This has been an eventful month. It saw me get my first job doing something other than playing the Bass or delivering papers, or spinning discs at KWAX. Yep, your friend and "humble" narrator got a job peddling games retail for the Christmas season at a locally owned game store. 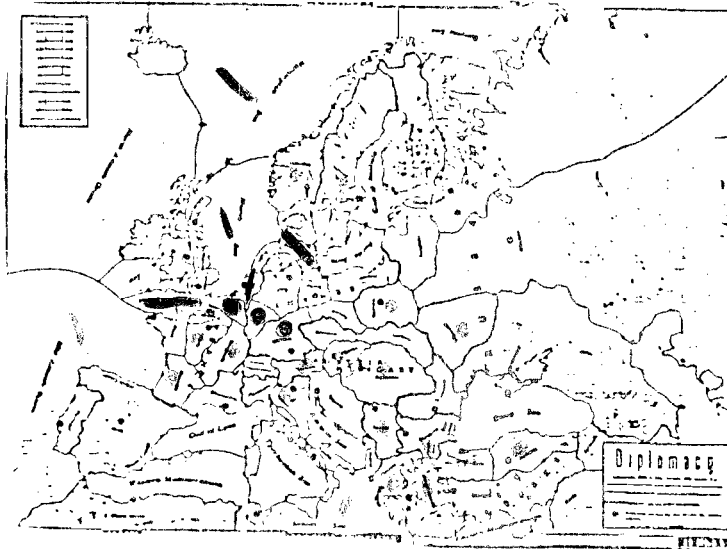

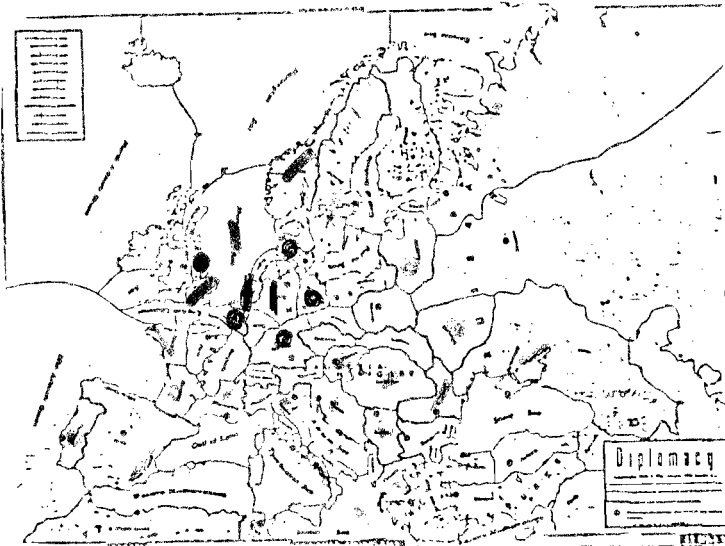
GM-KEVIN'S GIRLFRIEND- And similarly, TCOE is honored to have you write press for it.

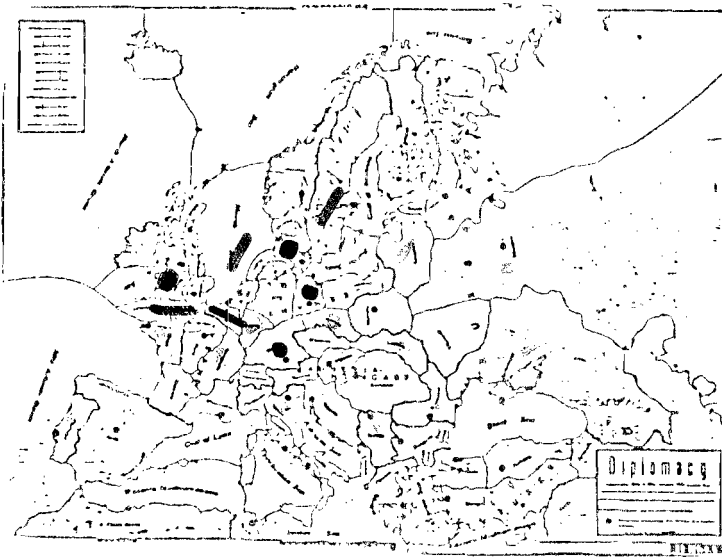
