Greetings from the low-rent district of the hobby. First of all, I'd better take care of business, so here are my votes for Sea of Despair [restricted -- TJS]. I am amazed I survived this long, and if I were to be cast overboard next turn, it would not surprise me in the least.

I hope the Diplowinn game is going to be with full press privileges. I am curious about what sort of press Sacks would write, or whether he is too busy being a hobby rebel bigwig to write humorous abuse. Do you have another copy of the rules, though? I went through another of what I call "housecleaning with extreme prejudice" with the result that I can't find Comrades In Arms #21.

A real, live Social Darwinist? I thought they died out years ago. Sad awakening on my part. Actually, it shouldn't surprise me anymore. After all, I've been on the mailing list for Robert Sacks' favorite libertarian bookstore for about a year and a half now (haven't bought anything yet, but then again I don't have that much for books and that I need to spend on textbooks -- besides, do they believe in checks?), and I see some pretty odd things in their catalogs. I also have a few readers like David Hood who are so enthusiastic about Capitalism that they are willing to march down to Central America and kill everybody who won't accept it for, to be more accurate, send the sons of the lower-to-middle classes to do the dirty work for them and get killed and maimed so United Fruit can continue to show growing profits). I've been asked to read everything from Ayn Rand to Chick Publications over the last two years.

I remember that a couple of years ago, when I was just starting publishing, I had a running argument with Sacks on this very drug question. In a letter I posed the question of the individual who knowingly sold a deadly drug. His response was that this person had a perfect right to do that as long as everybody concerned is aware it is a dangerous substance. He asked me if I could see the abuse of drugs as "evolution in action". I don't think I can, considering what is actually involved in the abuse of drugs, legal and otherwise.

First of all, I would resist simply lumping the users of substances together as "idiots" who deserve what they get. Was John Lennon an idiot? Was Edgar Allen Poe? How about Hector Berlitz? In my college theatre days, I knew fellow actors who would begin to speculate on the nature of Jesus while under the influence of marijuana; their thought processes were quite lucid, even if they sometimes tended to make connections which they would not make when "sober". I have had people tell me the first time they really understood what their life was about was then they were on an LSD trip. And so on. But then I look at my father and his father, whose lives were shattered by addiction to alcohol, and I look at what the consequences of his "weakness" did to me as I was growing up, and I think of myself and the (prescribed) pills I couldn't sleep without for almost a year. A drug doesn't have to be illegal to be dangerous.

Look at the way tobacco and alcohol are promoted. Big athletic events are sponsored by cigarette companies and breweries. There are full-page glossy ads in all the best and most popular magazines obliquely describing how wonderful the product is. The drugs are linked to success, to popularity, to sex, to maturity. Can you imagine the ad campaign that could be designed by a legal cocaine company? I can, and it wouldn't be merely the competition between "name brands" that would be behind it. It wouldn't take much to imagine heroin vending machines in local bars. All of this would make the drugs cheaper, and more and more accessible. And even if the drugs were "pure" and "safer", they would still be just as addictive, if not more so. The perfect product for the consumer age! The ultimate in instant gratification!

Do we really want this?

As I'm writing this, CBS election returns are playing on my stereo. Very depressing, obviously, for me. But the Presidency isn't everything, and it looks like Bush won't get a mandate in Congress. That will at least serve to moderate events. I'm sure that must disappoint some people, but I am a great believer in equilibrium in politics, and think that the best

approach is reasonable and balanced. This is difficult to convey in a hobby like this, which is full of professed Socail Darwinists.

Frankly, I find the idea that social problems will fade away when the unfortunate die off to be ludicrous. Even if it works that way in the animal kingdom (which I'm not sure is true in the case of individual creatures), you can't really "improve the breed" by selection. Human beings may be animals biologically, but they are not cattle and they are not predators (Francois Currier used a predator-prey analogy to defend himself once, and I've never thought as well of him since). Sentience changes everything.

[Central America is a topic I don't wish to get into because I'm not too well informed as to what has been going on. But I honestly don't believe that US troops don't get sent in just for the mere pursuit of Capitalism. Perhaps Jack could shed some light on your comment?

