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### Diplo-Maunderings

THE ADDRESS CITED at the top of this page is our new address effective February 16th. Our old phone will be cut off on or about that date. Therefore, everyone is requested to submit his moves in writing this one time. Since we're going to be living about one mile beyond the edge of the Greater Baltimore Post Office area (ZIP area "212"), our incoming mail will take one extra day to get to us. It will spend a day resting in Baltimore before being forwarded to Ellicott City. This will not affect outgoing mail, as we will transport our copies of BUSHWACKER into the Baltimore area for mailing; and we always mail our letters at Social Security Hqs., which has its own private Baltimore ZIP Code. However, you'll have to tack an extra day onto whatever time your letters have been taking to get to us in the past.

CHANGE IN INTERNATIONAL MAILING REGULATIONS: The best kept secret of the year award goes to the United States Post Office, for not telling us that the new minimum size for all international mailings, including to Canada, is 3½" x 5½", effective the end of December 1973. This new size is the exact size of the standard "picture postcard," but the official U.S. Government postal card is only 3 and one-quarter inches high! Ergo, you can no longer save money by sending postal card communications to your Canadian players. I asked my Postmaster whether the Government would increase the size of our postal cards, but he didn't know. (Conrad, do you know?) Another increase in the cost of living! At least the postage rate increases have been postponed to March 2nd.

### ARE DIPLOMACY SETS "ON THE SHELF"?

While the local TOYS 'R US store in Baltimore is still selling Diplomacy sets at a reduced price, these are still ancient much-battered sets containing the 1971 mimeographed list of postal publishers. This list of names and addresses is completely out of date. (It doesn't include me!). If this is true of all TOYS 'R US stores coast-to-coast, it could account for a lack of response from new players. You would think that they'd at least have the 1972 printed list sets on sale by now. I've already reported the local situation to G.R.I., and volunteered my services (which the Govt. ridiculously insists are worth \$10./hr.) free, to insert new flyers in the Baltimore sets for them, but have received no reply to date. Check the sets in your local stores and see which flyers they contain. If it's earlier than the 1972 printed flyer, let John Moot at G.R.I. know about it.

While we're on the subject, how about a campaign to get Games Research to redesign the Diplomacy set so as to use a double-folding board like-most Avalon Hill games, instead of the current 1937-type of single-fold board? We noticed in the stores that the Dippy game box is one of the most awkwardly shaped on the shelf because of its obsolete construction. It also takes up too much space. This may be one reason why many stores don't carry it. I predict that a modern bookcase type of box design would increase sales considerably. It would also make it easier for itinerant players to lug their sets around. Have you ever tried to carry a Dippy set aboard an airliner?

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WE NOTICE THAT we're on a rating list at last now that 1969B has <u>finally</u> made the Brobdingnag Rating List. We haven't the foggiest how the ratings are computed, but we note that our sole Standard game postal victory gave us a rating of 75.0. CANADIAN ARMY ALL AT SEA. NAVAL GUNFIRE ROCKS THREE COASTS OF BRITAIN. C.S.A. RIDES THE MARRAKECH EXPRESS, BUT FINDS AN ITALIAN CAT ATE THE CANARIES.

The Canadian Build for December 1871 was F Halifax. The English unit in London is a Fleet. It was erroneously reported as an Army last time.

NO PRESS, SO I'LL USE THIS SPACE to tell players in both Atlantica games of my latest thought on this game. I've noticed that Canada has extreme difficulty in moving her fleets out of Montreal or Toronto to where they can be of use. In designing the game, I'd expected she would go down into the West Atlantic or up into Davis Strait to get out. However, the West Atlantic is a very busy space, despite my inclusion of Long Is. Sound and Chesapeake Bay to handle some of the traffic; and Davis Strait has the disadvantage of being frozen for 3 out of the 8 moves each year. This leaves Canada with just the Grand Banks for getting out. I offer two alternatives for future games:

- 1. Add a new long, thin space, called "Cabot Strait," between Gulf of St. Lawrence and Grand Banks on the north, Halifax on the West, West Atlantic on the South, and Mid-Atlantic on the east. Fleets in Gulf of St. Lawrence would then have a choice of splitting any one of 3 ways to reach the high seas. Or,
- 2. Eliminate April as a "Frozen Period" for <u>all</u> spaces subject to the freezing rule. I don't want to get into the bookkeeping hassel of having different freeze durations for different provinces. By giving Davis Strait 6 move periods per year, Canada and the other Powers are more likely to make use of it. This will also serve to liven up the area around the Barents Sea and the Karelian Canal.

My choice would be No. 2, both because it doesn't require a map change, and because I prefer it from the philosophical viewpoint. I would like to hear from all players in both games on this. It's too late to do anything in Atlantica I, of course, but since (more)

the Atlantica II game has only reached August 1870 (as of the next move), I would be glad to change the Frozen Space rule to eliminate April as a "Frozen" month for all spaces, if a majority of the players agreed. Therefore, Atlantica II players are requested to submit their vote on this suggestion with their next set of moves. Clarification: A "majority" will be defined as 4 affirmative votes if there are no negative votes, or 5 affirmative votes is there are any negative ones. Failure of a player to vote will not be counted as a negative vote.

In any event, I'd like to have anyone's opinion on this idea.

