PRESS SMYRNA SUN-TIMES: The capital was rocked today by the sudden changes of government of the week past, and the appearance of a troublesome Austrian pretender. The death of the old Czar, a fast, long-time friend of the Porte, was particularly disturbing. This, teamed with the sudden redeployment of Russian forces, may indicate a wholesale reappraisal of St. Petersburg's policy toward Turkey, and the Sultan's advisors put in a long night yesterday in defining a response. The added complication of Austrian forces with the newly crowned Emperor David in Albania has thrown the Porte into confusion. What policy will emerge is as yet unclear.

ALEPPO GLOBE AND MAIL: Grand Vizier Midhat Pasha denied reports of earlier this week that a reshuffling of the Vizierate was imminent as a result of the disturbing developments from the Albanian front. In spite of this, the return of war-chief Osman Pasha to the capital indicates some change in the offing.

BORNEO - BRAZZAVILLE: Rangoon says to send McLeod on to Rio. Await further instructions.

VOICE OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE: Kaiser Wilhelm II, Chairman-elect of the Central Committee of Mitteleuropa, calls this meeting to order. "Gentlemen," he begins. The other members look around the room, and ask "Who came in?" Seeing no gentlemen present, they realize the Chairman was speaking rhetorically, and fall silent. "We are besieged on all fronts by the forces of rationality and good taste. How are we to face such an honorable onslaught from well meaning sources? Yes, we must resist them through vile and offensive maneuvers and mannerisms, and hope that we make these goody-two-shoes namby pamby sissies go home in disgust and revulsion. We hate all Osmonds, other than Ken. We put a jinx on English mail service, and hope that our letter bombs create havoc in the sorting rooms. Finally, our armed forces defy rationality, and will make only unexpected movements.

BADEN-BADEN: Maid service is due to be discontinued next month if the rent isn't paid at the castle of former Emperor Franz-Joseph. The bill has been submitted to the Porte, with copies to the Albanian and Venetian foreign ministries.

HAGUE CALLER: CONFERENCE WRECKED After a series of bizarre events, the Hague Peace Conference broke up yesterday afternoon. When the conference opened Monday, the French delegate made a savage attack on Italy's foreign policy. Later that

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afternoon, he fell from a seventh floor window, apparently an accident. Three days later, it was discovered that the Turkish delegate was dead, and probably had been for about a week. Perhaps the most incredible event took place yesterday. Russian delegate Ivan Karp went berserk and attempted to bludgeon Italy's delegate the Duke of Aosta with a flagpole. The Duke's bodyguards fired 27 shots into Karp before he died. Reached for comment in Rome, Foreign Minister Visconti-Venosta said that Karp's attack was like Russia's "irrational invasion of Italian territory."

ROMAN TIMES: GOV'T CHANGE Giovanni Giolitti succeeded Giuseppe Zanardelli as Prime Minister this morning. Emerging from an audience with the Emperor, Giolitti announced that "there will be no change in Italian policy from the Zanardelli administration."

GENOA MIRROR: PORTE ANSWERED When asked why Turkey had not been invited to participate in a victory parade in Vienna, General Luigi Cadorna answered, "Because Turks are disgusting vermin. Besides, once a Turk moves in, he never leaves."

BANGKOK - BORNEO: Send McLeod; facilities are ready.

Thank you Mark Lew for taking over France.

Thank you Dave Rue for dying as Austria.