[Isn't grain alcohol available on the market, yet deadly if ingested? Should we also ban the sales of kitchen knives because they can be used as murder weapons? I know that some items have more potential for misuse, so they have some restrictions placed upon them, but nobody is preventing the sale of that item.

[If you want to come up with insights into human nature, be it religious characters or a search for the meaning of life, meditation works well and doesn't involve any drugs.

[There was a period of time in my life where I experienced sleeping problems. I had bought some sleeping pills and took some. For about a week, they worked, but started losing their strength. I started taking double doses and found they weren't affecting me any further. I stopped taking them because I didn't want to continue increasing dosages and wasn't sure of any side effects. My Father has a valium prescription and some other prescription for his heart condition. If there was a choice between being more sober and ruining your heart, and taking the pills, I'd go with the pills. However, it would make sense to monitor new developments for cures rather than delaying the final results.

[If harder drugs were advertised, I'm sure that they would fall under similar regulation as cigarette and liquor commercials. The problem of atheletic figures using drugs and their influence upon youth is a trickier problem. If the drug is illegal (as they are now), they should serve the same jail sentences as any other US citizen. No appeal or plead bargaining should be allowed because the rich can keep issues in court until they die or some beaurocratic glitch is found which will dismiss the entire charge, rather than reduce it.

[Do we want instant gratification? Doesn't everybody? That's why kids get into the drug scene -- money. If you understand that it is difficult to say "NO" when working as a watchout can earn you at least \$500 a week, then you know that finding other motivations is necessary to keep kids off drugs. Somebody finally had the brains to produce some commercial which use this angle, rather than the "If you get caught, it will be death eternal" approach.

[I don't believe in a "healthy balance" in politics, but I do believe in fierce competition between parties. Although they appear to be the same, there is still the fact that both parties have to be on their toes to serve their constituency better than the other party. The balance is not for the sake of having a balance.

[I do believe that the world does have a lot of cattle who are herded by the media or other sources of influence, rather than making up their own minds. And man is the fiercest predator; how many creatures are now extinct because of man?]

JAMES NELSON (Excerpts)

Many thanks for Comrades In Arms #22, and the offer of a trade. I've sent this letter airmail, whilst I have the latest issue of Variant And Uncles printed paper rate. The next issue will be out around the turn of December. I have just the articles to print out and the letter column to do.

I liked Comrades In Arms. That's about as simple as it gets. It certainly has more interest than the other US zines I get -- Bushwaker, which is interesting in itself, and Rebel, which although good to play games in has little else, apart from its subxyn, of interest. However, Comrades In Arms has a few other bits of interest.

Firstly, the spelling of what I would call "zine". I've seen it spelt "zeen" before, but "xyn". I don't know, Americans have some funny habits, especially zine editors.

I found the comments by Robert Sacks, and more especially Mikel Petty rather irresponsible,

and in places so happy-go-lucky it was unbelievable. America has the worst drug problem of the western world, and it is not just a simple cut-and-dry matter of having genetic drug genes as Mikel Petty suggested. If there are people around prepared to take drugs it will be because it is trendy. Whether their parents take or have taken drugs is highly irrelevant. Most teenagers do what THEY want to do, and take little notice of what their elders tell them.

Take smoking. Firstly, let's get a few facts right. Tobacco is a drug, and has been scientifically tested, with the results showing that it is very addictive, and has withdrawal symptoms. In fact, the only real difference between tobacco and say heroin is that the latter kills you more quickly. However in many people's views, smoking is a worse social crime due to the effect of passive smoking.

But back to the original point. My mother smokes, but my father does not. Does this mean that I'll not smoke, taking fathers example, or that I'll smoke due to the influence of mother? No, I tried smoking totally on my own decision and gave it up as a bad idea. I didn't try it because of parental views imposed on me, and it certainly hasn't a thing to do with my "genes" as otherwise I'd still smoke or would never have tried.

