However, due to the fact that the doubtful retreat is a simple one, and since all players have now had three weeks to negotiate, the deadline for moves for Fall 1902 is now set for Thursday, May 18, 1972. Box 255, Rockville Center, New York, 11571, it is essentially a Trading Post type publication, largely made up of notices of individuals, clubs, and groups, furnishing a good means of communication between those looking for opponents, wanting to trade games, and so forth and so on.
