THE DIPLOMAT'S OTHER TABLE

IT MATTERS HOW THIN YOU SLICE IT

One of the many charms of the cooking hobby is the search for the proper tools for preparation. This can lead to faraway places and delightful hours spent in quaint shops filled with shiny cutlery, dark woods, and intricately designed gadgets.

An example is our search for an implement that would slice zucchini "paper thin". We were attracted to a salad that was the hit of the potluck circuit-- zucchini that tasted as crisp as cucumbers, but truly burpless. The recipe, while excellent, depended on slicing 5 or 6 small raw zucchini "paper thin".

When San Francisco provided no miracle slicer, Carmel was a natural choice. We found the perfect device either at Collector's Kitchen or the elegant hardware store on Ocean Ave., meanwhile investigating all the other fascinating kitchen items.

It is shaped like a miniature old-fashioned washboard, wooden, without corrugations. In the center are two steel strips that remind me of a miniature guillotine. Slicing zucchini provided an exhilarating experience keeping one's fingers out of the path, but the zucchini, alas, was not "paper thin". We hung the \$2.95 slicer from West Germany on the family room wall (quite a conversation piece) and bought a \$2.00 slicer, manufactured in Cincinnati, from Macy's. Voila! Paper thin zucchini.

Blessings on Martha Perry for furnishing such a useful recipe and good excuse for expeditions:

SWEET AND SOUR ZUCCHINI

Soak 2 Tbsp dehydrated onions in
1/3 C wine vinegar

Chop 1/2 C green pepper
1/2 C celery

Slice paper thin -- 5 or 6 small raw zucchini

Mix 3/4 C sugar (It's ok to substitute your sugar substitute, making the necessary adjustment; for example, our sugar substitute is 1 1/2 teaspoons.)

1 tsp salt
1/2 tsp pepper
1/3 C salad oil
2/3 C cider vinegar

Add all the vegetables to this marinade and place 4-6 hours or overnight in the refrigerator.

WHAT'S DIPLOMACY COMING TO?

Before you read this article, I'd like you to figure out a puzzle. The situation is this:

1. You are the Russian player and your southern campaign is stagnated.
2. The Germans and English have been working together up to this point but the English player just resigned and there will be a standby taking over.
3. Both the Germans and English are making slow progress in France
4. The upcoming season is Spring 1903 and units are set up as follows:

<u>Russia</u>	<u>England</u>	<u>Germany</u>
A St. Petersburg	F Norway	F Kiel
F Gult of Bothnia	A Finland	F Sweden

OK, now that you know the situation, make a choice from one of the seven below. Be truthful with yourself and before going to the next part be sure you know what your diplomatic course of action will be

- #1 Approach Germany for an alliance against England while at the same time promising support and help to England, even though you plan to attack him.
- #2 Approach Germany for an alliance against England, but don't send a letter to England, or if you do, don't say something you couldn't keep.
- #3 Approach England for an alliance against Germany while at the same time promising support and help to Germany, even though you plan to attack him.
- #4 Approach England for an alliance against Germany, but don't send a letter to Germany, or if you do, don't say something you couldn't keep.
- #5 Send both countries non-committal letters making sure you don't promise or say something you couldn't keep.
- #6 Send both countries letters trying to get one to be your ally. Don't hesitate to promise or propose things to them both, even if you don't plan to keep your promises.
- #7 Become sick because you think the world is against you and decide you won't waste 10¢ on a letter.

Now, after you have chosen your diplomatic course, mentally plan some moves for your units on the basis that what you were working for came true. i.e. if you chose #1 Germany is allied with you. If you chose #5 or #6 then write moves on the basis that you received the alliance you wanted the most. Now that you are done with that read on and find out which category I would fit you into.

If you chose #1 and your moves were for the downfall of England then you are probably a "diplomat".

If you chose #2 there is a good chance you are a "pure of heart".

If you chose #3 and your moves were for the downfall of Germany then you are probably a "diplomat".