Most of the people I know who smoke started because it was what the crowd did. It's very much the same with drugs. That 'crowd' will contain people from all walks of life. OK, so they'll be more from the less able end of society, but, there will be others from the opposite side of society.

The drugs problem is one of the society we live in. The society has made the problem, and there is no easy way out of it. But what is 'morally' wrong is just to say "What the heck, let's legalize and the junkies will kill themselves." Yes that will happen, but it will also make drugs more available, and SOCIALLY ACCEPTABLE, and young people will have less restraints to helping them making that decision to say "No".

One of the problems in social acceptability in America is particularly that of sport stars using drugs. I don't know how wide the problem is in American sports, but being a keen follower of American Football, I am well aware of the problems this year. American teenagers grow up looking up to idols such as Dexter Manley and Lawrence Taylor, then find that they have been taking recreational drugs. Is this setting a good example to kids? It's not, and they're not being punished by the NFL enough.

I'll leave that as that. I felt like writing a lot more there. Drugs is an issue I feel strongly about. In fact, I could probably have written another page or two just on the NFL and how they should punish drug offenders -- both the leisure and steroid takers in the NFL.

As a matter of interest, how interested are you in Football, or do you prefer Baseball? I've been interested in Football for about three years now, and pride myself in knowing the rules by now! Seattle Seahawks are my team ("Go Hawks!" can be heard on a Sunday). Afraid I can't say the same for Baseball. I've watched a few games and thought the rules were daft and not my idea of a good game. With Football, not only do you get great athletes pushing themselves to their limits (with the negative side effect of having your Eric Dickinson's and Bo Jackson's of the world who think they're the greatest football players to have ever graced the field), but you also get the more subtle tactical approaches to the game (and then you have coaches like Tom Landry who have lost FOUR (if memory serves me right) games this season in the final minutes due to poor play calling!).

A nice idea (Gunboat Final Conflict), and one I approve of. In the UK hobby people tend to be too conservative, and stick to playing one variant at a time. However, with the mass of simple variants which could be combined together to create a 'great' variant, I'm surprised people haven't. You have, abeitly only with Gunboat and a standard game, but you are still to be commended. Well done!

[Thanks for the many kind words about Comrades In Arms. I try hard. As for "xyn", that was an invention of mine back in the days when Mike Barno and myself published The Shogun's Sword. The whole idea behind "xyn" is that it is a shorter word (three letters) than "zine" (four letters) and that we could ultimately save money by using smaller words. The "x" has the "z" sound, as in the word "xerox". I'm glad it has confused so many people.

[Clarification of "Darwinism": Nothing is a 100% certainty. What we are dealing with are probabilities. There are social, environmental and biological influences upon people, and both have their effects upon human behavior. Part of the reason you started or stopped smoking is because of your social upbringing, the neighborhoods you are exposed to and your own bodily

makeup. Perhaps a certain genetic factor makes a person find particular tastes or odors pleasant or unpleasant? I don't think that genetics mandate your entire life, but they add or subtract to your percentages -- think of life as a game of Runequest if you may...

[For example, I used to be very overweight, and now I am just plain overweight, continuing my way down to better health. Cholesterol is a hereditary factor in my family. Several of my relatives have died because of heart conditions. My past lessens the chances of me having a healthy heart in my old age. But because I actively monitor the amounts of fast food and try to eat well, and get exercise, I am combating my legacy.

[You say by implication that the rich tend to have fewer problems, such as drug problems. I'm not sure if that is true. If a sociologist were doing a study of class and drug correlation, they could contact more poor people (on welfare) than rich people (who are too busy increasing their wealth, pursuing their hobbies or who can afford servants to screen away reporters). Most of the sources available in libraries are about the poor to middle classes. Very little is really known about the rich. On a personal level, it's their own right to live without being pestered. I hate being pestered myself. That's why I sometimes screen my phone calls with my answering machine.

[It would be helpful if the NFL took a more active role in the drug problem. They don't have to because they are a business and their first priority is the life of their concern. Members of the NFL would feel that they would also help their own families and loved ones by using company funds to sponsor an alternative to the drug scene.

