That's almost 3¢/page! It is ditto, and it is readable. And he is a good GM. But he is THE upper most of the hobby's prices.

IMPASSABLE (68), John Boyer, 117 Garland Drive, Carlisle, PA 17013, subs are 10/\$2, no openings, contains "Open Letter To the Hobby," Hobby News, games, The General's General Meeting, by John M. Baker, Letters from... Tony Watson on articles, Lew Pulshiper on the IDA, and John Baker on the Hobby as a whole. 12 pp mimeo. The mimeo printing is good. ((You can all tell I ran out of CorFlu)) In fact, superb. This is definitely a great zine, and I recommend it to all. There may be openings in guest GMED games soon. Plus a new format (although the old one is easier for my files.

LIBERTERREAN (59), Jim Bumpas, 948 Lorraine Ave., Los Altos, CA 94022, subs are 10/\$3, openings in regular diplomacy guest GMED. Also openings in "Armored Barbarism", a very good TANK! variant. It is multi-played, with spies, Governments, etc... a very good deal. He could use 2 more players for that. There is a \$2 refundable deposit and a 25¢/turn gamefee.

QUENDI KHAZAD DUM, (12) Entwood, RR#1, Amesville, OH 45711, subs are 5/\$2.50, 11/\$5, openings in Ancient Conquest, Regular Dippy, Downfall..., Global War, Invasion: America, Lensman, Russian Civil War, Starlord, Starprobe, Stellar Conquest, Triplanetary, WWII ((Does he mean, er William, do you mean WAR IN EUROPE? I know someone who would be very interested in this...)), Space Centurions V, Strategy One. All games probably cost \$2, plus a \$1 refundable deposit, but I'm not sure. (It doesn't specifically say...). Contains: Games, Reports of the IDAEC, and announcements. 12pp mimeo. My comments: The Cost. It is 50¢/issue (apx.). That (I think) is too much. 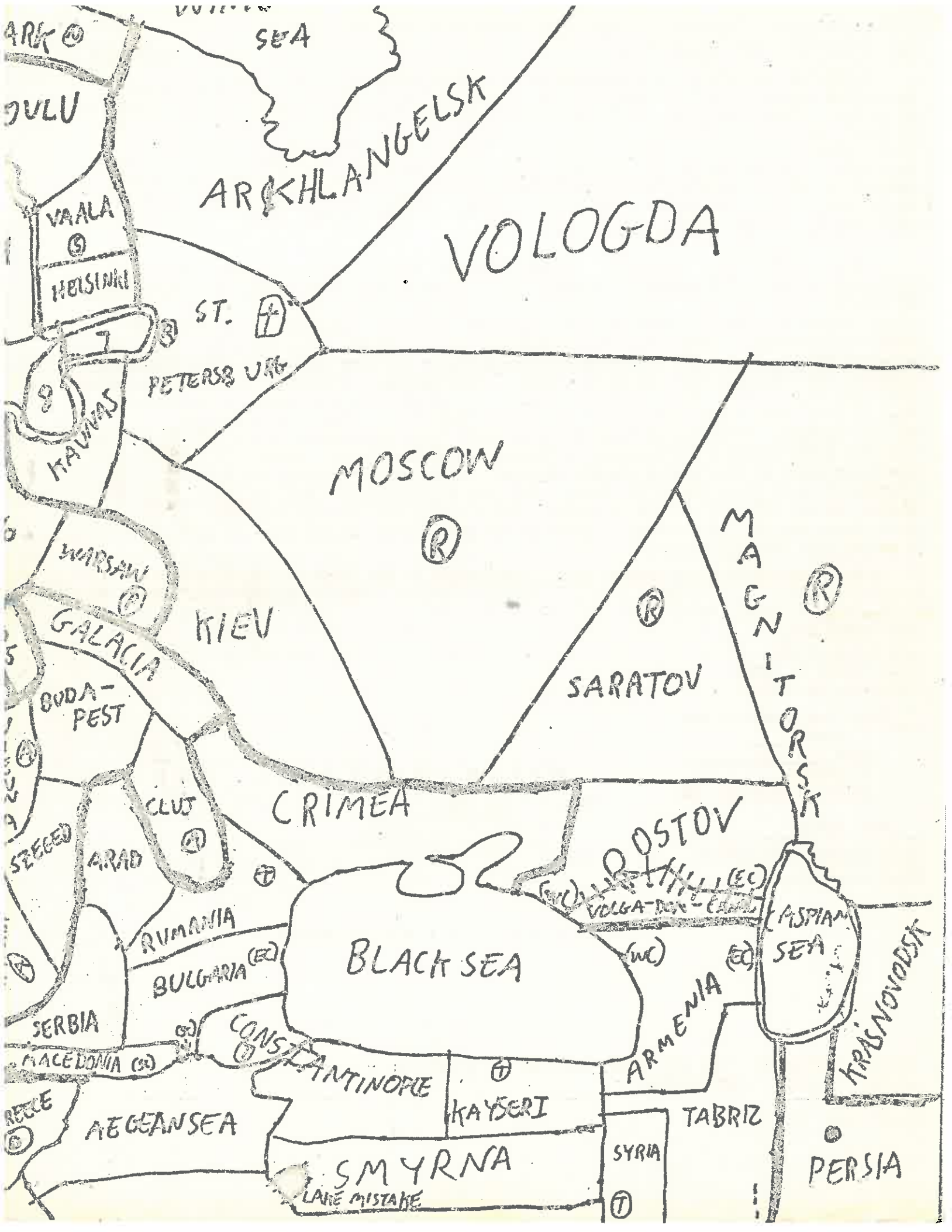
HOUSERULES FOR CENTURION (2nd) EDITION

