PREFERENCE LISTS REVISITED

The following letter was received from Randolph Smyth in response to my explanation (in issue #12) of how I use preference lists. The method described is basically to keep the assignments within the narrowest possible range within the set of preference lists.

A comment on your method of resolving preference lists: I think it's lousy. Why use the lists at all if everyone gets choices 3-5? You might as well just assign the countries randomly, and on the average people would be just as satisfied.

As a player, I regard the use of a pref list by my GM as a convenient way to improve my chances of getting a desired country. The usual reason is that I've played the countries at the bottom of the list quite a few times, and those at the top hardly at all. Novices often put the "easy" (?) countries at the top of their lists, but if they get one of them, I see nothing wrong with this method of giving them a slight handicap. Anyhow, I never feel "cheated" if I only got my third (or fifth, or seventh) choice and somebody else got his top choice - not if the GM was doing his best to maximize everyone's preference.

Your method of making things "fair" is similar to King Solomon's answer to the two women disputing over a child: cut it apart and give them each a "ruined" half. He had something else in mind, but you don't: only making sure that, since everyone can't get maximum benefit from the lists, no one will.

The method is open to a kind of metagaming anyhow, that perverts the whole purpose of the lists. A fellow is likely to put his first three choices in positions 3-5, reckoning that every resolution is likely to result in the assignment of something mediocre. He'll get his preference (usually) while the rest of the players, confused by it all, must settle for less.

Despite the fact that a couple of Randolph's arguments are irrelevant or wrong (how does he know what I have in mind?), his basic view that my method makes mediocrity the norm is true. My method is lousy.

I apologize to the Desmodromes for the crummy assignments (everyone except Mike M. and Bob (who would have gotten the same assignments) should have gotten their first choice), and from now on the more usual (and better) way of assigning countries will be used.

You are also given a 2 pan balance (illustration). This balance will tell you which side is heavier than the other but the scale is unmarked.

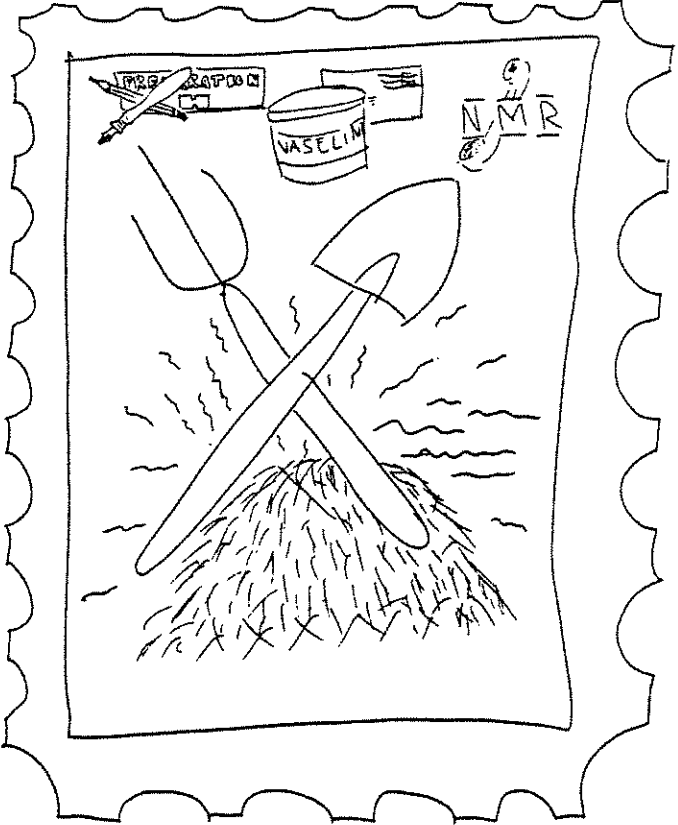
You may divide and weigh the coins against each other only, but the procedure is up to you.

Derive an algorithm guaranteed to find the coin of different weight and whether it is heavier or lighter than the others by using the balance a maximum of 3 times.

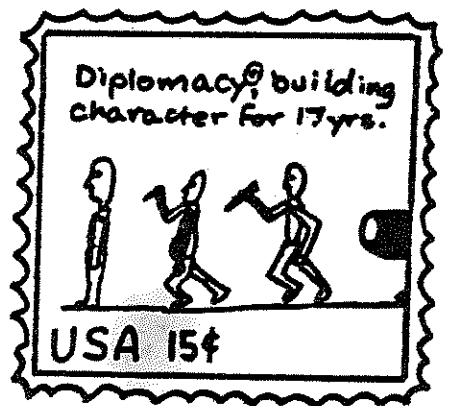
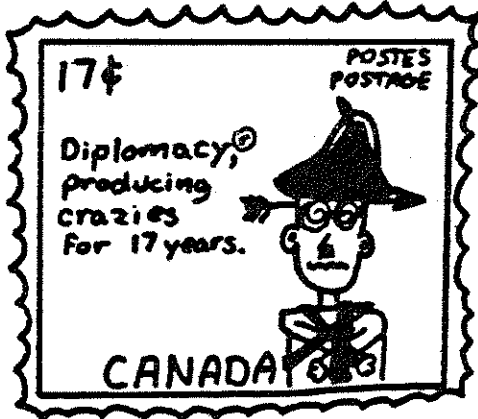
