Better Flags and Guidons. The Origins of the Flag of Circle Trigon. By his excellency Katzen, Graf von Oggman.

Despite the claims of Circle Trigon that its flag embodies a great and historical symbol, and is a revival of a genuine (but somehow unknown) flag of a great former (but never named) nation, the truth is quite another matter.

Those of us knowledgable in Heraldry, Vexillology, and Symbology, know that in reality the triangle within the circle symbol has a most ancient, but a most disreputable, history. It dates back, though Circle Trigon will not admit this antiquity, to the third age of Middle Earth. It was emblazoned in red on black on the banners of Sauron, ifor it is, in reality, none other than the ill-famed "eye of Sauron" the encircling ring representing the one ring, and the triangle, aside from being an exact representation of the pupil in Sauron's eye, also was intended to symbolize the three rings, encircled and dominated by the one ring. No wonder Circle Trigon resorts to fictional claims for its banner, a banner any decent man would shun.
