What is this world coming to?

Yesterday, the 26th, I met Dave and Don Ditter. Anyway, I went to Burbank to the Last Grenadier(a very good store for the locals who get this, take note) and waited and waited. I immediately attempted to ally with both France and Germany. My pick was going to be Germany, but Germany was unwilling, hence my decision to attack him. So I moved to Nth, Edi, and Nwg. Russia had only F ~~Swe~~ Bot, and France had F Pic, A Mar, A Bur, and Italy had A Ven, A Pie, F Trn (France is in trouble). All of Dave's repulsion could not get rid of the Italian A Pie. But he was able to stop it from moving (Slow). Dave took Spa and Bel, while covering Mar with A Bur. I took Norway, and bounded the German (who had F Hol, A Kie, A Ruh). I built one, Dave built two, Germany built one. Now I remember the Italian. His name was Jim Foster.

STAB. I was hit. by France and Germany. France supported German F Hbl-Nth. I was open. Edi was open, but coverable. Also, there was a Russian A M StP.

He said he would do it. I didn't trust him, but I had nothing else to do, so I moved ~~xxx~~ Skag-Nth, supported by London. It worked, but the German in Nth moved to Norway with Russian support. Hmm...

I took Norway the next turn, but the ~~xxxx~~ French player whose name slips my mind at this moment took London.

We then declared the game a three-way draw, between Russia, Austria, and France. After one game of Nuclear war we left.

Idiots!

RULES TO CENTRAL AMERICAN DIPLOMACY

by Russell Fox

1. All rules are those of the 1917 and 1971 diplomacy rule book, except where noted.
 2. There are four types of units Government Armies, Government Fleets, Militia, Revolutionairy ~~A~~ Units, Revolutionairy Fleets.
 3. Government Armies are the same as Armies in the regular Diplomacy game. They are abbreviated GA.
 4. Government Fleets are the same as Fleets in the regular Diplomacy game. they are abbreviated GF
 5. Militia are only usable for support orders. Any attack upon a militia will dislodge it (militia equal $\frac{1}{2}$ an army). Militia can only be used in your own countries.
 6. Revolutionairy Units may move only in areas of that players home country. How arevolutionairy unit moves is detailed later.
 7. There are no revolutionairy Fleets.
 8. Each provñce, except those with the capital symbol, are worth $\frac{1}{2}$ of a supply center.
 9. Provinces with the Capital symbol are worth one supply center.
 10. You do not gaing supply centers per se, you annex~~e~~ them. ANNEXING is a seperate order. And it must be done in one turn. TO BE CONTINUED

1) The Youngstown Variant is a game for 10 players, representing the 7 great powers of regular Diplomacy, plus China, India, and Japan. This game was designed by Rod Walker, based on a game he picked up in Youngstown, Ohio (hence the name). The rules below are based on rules printed in the past by Burt Labelle, and Richard Hull. The rules of regular Diplomacy are followed, except as noted below.

2) There are 72 supply centers. Victory is by ownership of 37 units, or by concession.

3) in addition to the normal positions of pieces, players start with the following home supply centers and units:

AUSTRIA: A Cluj

India: A Del, A Cal, F Mad

CHINA: A Pek, A ~~Man~~ Han, F Can

ITALY: F Mog

ENGLAND: F Joh, F Lvp (Not Army)

JAPAN: F Tok, F Osa, F ~~X~~ Kyo

FRANCE: F Saigon

RUSSIA: A Omsk, F Vla

GERMANY: A Pos,

TURKEY: A Bag

4) There are obviously passable islands other than Britain, but no one ever cares about that rule.

5) It is possible to move units from the Eastern edge of the board to the Western edge of the board, and vice-versa or around Africa by use of the Off-Board Boxes. The ways in which they may be used vary with the version of the game. In all versions, the OBB's are spaces located around the edge of the board, and named after the province in which they are located. A unit in a province may on any move, move to the ~~OWN~~ OBB in its province. On subsequent moves, it may (1) move to any of the spaces listed in the box (In the 'bu' version the connections from OBB to OBB do not exist and should be ignored) (2) move back to its original space, (3) Hold, or (4) give support into any destination listed in its box. Fleets in ocean OBB's may form parts of convoy chains. Fleets are NOT allowed in Suda & Sahara OBB's. In the 'cv' version, OBB's may be entered from their destinations, as well as the space ~~xxx~~ in which they are located, and ~~xxx~~ units may be supported into these spaces from their destinations. In the 'bu' version units may only enter OBB's from the province in which they are located, and units cannot be dislodged from OBB's. In the 'db' version, the OBB's are not used at all.

6) Suez borders EMed, Red, and Egy but not Jor. Egy does border Jor, but fleets may not cross coasts (Egy(nc) does not border Jor(sc)). Armies may move from Egy to Suez, or be convoyed into Suez through EMed or Red. Fleets in Sue may Convoy.

7) I have used four letter abbreviations on the map, because three letter ones don't seem to be very distinctive. I believe that they can be decoded. The provinces that were not in the original Diplomacy that I have abbreviated on the map are: Posen, Saxony, Montenegro, Morocco, Viet Nam, Hirosaki, Tokyo, Osaka, and Honshu. VIET NAM IS a supply center.

8) fleets may not enter the arctic, but fleets may enter Omsk (or be built there) which borders Siberia and St. Petersburg(nc).

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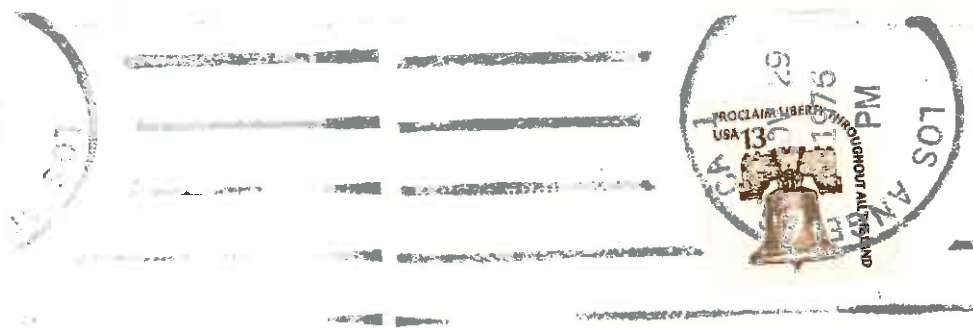
