurkiewicz ("mazz-er-KAY-wits"), continued

Birkenau. The Nazi version claimed that this part of the camp was where they sent those who were too sick to work in the rest of the camp. Considering the treatment the Germans gave everyone, that would be enough to explain a lot of people going there and never coming back, even if the Germans were not purposely exterminating them. Again we can look at the example of Solzhnitsyn and the GULAG camps. No one is gassing them there, but look at how they died like flies, of neglect and casual, unsystematic brutality.

An important section of the book by Rassinier is about his own experiences. He says the camps were run primarily by the prisoners themselves. At Treblinka, according to a Jewish book I recently read, there were only 80 SS men assigned to the entire camp! Hardly enough to do more than act as high level supervisors. Rassinier says it was that way at Buchenwald. The camp was run and supervised by the prisoners themselves. The SS provided the bare necessities and allowed the prisoners to administer the allocation amongst themselves. Incidentally, this is the system spoken about even in your New York friend's letter. ((I think he means Mark Berch's here. It appeared in BB)) As he gets the story from his mother in law, and as we have gotten it in countless books written by survivors, all of the cruelty is carefully calculated and planned by the SS. According to a perceptive educated individual who was not part of this trustee system, most of the cruelty and suffering was the fault of the trustees, not the SS. The SS didn't plan it; they just didn't care if the enemies of the Reich lived or died. He states in his book, the feeling of the SS was: we give them enough to eat and wear (all that they deserve) and look what they do. Just like the subhumans they are, they cheat and abuse their own kind. This is of course the same phenomena which Solzhenitsyn speaks of in the Soviet GULAG camps. Millions died because the authorities just didn't care, and human inefficiency and greed, cruelty, etc. was allowed to run rampant. We have just seen a repeat with the Cuban exiles. Even when run with good intent, a "concentration camp" has again bred abuse and torture and suffering.

I would advise you to pick up a couple of these things if you are interested in the subject. I am especially amazed that since Butz's book has come out, there has been no rebuttal beyond just saying "Racist—don't read him" from the Jewish and liberal community. I would like to see someone address the specific questions Butz and Rassinier raise. Or are they right? I will have more about Rassinier in my next letter concerning the two conclusions pertaining to the genocide issue he draws from his experiences.

on this level. A typical German panzer division attack frontage is 3000 yards which represents ONE battalion attacking and the others following in column. To narrow the front makes one attack targets frontally, and get shot down. When we hear of whole corps attacking on one mile fronts, etc., what this means in reality is couple of battalions in action at one time, with the rest of the forces waiting in column to replace losses or to exploit if a breakthrough occurs. Only the Russians are stupid or forced to pack whole divisions into narrow sectors. They also suffered the result of getting themselves slaughtered in frontal assaults when they did so, didn't they?

I am a bit surprised to what a limited extent knowledge of tactical rules and weapons effects has been recorded by historians. I can really see that in a couple of hundred years, as little will be known of infantry or armor or fighter dogfighting tactics as we now know of Roman legionary tactics. The invention of printing doesn't do much good if no one is bothering to record the information. The professional historian doesn't soil his ignorant mind with such crass information, and the professional military man either doesn't deign to inform the "civilians" of such secret knowledge or else is so blase about these facts that he isn't aware that everyone doesn't know how to use a mortar.

Just recently I found a book called "If Germany Attacks" which is a study of German WWI tactics. The author covers the big battles from Loos on, telling what the Germans thought they were doing when they set up their defenses and the theory of handling reserves and counter-attacks, etc. during the battle. The difference is simply astounding between a book of such an analytical approach and the gosh-gee-whiz-type of anecdotal history we usually get. Such histories are written of course because the author has no idea of what each sides leaders were really doing during the course of the battle, is ignorant of tactics, and of weapons capabilities. ((A friend)) recently found a review of some recent book where the reviewer noted that histories of armies in peace time are more prevalent than histories of armies in action. Sociological studies are of course so much easier to research than combat.

\*\*\* I noticed the article about equipment readiness. Did you see any of the latest reports about the IQ scores and skill testing the Army released a couple of months ago? ((Yes)) For each combat arm skill, only 20% or less of the troops were able to score 70% or better. They also revealed that due to "errors", 46% of the Army recruits came from the lowest 30% on Army IQ tests. How nice. An Army of dummies who can't even operate their own weapons. The Soviets get better while we go down hill