[I usually don't watch too much sports on TV because I find other things to do. I do enjoy swimming, some weightlifting and racket sports. If I do watch a sport on TV, I like watching occasional football, ice hockey or tennis games. I don't have a "favorite" team that I lose sleep over, but I am partial to the NY Giants.

[Thank Nick Dowling for Gunboat Final Conflict. There is one variant that takes a bunch of variants and puts them together. It is called Deviant Diplomacy. Each turn, the players propose new rules and vote on whether they are used or not. The problem in running the game is that many of the rules have unforeseen complications.]

ROGER COX

[Can people separate the hobby from real life problems? I hope so. There have been many feuds going on in the hobby, and participants get so involved in it that they lose their vision as to why they are in the hobby. Discussion need not be argument, and I view any of my rebuttals to my readers as discussion. I have been and will continue to be wrong, like any other human being. It would be nice if others would be willing to admit that they are wrong, drop their axes and get on with life.]

Domination of the various political factions of Ireland would then take place with British support. If this rumor Proves true, The very fabric of Irish politics could be ripped assunder!

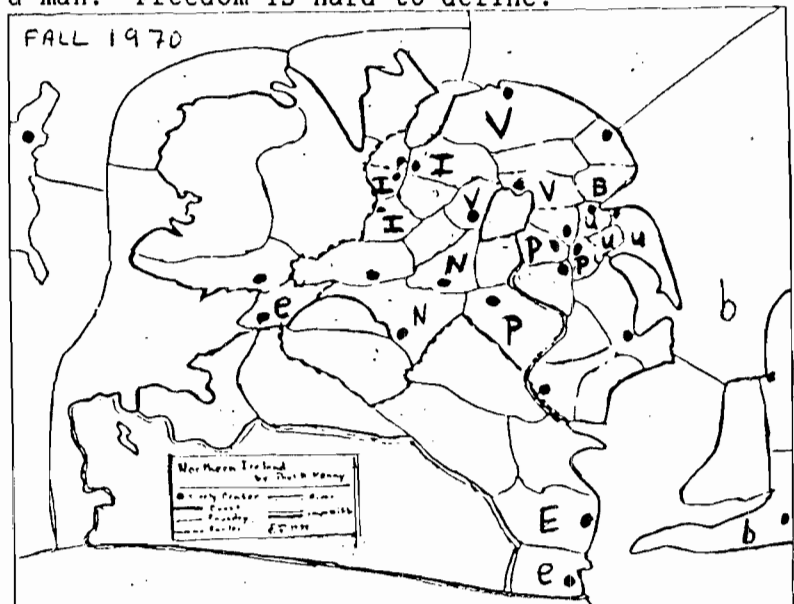
I hope everyone out there has a good holiday season no matter what their circumstance. One of the good things of Christmas is that one is allowed to feel good about it even though your life isn't where you want it. I heard on National Public Radio that America is the home of three million homeless. Then the program went on to talk about a family that went from Alabama to Virginia to get a better job. Both the husband and wife were able to find work, but the housing was so expensive that they couldn't find one they could afford. Housing is expensive, even around here. The average house around here goes for \$140,000. What first time buyer can afford that? A builder doesn't want to build cheap housing because there is a lot more profit on a bigger house. There is market pressure to make the bigger houses since there is also no shortage of buyers for the \$200K units. Here in New Jersey, there is the Mount Laurel II court ruling saying all townships have to have a low income area. Most townships now are in court fighting this decision. So there are even people who can earn money, but can't make enough for a home. And it was interesting to hear on NPR about such a family. The city had converted a gym for emergency city shelter, and here is a family of four among many who were living in little curtain cubicals. Some of you may already know that many people packed into a building can have its social problems. The NPR program was addressing those problems, and finally on the subject of Christmas and what it would be like in there, the husband said, "We may not have a tree or a big dinner, but we'll make (Christmas) good."