These rules are to be considered as additions to the 1971 edition of the Diplomacy rulebook

2. X All countries (in CENTURION) are assigned at random!
3. You must receive CENTURION to be playing in a game, or else
4. There are five seasons to a game year: Spring moves, Summer retreats, Fall moves, Autumn retreats and the Winter builds/removals. Normally the Summer retreats are played with the Fall moves, and the Autumn retreats are played along with the Winter adjustments. If there are no Winter adjustments, the next season is Spring moves. If there are any Autumn retreats to be played, and there are no Winter adjustments, the Autumn retreat(s) will be held with the Spring moves.
5. Orders must be typed or printed. If they are unclear or not legible, they will be thrown out. Orders may be revised at any time. The set which has the latest date will be used. If they both have the same date, the set that arrives last will be used. If they arrive on the same day, we will pick the set that gets to be used. All orders must be signed and dated. We will not accept collect calls or telegzams. You may phone moves to the gamemaster, although he has the right of not being home.
6. A player may assign his position to a substitute for a period of one game year or less. The substitute can not sub unless the original player got the consent of the gamemaster. The gamemaster must give his consent or standby procedures of rule 7 will be used. After one game year, if no orders are received from the original player, we go to the standby procedures (of rule 7)
7. If a player misses a move, a standby will be assigned to his position. The standby will send in moves for the position to be used in case the regular player misses his moves again. If that should happen, the standby takes over as player of that country. All units hold if no moves are received
8. If a player misses a 1901 move, neutral moves will be obtained. These moves will never be offensive. Standby procedures of rule 7 are used also.
- 9.-11. These rules are for protection against missing a deadline. These are all voluntary, but STRONGLY RECCOMENDED!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!! (Hint, hint...)
9. General Orders: A player may submit these any time he wants to. A set of GOs must be on a separate sheet of paper, indicating country and game number, and must be signed. Each set, must, as a minimum, state allies, enemies, and policy objectives. Any set not meeting these specifications will be returned. In the event a player's regular orders fail to arrive, the GM will have a local player, not in the game, prepare a set of orders for that season, using the GOs as guidance. GOs thus used expire and are destroyed; they must be replaced if a player wishes to have a set on file. Keep them up to date, otherwise your orders may not be quite what you expected.
10. A Player at any time may send two or more copies of his moves.
11. A Player may enclose with his orders a stamped, self-addressed postcard, with the game number and season written on it (the GM will not do it for you). THE GM will initial and remail the postcard within 24 hours. If the player does not receive his postcard within a decent amount of time, he should send in another set of orders. This only works when you mail your orders in a reasonable set of time.
- 11½. If the player wishes, the GM will call a player collect if his moves have not been received (the GM will try twice (obviously more if the phone was busy)), and the player, of course, can refuse the charges and NMR, or he can call back within five minutes. (It's cheaper to call back!)
- 11½. At the GM's discretion, the GM may attempt to phone players collect if they have missed their moves. Players, of course, do not have to accept charges.
12. If a unit of one country is to do something with a unit of another country, you must have the name of the other country in its orders (e.g. ITALY: F ROM s french f lvo-trn).

