MORE LISTS

You'll remember that last month I mentioned the 20th Century Leaders Poll being conducted at Disney World and Disney Land, to select the ten most important people in our century. I also gave you my choice for the Top Ten. Since then, I've discovered and read a book called The 100: The Most Influential Personsin History, by Michael Hart.* Hart lists the 100 people who, in his opinion, have affected our lives most significantly over the entire course of history. He gives thumbnail biographies for each of them, plus for the next ten people, who are on his Honorable Pention list. He also lists another 90 people who might be on his "second 100" list of names. "Catalog No. 920.2.

I was surprised to see him list Muhammed first, with Jesusphly third, following Isaac Newton. I was also surprised to see that neither Abraham Lincoln nor Leonardo di Vinci was on the "100" list, although both are given Honorable Mention. So, as is my wont to draw up lists, I made up my own list of those people whom I believe belong in the "Top 60." I stopped at 60, since there is a limit to even how much time I can waste spend on a project. Finally, I made up a 4-page article on the subject, including a direct comparison of Hart's "Top 50" with my "Top 60".

This is too big for BUSHWACKER, and I doubt whether D.W. would have been interested. However, I am already supposed to be writing a column in EXCELSIOR, the zine published by Bruce McIntyre, 6636 Dow Ave., #203, Burnaby, B.C., CANADA V5H 3C9. The first two pieces have already been printed, in what is called "Fred's Column" (what an exercise of imagination that title is!). XL suffered a lapse of publication in January and February, but Bruce assures me that the next issue is on the way, and he does plan to contine, so you'll be able to read my entire "Top 60" list sometime in April in XL. So, why not send Bruce about \$5.00 for the next five issues? (Hint, hint).

I've also finally gotten around to starting Will Durand's <u>The Story of Civilization</u>. I inherited the first nine volumes of this set two years and they've been sitting on my shelf glaring at me ever since, but my various Diplomacy activities kept me too busy to start reading it until now. I'm only in the middle of <u>Greece</u>, but already I can see several names of persons who ought to be on a list of the Most Influential 200 (or 300) people in history. I find myself more in agreement with Durand than with Michael Hart. ((You can have a copy of my 4-pg. report for \$1.00))

THE PARIS GUN REVISITED

In both the June 1990 BUSH and the October 1990 EXCELSIOR, I mentioned the famous Paris Gun of World War I, which had a range of 74 miles. PBS recently ren a program on Gerald Bull, the Canadian "Big Gun" genius, who was murdered in 1990. At the start of the program, they showed a film clip of the Paris gun actually being fired! Very interesting. Even a soundtrack had been added. The program went on to show some of Bull's creations, such as the Barbadoes Gun of 1966, and the 155 mm. self-propelled artillery piece. Bull's company sold 200 of these to Iraq, where they may have been used in the current unpleasantness. Quite a weapon, much superior to anything in the arsenal of any NATO armies. Check your PBS stations for a possible rerun.