One of the classes that I took this semester was called Intellectual Heritage. It had an interesting course theme: The Meaning of Freedom. As the professors were quick to point out, freedom is not being able to do what ever one wanted. Later, that was illustrated when they showed Alex in Clockwork Orange. In the book Catch-22, the main character, Yosarian, is shown as free when he realizes that his surroundings are really absurd, while the other men in his unit accepted the crazy events as normal. In Hurson's book, Their Eyes Were Watching God, showed the heroin, Janie, looking for her freedom in the lifestyle she wanted to live, ie when she had her ideal relationship with a man. Freedom is hard to define.

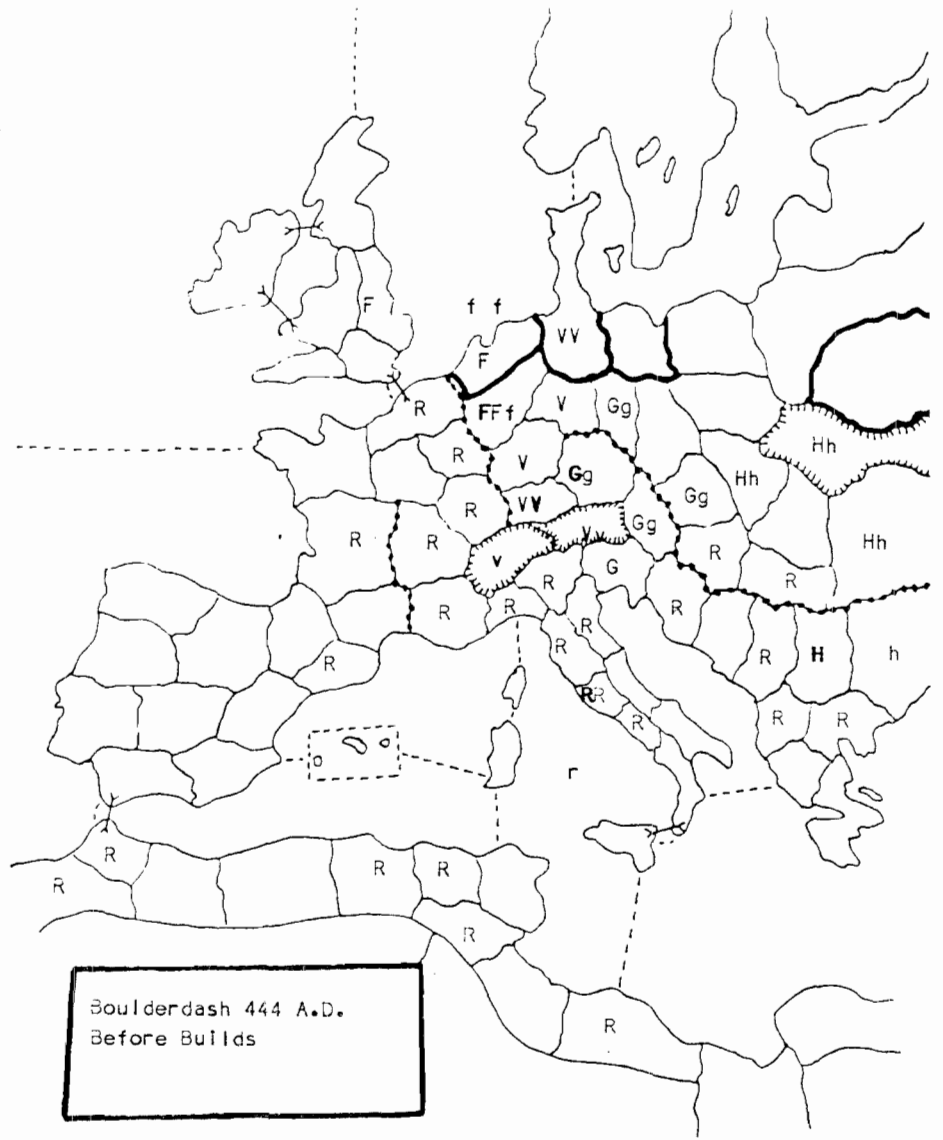

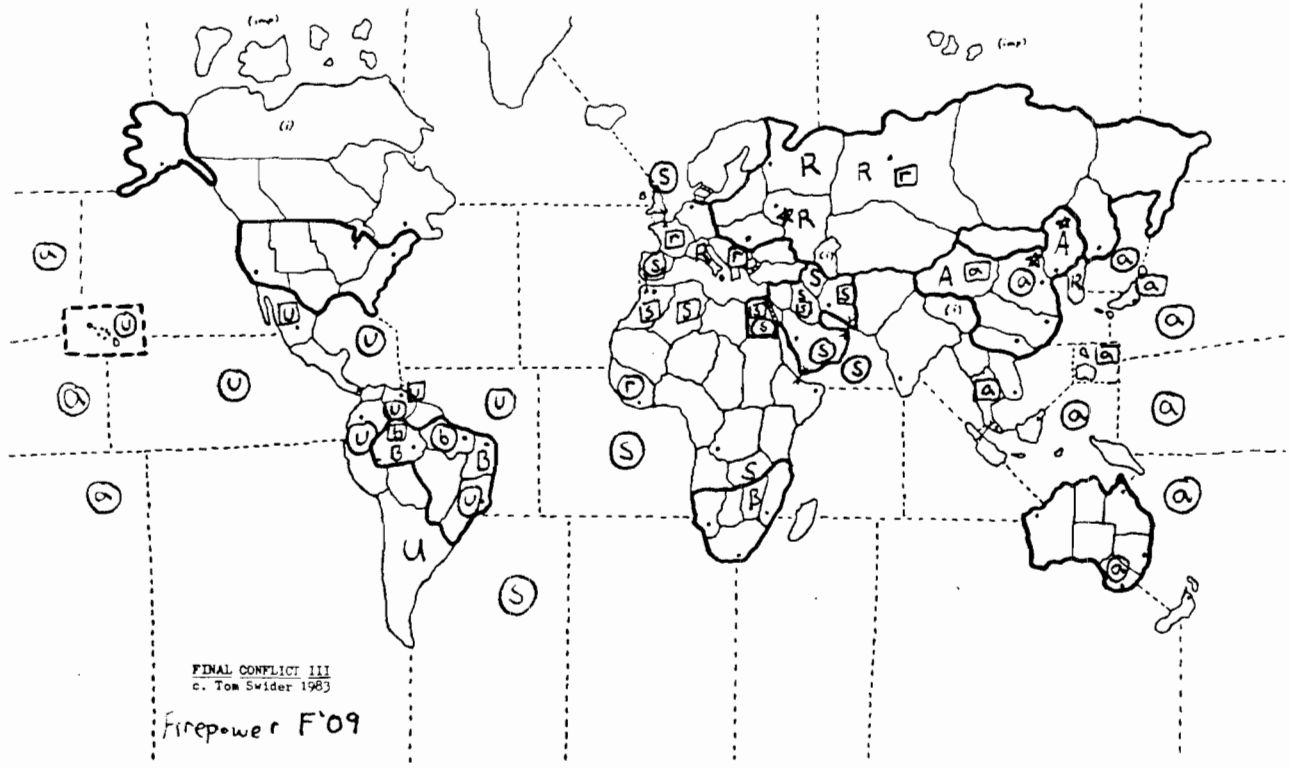

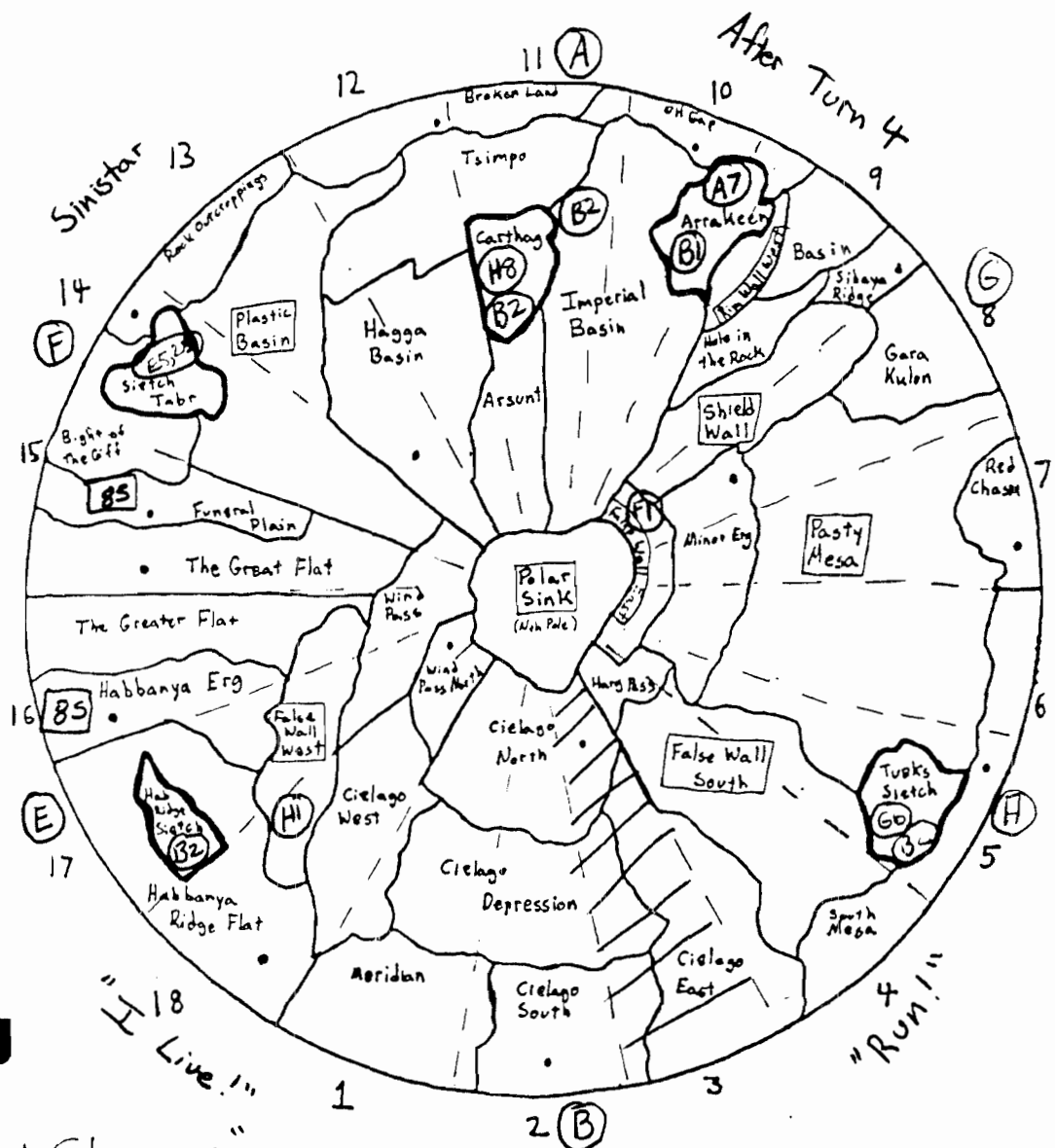

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GAMENOTES:

- 1) Rules interpretation: I can't find anywhere in the rulebook that states that if the Guild takes his first move option that he changes his "storm round" position for combat resolution. Unless this can be pointed out to me, this is how I will rule.
- 2) SPICE DEAL: Atreides and Harkonnen: The Harkonnen will deliver to a previously agreed neutral location four spice in a brown paper sack. The Atreides will disclose to the Harkonnen the last three cards bought by the Guild.
- 3) Because bidding should be relatively simple, I will be setting two quick deadlines. The first deadline (Jan 10) is for bids. On the 10th, I will type up the results and send them out by postcard. Turn 5 movement will have a Jan 30 deadline. Fair?

DEADLINE FOR TURN 5 BIDS: January 10, 1989
