GAME OPENING







Electronic mail will hit, and soon, in two ways: 1. Businesses. As "office of the future" smart equipment starts hitting (at the low end similar to the IBM and Wang word processors, at the high end similar to the Xerox "star"), they almost have electronic mail options. This allows messages to be communicated locally through the computer nets and to remote branches via WATS lines (similar to the Xerox "internet"). This technology will be pushed by the recent introductions by Bell, Rolm, and, I beleive, Northern Telecom that allow a phone PBX to be used as a computer net (albeit at only 9600 baud as yet.) The technology will be further driven by cheapening satellite communications starting with crude systems like the IBM-Comsat deal leading tog more sophisticated (and cheaper) mixed-technology systems like the Xerox "X-ten" promore sophisticated (and cheaper) mixed-technology systems like the Xerox "X-ten" prothe posal which now has FCC approval. Eventually, different businesses will start linking together for cross-business communication in a method similar to the "ARDA-net" that currently links the top computer science research facilities in the US and is used mostly for electronic mail. 2. Homes: This will be spurred by the fact that RIGHT NOW the phone is as cheap as letters, if you do it right. Mimimum connect long-distance charge seems to be 18¢ (sound like a familiar number?). You could connect two computers, hobby type, even Apple IIs and Trash-80s would do) through a phone connection and transmit, say, 20 pages of text during a matter of a few seconds. If Ma Bell caught on to the implications of this (as someplaces in Bell labs have) and lowered the basic connection fee, hobby computers would probably start offering this as an option REAL

What WILL happen is centralized offices will open in which you can have an "electronic post office box" and you can PICK UP your mail there.