If you chose #4 there is a good chance you are a "pure of heart".

If you chose #5 and your moves didn't attack the ally you picked there is a VERY good chance you are a "pure of heart".

If you chose #6 and your moves didn't attack the ally you picked there is a VERY good chance you are a "winner".

If you chose #7 you are probably suffering from paranoid delusion and you better get to a doctor.

Now, read the rest of the article. Remember this though, this is a crude example and there is room for error. But this does give you a general picture of where you stand.

When I started out in Diplomacy I was one of your "kick the stuffing out of your neighbor" type of players. Needless to say, my first PBM game didn't go too well. The players automatically stuck me in a stab group where I really didn't belong. Because of this experience I was prompted to categorize players I met.

The first category I call the "pure of hearts". These guys (or gals) wouldn't break an alliance or make a promise they couldn't keep.

The second category I call the "diplomats". This group won't hesitate to tell an untruth or break an alliance if they will get any kind of benefit out of it.

The third category is a mixture of the first two. This category will tell an untruth when it will actually benefit them. They also will break an alliance when, in the long run, they will come out ahead, but they won't stab for 1 or 2 cheap centers. Under this category you can stick almost anyone that does well in the hobby. So, I call this group the "winners".

From what I have seen, the hobby is saturated with these "pure of heart" type players. They won't break an alliance if they said, wrote, or even implied they wouldn't, even if the person they are allied with is running away with the game. Sometimes one of them will break down and tell an untruth and they can't live with themselves until they make it up to the person. The first page of the rule book clearly states that you are to spread rumors, make and break alliances, etc. What these "pure of heart" types are doing is making a variant.

On the other hand, if you got into a game with a bunch of "diplomats" you'd see, and be part of, a much more fun game. It would be up and down, cut-throat, exciting--the kind of game that has brought people to the hobby so far. A stab every once in awhile would keep the players on their toes and the game would never get bogged down or boring. Unfortunately, we see fewer and fewer of these type of games. With the sudden surge of the "pure of heart" types the "diplomats" are becoming extinct past 1903. The "diplomat" type of players will have to cut down on their untruths and stabs if they want to stay alive in the hobby. If they don't, the "pure of heart" type will rub them out because in their minds this type doesn't belong in the hobby.

The third category, the "winners", are just that. They've adjusted to the new players. They won't hesitate to pull the knife if it will truly benefit them. They also aren't afraid of telling untruths, but they keep them down to a minimum so they don't get a bad name among the "pure of hearts".

Don't get me wrong, I dislike players who stab for no good reason just as much as anyone else. I'm just trying to make some players realize that they don't have to stay allied just because they said they would. It really has disheartened me to see the immense number of "pure of heart" types entering the hobby. I'd like to see a few more down to earth Dippy nuts.

We have had a request that player's holdings be kept secret, and mailed individually to the players. This cannot be done, as it would greatly increase our workload, and remove some of the interest from the market summary. It should be noted that (as mentioned in rule #14) players in the diplomacy game, who are also players in the Bourse, may do things for reasons other than the usual diplomatic or military. Not only may a player try to grab an extra SC solely for the purpose of temporarily increasing the value of his currency - he may also base his moves upon noting that a supposed ally is dumping all of his currency, possibly in preparation for a stab.

We cannot accept an order that says to consider all outstanding bids and offers as being for the GM currency at the time of GM trading. Not only does this impose a difficulty in processing (forcing us to dig through the entire market file looking for one player's bids and offers) but it negates the purpose behind the GM trading. Admittedly, the volume is low, but the effects are interesting, as the "dumb" GM tends to buy at higher than the market average and sell below the average. The effects will become even more interesting when the value

of a currency plummets, and the GM is the only one still buying.

To players of the Bourse who are also playing in PROXIMA CENTAURI and/or 1975AA: Please do NOT put orders for the Bourse on the same sheet of paper as these others. We maintain three completely separate files on these games, which involve a good number of players. We would rather not make a practice of inserting notes in one file referring us to another.
