GAME FEES: \$9.00 Flat Fee for newcomers. \$8.00 for current readers. STANDBY FEES: \$5.00 for newcomers; \$4.00 for everyone else. Note that a Standby signs up for a specific game of his choice. Mensa Diplomacy SIG members receive an additional \$1.00 discount on these fees. For your money, you receive the rules/maps for your game(s), and BUSH for the duration of your game, providing you don't drop out. If you NMR twice in a row, you're out of the game and the zine stops coming, unless you decide to sub. Players and standbys don't have to worry about their subs expiring.

SUBSCRIPTIONS for non-players are 12 issues for \$6.00. OVERSEAS SUBS are \$8.00 for 12 issues, by sea mail. SAMPIE copies are 50¢. We also TRADE with many other zines on an all-for-all basis.

Standby players are also wanted, and people may also volunteer to serve as Guest GM's. A good way to get your feet wet as a GM.

However, it is a bit peculiar to go on pretending one is at school for nearly a year after leaving.

#### BASEBALL WARZ

#### NAVB NEWS

I had mentioned earlier that I was planning to establish a new category for the several "Anarchy" and "Chaos II" designs, since they appear to be distinctive enough to warrant such a category. These games all feature having anywhere from 11 to 34 players, each with one, two or three Home SC's, assigned at random. The two most common versions being played today are the 17 and 34-player versions.

I found ten games which fell into this new category. All were currently classified in the "rs" subcategory, Major Revisions with Short Rules, which is really just a catch-all category for things which don't fit in elsewhere. The new category is:

BREST to Paris & Rome: I'm getting a little tired of chasing you all over my posessions. Isn't it time you surrendered? You've allowed both England and Austria time to size me up.

ENGLAND to Austria: Because of Austrian aggression against my Turkish and French friends, I feel there is no other option open to me but to declare that there is a state of war between our countries. Besides, I want to see how I can do with my characteristics, against you and your characteristics.

TURKEY to Austria: They are as sick that surfeit with too much as they that starve with nothing!

ITALY to France: Die, you worthless scum. Or failing that, just don't win.

CM's Notes: The "two-ocean building rule" will be postponed to 1645. That appears to be the concensus here. This means that any Power can build in either ocean in or after 1645, if the game lasts that long. That would be after six conventional game "years." I plan to revise the rules for future games to permit such building in or after 1625, when the Russian option is played, but that won't affect this game. Note that 1600 will be the last year Powers are entitled to four off-Board SC's. This will drop to three off-board Centers in 1605. Gather ye rosebuds while ye may.

Note that Panama touches <u>five</u> adjacent spaces, including Central Pacific. A F entering Panama from any of these spaces may use the Portage on the following turn. (also, see Bottom of Page 7)

Tom McNally was the last person on the Vacation Dip Standby list. If anyone else would like to be a Standby here, you can have a slot for \$2.00. This includes the cost of sending you the Rules. If we've run out of standbys, this game is in real trouble. There are only three original players left: Bob Cheek, Paul Kermy and Brad Wilson. If things are not straightened out by the Fall 1915 turn, I am going to take the bit between the teeth and make a GM's proposal of a 3-way draw between England, Germany and Turkey.

ANKARA to Berlin: I have never been busier, and I still got my moves in. I can keep this up forever. ((It looks like the game could go on forever, too. - F.C.D.))

Brad Wilson also adds a political prediction that in the Presidential election, Bush will carry the popular vote by a 51% - 49% margin. However, he predicts that this will result in Bush winning the Electoral Vote by 403-135. ((If correct, this is another good argument for abolishing the Electoral College, and going to a straight popular vote election. Then, the candidates wouldn't be spending most of their time in a few key states like New York, Ohio, Texas and California, and would devote some attention to the rest of us in the smaller States. - FCD))

SPECIAL NOTICE FOR "CONQUEST" PLAYERS. This was originally going to be the "Mensa Variant Game #4." Four of the five starting players are members of the Mensa Diplomacy SIG and receive the bimonthly SIG newsletter, DIPLOMAG. The Regular Mensa #22 game in DIPLOMAG has just ended. Accordingly, in January 1989, "Conquest" will be moved into DIPLOMAG as a demonstration game. All of you, including Standbys, will automatically receive that newsltr. for the duration of the game, at no charge. In the in-between months, the game reports will be sent out by flyer, as was done with Mensa #22.
