Endgame statements from... Dick Martin (Russia)

*Boy, am I glad this game is over. It was interesting for a while, until Gary decided to bring his vendetta against me into the picture. We quickly sank into trench warfare, and the game was effectively over several game years before the draw passed. Boring, boring, boring. At least the end result was gratifying - a DIAS draw!*

*Thanks to Steve and John for a fine alliance. Thanks to Mike for keeping it as interesting as possible. Thanks to Gary for providing just the proper touch of absurdity. And special thanks to the Shell Answer Man for GMing a fine game and putting up with our childishness. Let's not do it again some time, OK?*

... and ... Gary Coughlan (Turkey)

*I inherited this position in Winter 1904 and with Turkey just losing Bulgaria to a combined Russian-Italian invasion and forced to remove one, it was one of the better positions that Andy has given me. (The one just before this was a unitless, SC-less Turkey which could only vote on an upcoming draw).*

*I made the mistake of believing Francois Cuerrier's Italy due to two special delivery letters from Canada. In those days, I was easily impressionable! At that point, I allied with the Russian Trevor Baillie, an alliance I continued when Dick Martin inherited the Russian position.*

*Italy was in danger of winning the game so it was agreed that England, France, Russia and Turkey would work together to stop the leader. From Fall 1905 (2 seasons after I had inherited the position) until Spring 1909 I fought totally against Italy which was the main menace I felt. Constantinople fell to the Italians and I only had 2 units. I supported the Russians into Constantinople in order to deny it to the Italians.*

1979-CG continued

During the four game years while I whole-heartedly fought Italy (really my only option since I only had two units), France, England and Russia were playing footsie with each other's centers rather than concentrating on stopping Italy. So when a new Italy, Mike Drews, took over he wrote me asking to change sides. I refused saying I could not do so without being exterminated by the Russians who were in Constantinople and Armenia.

But Mike wrote back and showed me a viable plan which would not only allow my survival but even to recover all of Turkey. In the meantime, Russia was asking me to convoy his Armenian army into Bulgaria. Allied with Martin's Russia, all the supply centers we had conquered jointly had gone to him and I was as weak as ever. And bored with being the only one fighting Italy totally. Since, by this time, Italy had been whittled down from his peak strength and my adhesion to his side would not immediately allow him to win the game and would give me another center for certain and the possibility of more - something the Russians couldn't deliver and hadn't delivered for 4 years - I switched sides and joined the Italians.

Turkey almost immediately regained Constantinople and by game's end cleared Turkey's homeland and neighboring seas of Russian units and no longer could any one power be in a position to unilaterally take Turkey out of the game as Russia had been for 4 game years. Italy got a loyal ally who guarded his eastern front while Turkey was finally able to go on the offensive and tie down half of Russia's forces. I know Andy must have choked when I had a CHEESECAKE position which had its complete homeland!

Mike Drews is an excellent diplomat and I enjoyed working with him. I also enjoyed the press wars with Steve Langley and with Dick Martin, except when Martin dragged in an outside feud he and I were having into the press of this game where it had no place. Martin also felt that I switched sides because of this feud which was not true. Frustration with no possibility of future growth for my Turkey and Mike Drews' first-rate diplomacy which promised growth won me over. It was iffy at first, sort of touch-and-go, but it then became clear that I had made the right decision. And had Italy collapsed in the west to the combined Anglo-French attacks, my Turkey would have been in prime position to acquire many centers - something not even remotely possible as a Russian ally.

And thanks to Andy for being a great GM. I enjoy every game the Water Rat puts me in, even when the positions are cruddy as they usually are. OK, Andy, I'm ready for another assignment. How about a 3 unit power this time?!

Nah. Next, John Stewart (England)

All in all the draw wasn't bad and hopefully whatever was between Dick and Gary is over and done with. As Dick feared, my original intention, when called on as a standby, was to attack Russia and see if I could beat Mike to a win. However, the former England gave one last gasp before NMRing out and that cost me the position and timing for a northern offensive.

After that I decided to work with Steve and see if we could push Mike back in the south. This for me was the highlight of the game. I really enjoyed planning and communicating with Steve. And even though we didn't succeed, it was fun trying.

Mike played well while Gary and I were too far apart to do much, but I did like Gary's press. Guess that is about it. So long everybody. At least until the next game.

Yes, that is about it for 1979-CG.
