SO THAT'S WHAT HAPPENED.... After the fall...

AUSTRIA(Frank McIlvaine): It is my opinion that 75CJ can be used as a serious tool for the beginning player to study to improve his game. In the beginning of the game I was stabbed a few times by Russia and I fought against Turkey with Italys help. I moved and this caused Russia to stab me in Fall 1903 when I had apparently patched things up with him, Italy also receiving no mail from me stabbed me((note--I'd call it an "attack")). At this time it became apparent that there was a three way E-F-G alliance that threatened to win the game. I sent a "community letter" to all three of the other players in the east at this time and they all agreed that the only way to stop the western cartel was to band together. I also asked them to negotiate with one player on the other side..my player to negotiate with was Lee Kendter((England)). I took more or less tactical command of the alliance and although we could not get a stalemate line, mismoves and German blunders brought the game within one season of a seven way draw. My negotiations with England at this time were going slowly because of French veto of any plans for a switch in alliance. With the very close probability of a seven way draw the E-F members of the western alliance wanted me to change places with Germany in there alliance. The factors that led me to accept this offer was the following. A Simple change of centers between the Western Alliance would stop the seven-way-draw. The Eastern Alliance did not have a stalemate line and would(as soon as Germany got on the stick) eventually be defeated. On the other hand I was offered a sure three way draw(unless France and England chose to stab me). It became a question of trust and I felt that Lee was very trustworthy (a ture assumption as it turned out)/ When this was decided the switch of alliance occured and Fall 1906 moves assured us of eventual victory, it was only a matter of time. The alliance went smoothly and by Fall 1909 we had our voted three way draw. It was a very good balance of power game and one of those games that shows the direction that postal games have been taking recently.

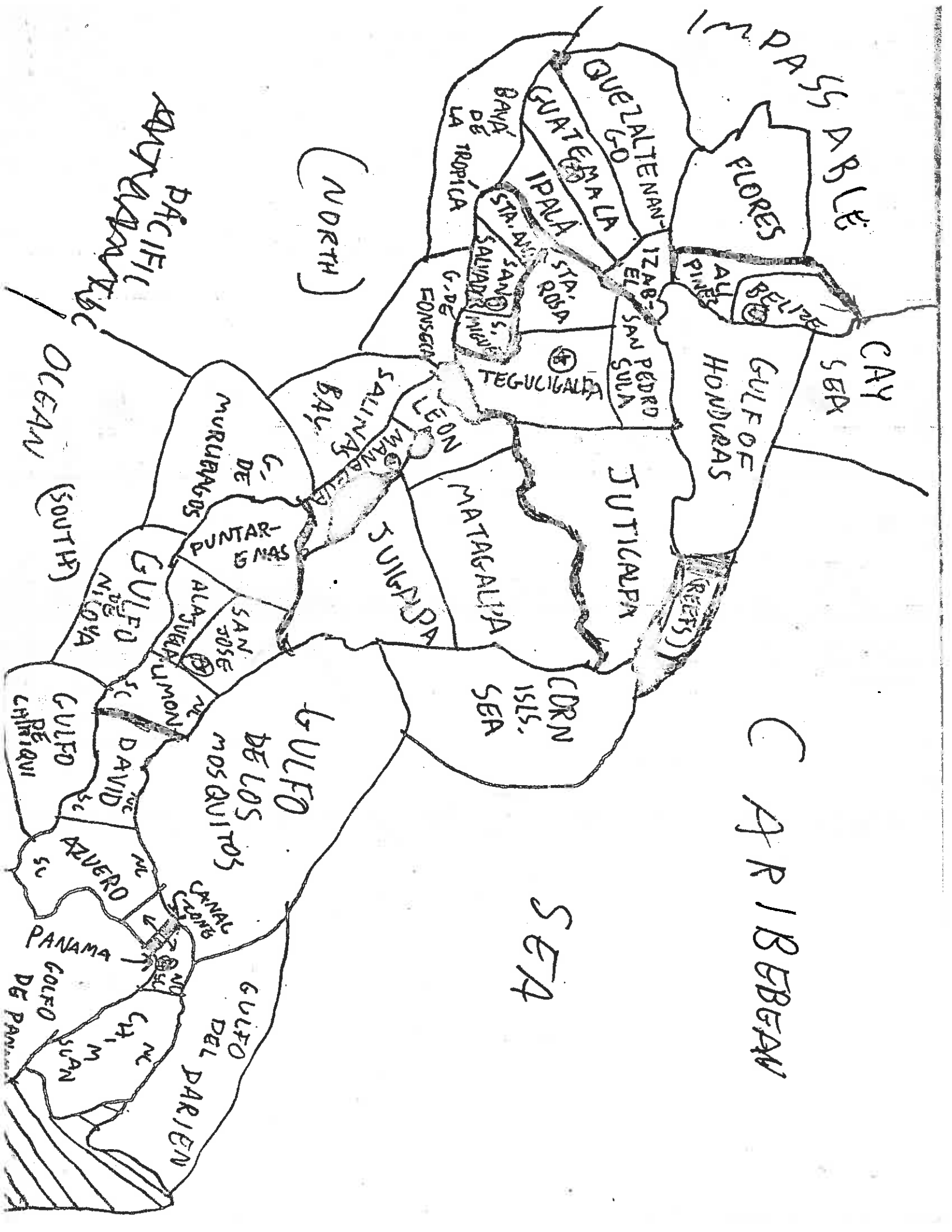

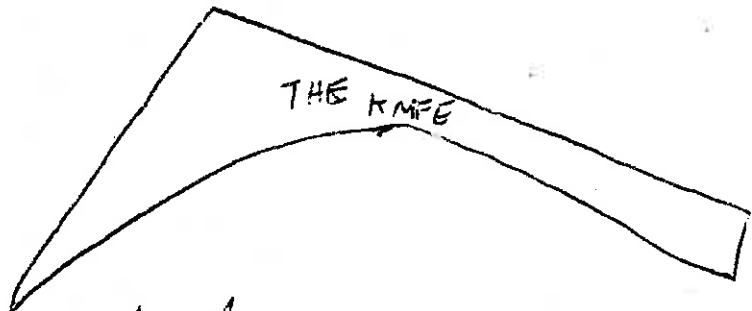
