GOOD NEWS. This issue was delayed until I could see my eyedoctor. My appointment was on the same day as this deadline, so for the first time in many moons, I was not able to get the first several pages prepared in advance. The good news is that I will not have to undergo cataract surgery on my right eye for at least another two years, barring any unforeseen complications. The medical profession has changed its thinking on doing such surgery when only one eye is involved. When a person has cataracts due to ageing, they are almost always bilateral, so the doctors will do the implant in both eyes, at about six-month intervals, giving the person the same vision in both. My condition is called a "traumatic" cataract, going back to a condition which affected only my right eye, back in 1955. There is no trace of cataract or any other eye disease in the left orb. If they were to put an implant in my right eye,

I would have uneven vision, since they could bring the right eye back to, say, 20/30, while my left eye vision is less than 20/200. This would cause me to have headaches and reading difficulties, which could not be entirely corrected with glasses. So, they will leave the right eye alone unless or until I go virtually blind in that eye, or until a cataract develops on the left. If the latter should occur, then they would do a bilateral displacement.

Three years ago, the doctors were gung ho for doing the lens implant replacement whenever a patient had a condition in one eye, but subsequent experience has taught them to wait. I'm rather lucky that my condition did not develop any earlier.

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR BUSHWACKER is that there will be no significant delay in production of this nonsense. I plan to continue to use Deadlines around the 8th of each month for a while. I may be going out of town for about twelve days in April, in which case, there will be a further delay, but at least for the next two months our deadlines will be on the 8th.

NORTH AMERICAN VARIANT BANK CATALOG REMINDER

The 1987-88 Catalog is now for sale at the regular price of \$4.00 in North America, or \$4.50 overseas. There are 36 laser-printed 8½ x 11 pages crammed with more information than you'll ever need about variants, plus two cardboard covers.

If you're going to MaryCon in June or DipCon in July, I plan to have copies available for over-the-counter sales @ \$3.25. If you're not attending either of those events, you may wish to order a copy by mail now.

The Catalog includes instructions on how to order copies of the games on file. The basic cost is 10¢ per page. The Catalog shows how many pages there are in each game. There is also a small surcharge for mailing and handling. This is 50¢ for up to 15 sheets, \$1.00 for between 16-49 sheets, and \$2.00 for 50 or more pages. The smaller your order, the quicker it can be filled. There is a limit of not more than 15 games at a time in any one order, since there are logistical limitations on what can be done by one person at any one time.

Several lucky people got their orders in before the December 21st deadline for the pre-publication price of \$3.00. Thankyou, gentlemen, for your compliments on the work we did. Also, thanks to those publishers who have reprinted the news of the Catalog's availability in their zines.

CAVEAT EMPTOR. Francois Guerrier has announced the rebirth of PASSCHENDAELE after an absence of five years. This zine had a very messy fold in 1982. Something like 20 games were left in the lurch. Francois had first announced the fold of his zine, and then, after an absence of several weeks, he produced a new issue and announced that both his marriage announcement and fold report were hoaxes. There were then about two or three more issues of PASSCHENDAELE, appearing at irregular issues, before the actual fold.

While Guerrier did refund most of his sub and game fees, this performance does not exactly encourage confidence in his zine as a place to play. Furthermore, it appears that he is again going to bite off more than he can chew, offering to start up to 26 games over the next four years! He also says he'll offer to take on some orphan games. It seems some people never learn to take things at a level they can handle.

It appears that Bruce cannot tolerate our apparent escape from the Real World to enjoy ourselves in the Postal hobby. He states his Diplomacy games are being turned over to Robert Sacks, "as I believe he is some sort of orphan coordinator." For a Reality Check, Bruce, the major hobby Orphan Games Coordinator is now Rod Walker. There are several brutal and uncalled-for remarks about several people in the hobby who may be less-fortunate than Bruce financially or medically. He has apparently never heard of the statement, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." Seeing how bitter his attitude is, I, for one, am rather glad to see his departure from the hobby.

THEY'RE PLOTTING AGAINST US

One thing which is disappearing from the stationery shelves is good old 8½ x 11 lined notebook paper. It is now possible to obtain this only for college-ruled paper and some types of graph paper. All of the wide-ruled paper is now reduced to 8 x 10½" size. I don't know whether this has been done to avoid further price increases, or are they reducing the size of hard-covered 3-ring notebooks?

The funny thing is that the powers-that-be finally got Uncle Sam to give up the 8 x 10½ paper size around seven years ago, because everyone else in the country was using the 8½ x 11 standard size. Now, we appear to be retrogressing toward the smaller size.

It is also no longer possible to buy 4-page carbon-set addressing labels from Dennison's in the usual ten-pack boxes. My stationer had stopped stocking these, because so many people had switched over to computer-generated forms, but she was able to special order them. Now, I'm told, I can only order them by the carton, which contains ten boxes. This would be a total of 13,200 labels! That seems to be a bit much, even for an obsessive-compulsive like myself, who has no plans to go out of business soon. I still have about an 8-month supply of labels on hand. After that, I can go back to putting my own carbons between individual sheets of gummed labels, or arrange to have someone make me some on a computer.

So, these items are joining a long list of other things which are no longer obtainable, such as pocket combs with good clips for fastening in shirt pockets, and a certain model of diaries with multi-year calendars on the end pages. "Where are the snows of yesterday?"

NOTE #1: The vote on limiting units in Heaven to moves only, with no power to Support, was unanimous among those voting. Five favorable votes were cast for that proposal. I was in favor of this, myself, but wanted the players to have a chance to express themselves. So, this rule will immediately be effective in this game. The next time the Rules are reprinted, I'll include this change.

NOTE #2: Doug Williams has now allowed it to be public knowledge that he is the brother of Bob Acheson, pubber of THE CANADIAN DIPLOMAT. Doug had started out in the hobby using his middle name as a surname because he didn't want to be affected by the reputation of his more famous sibling. DAMASCUS (UPI), February 13, 1908: Desertions from the Polish Middle East Expeditionary Force are reportedly becoming a virtual flood. Sources are reporting that as much as 30% of enlisted troops have left the army to hide in the cities or board tramp steamers, and some have even swum the Dardanelles. Morale is also reported to be very low with troopers, who are under the impression that Army generals are out of touch with reality, and spend most of their time debating philosophy with European leaders. A final factor in morale decline may be that rumors of the invasion of the Polish homeland have reached the soldiers. Army leaders have withheld this news from the soldiers for fear that many would want to join the guerilla fighting in Kiev.