13. All units dislodged (even when a player misses his moves) may retreat. If a player misses his moves when a unit was to retreat, that unit is gone. You must specify where you want to retreat to, or annihilation. If two players specify retreat orders to the same place, all units go OTB. If one of these units could retreat elsewhere, besides the stand-off place, it will not. Both units retreat OTB.
14. If required removals are not received by the deadline date, they will be removed in the following order: farthest of actual spaces from nearest home supply center, fleet before army, non supply-center before supply-center, randomly by the gamemaster.
15. No deception of the GM is permitted.
16. If a player drops out of a game without notice, appropriate action will take place.
17. If a unit is ordered to do a move that is not on the board, and which is illegal (e.g. F Hel-Hell, A-Mun Eats Munchos) it is considered as hold, and can be supported. However, a unit given an impossible, but otherwise legal order will not be eligible to receive support in holding (e.g. F StP(nc)-StP(sc), A Ruh-Rum).
18. The following notation is used: Underlined moves fail, all others succeed; a unit's position is in CAPITALS; A-Army; F-Fleet; "-" moves to (attacks); C-Convoys; S-Supports; "/" through S or C--Support or convoy cut; H-Holds, U-Unordered, must hold; "-" retreat to...; /a/-annihilated; CD-civil disorder; NSO-no such order; NSU-No such unit; NMR-No Moves Received; /cd/-convoy disrupted; /imp/-impossible; OTB-Off The Board (Annihilated); NBR-No Builds Received; /otm/-ordered to move.
19. All provinces are abbreviated by their first three letters except the following: Norway (Nwy), North Sea (Nth), Norweigen Sea (Nwg), North Atlantic Ocean (Nat), North Africa (Naf), Glf of Lyon (Lyo), Eastern Mediterranean (Eas), Western Mediterranean (Wes), Livonia (Lvn), Liverpool (Lvp). Players should use these as much as possible (always).
20. A Supply center list is published at the end of each Fall Season. It lists the supply centers of all great powers and indicates any adjustment that have to be made. In the list, the following notation is used: ser-a center already held; Ser or SER-a center gained that year (except in ANARCHY(di)), ~~ser~~-a center lost that year.
21. A Player wins ~~when~~ after he controls 18 supply centers after a fall turn. In addition, by unanimous consent of the players (on the board at that time), the game may be conceded to him. The players may agree to any result they wish as long as there is unanimous consent. A game will be declared a draw if no supply center has changed hands in three game years.
22. All GM rulings are final. Any new rule published in CENTURION will be considered part of these rules. Any questions on these rules will be gladly answered. Players should read these, all players will have been considered as having read these rules.
23. All Press (including BLACK PRESS (In most cases)) is allowed.
24. In all REGULAR games, only one player from the same state is allowed with two exceptions: CA & NY, in which one player may be from the Southern and Northern regions of each state.
25. Fall orders may be made conditional on Summer retreats. Winter builds can be made conditional on Autumn retreats. (If Winter and Spring are combined, Spring orders can be made conditional on Winter builds and Autumn retreats.) Orders may never be made conditional on what's happening in the season being played!
21. The following are considered as "NO" votes: a "NO" vote, or a player not voting. An "Abstain" is considered as forfeiting your right to vote, and is considered as a "YES" vote unless that player was to have been included in the settlement, ~~wherexix~~ then it would be considered as a "NO" vote.

Although there are printing problems this issue (it's not their fault), I think this magazine is overpriced. Please note that this means that it costs 33¢/issue. This is too much. 30¢ is enough.