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### CORRECTION IN THE "1885" MAP AND RULES

We were embarrassed to discover that we'd forgotten that Norway and Sweden were united in a personal union (i.e. two nations, one monarch) from 1815 to 1905. Therefore, any accounting of Swedish strength in 1885 would have to include Norway. We've revised the map to include the Norwegian Supply Center within the Swedish Union. The Göteborg province and Army are eliminated, the province being merged with Malmo. Sweden now has F Norway, A Malmo, and F Stockholm. The narrow northern neck of Norway is merged with Lapland, so that only the Lapland province has a direct contact with Archangel. To compensate for the loss of a S.C., Iceland has now been made a S.C.

This will improve the game, in that Sweden will not immediately gain a 4th S.C. from which she can build. Under the original rules, Sweden would have been too powerful for her initial status. Everyone is requested to make the above corrections on their maps (sent to most of you with the January 1974 BUSHWACKER). Also, please correct the Swedish starting lineup in Rule 3, and eliminate the current subsection "3" of Rule 6. b. Renumber subsection "4. Portugal, if owned by Spain" as "3".

I also received a suggestion to merge the Spanish province of Cadiz with Northern Morocco, to make a "Denmark" type of province, allowing armies to cross the Straits without convoy. However, while it's true that Spanish influence in Morocco was strong in 1885, I think this would unbalance the game. Iwant it to be as difficult for Spain to take Morocco as it is for Italy to take Tunis, as the two are set up to somewhat balance each other.

We appreciate the comments we've received on "1885" from various people. If anyone out there would like to run a Test Game (reports by carbon copy; no press) I'd be happy to have you do it. Also, if you'd be interested in testing "1885" in an inperson game at the Chicago Diplocon this summer, please let me know.

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OZ FANS WILL BE PLEASED TO KNOW that one Michael Patrick Hearn has recently published a book called The annotated Wizard of Oz. It's supposed to contain everything you ever wanted to know about Oz (and perhaps some things you really didn't care about, such as the population of the Emerald City being exactly 57,318). The book is apparently available for \$15.00 through the "International Wizard of Oz Club," c/o Justin Schiller, Kinderhook, Ill. The newspaper article we read also said that club membership was \$2.50 per year, for which members receive three copies of "The Baum Bugle," and get invited to an annual picnic/convention in Castle Park, Mich., near Baum's old summer cottage. Which brings up an interesting question: Has anyone ever created a Diplomacy variant based upon the map of the Oz Continent? Baum's original map is on the inside cover of Hearn's book, but we recall that one Capn. Rodney C. Walker produced his own more scientifically accurate map about 1968.

# THE ENERGY CRISIS (An Editorial)

I have one consolation regarding this crisis. I can truthfully say, "I told you so." I've been a prophet without honor for more than 20 years, but no one wants to listen to a Casandra. I heard the Governor of Massachusetts say on the radio, "How come this crisis occurred so suddenly?" To anyone who wasn't hiding his dead in the sand, this crisis has been obvious since the end of World War II. The first ecology book, Our Plundered Planet, was printed in 1947. By that year, the future scarcity of oil, tin, copper, zinc, and other raw materials was an established fact to anyone who wanted to think. Pohl and Kornbluth wrote their classic SF novel, The Space Merchants, about 1953. They set their overpopulated, energy-starved world around 2100 A.D. Now, it's more likely to be the world of 1990.

25 years ago, I recognized the foolishmess of building an entire society around the automobile, wasting all those precious hydrocarbons on the internal combustion engine. I said then: "Someday, our descendants will think that we were mad for <u>burning</u> oil instead of saving if for lubrication." Now, the time has come to pay the piper. We are literally running out of everything at a pace that the Club of Rome and M.I.T. statisticians say will bring about the collapse of civilization by the year 2015 at the latest. (more)

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I remain an optimist. I believe Man will survive. Now that he has been forced to think about his eco-system in worldwide terms, he will start to come up with solutions. The work should have begun in 1945. Instead, we went on a 28-year binge, drunk on "unlimited" energy. Well, better late than never.

The world of tomorrow is undoubtedly going to be quite different from that of today. The private automobile may cease to exist. We certainly won't be eating so high on the hog. Real meat will be a rarity. There will be a lot more government regulation over who builds what where, who goes to school to learn what skill, and who works where. Hopefully, our devices will be built better so as to last longer, so we can have fewer people standing on production lines making useless widgets, and more people in school learning to become human beings. We may have a rebirth of cities where people interact with each other instead of living autistic atomic lives. If we all have to live together again (including riding busses and subways together), it is obvious that the Main Stream cannot permit the law of the Jungle to continue to rule our cities. When we could escape to suburbia in our private cars, we didn't care what happened in the City. Now it matters a hell of a lot to us! We may require an armed guard on every bus and streetcorner for us to survive, but I'd like to think that we're smart enough to come up with a better solution.

In the long run, it's far more important for us to recognize that "more people equals poverty," whether in terms of an individual family or any nation state. The long range goal is not just to invent more gimmicks to cheat Mother Nature and keep our jury-rigged engine running, but to work to cut the world's population at least in half. If Man doesn't voluntarily do so, I can assure you that the Vatican is absolutely correct when it says: "God will find a Way." That "Way" is spelled war, famine, pestilence, and death.
