Origins of World War II finally returns to COMMAND; there are still openings in the Bourse. For those of you who do not have a copy of The General Vol II, no. 4, here is a brief description of the Bourse rules: Each player starts with 500 each of rubles, dollars, marks, francs, and pounds and 10,000 gold units (G). At the end of the game, each unit of currency is worth 5N in units of G, where N is equal to the point score for that country. The winning country's currency is worth 5N plus 50. When the game begins, each player sends in bids and offers on currency; as soon as any bid is greater than or equal to an offer, a sale takes place (if the bid is greater than the offer, the difference is split). A full report of sales and a list of outstanding bids and offers will be printed along with the game moves; if you want immediate notification of the execution of your transaction, you may send me a postcard or a self-addressed, stamped envelope (note that Bourse play is continuous and not dependent upon the game deadlines). Bids and offers may be made conditional upon game events and split bids and offers are acceptable (sell 50 marks @ 75G and sell 60 marks @ 78G). Bids/offers remain active until executed or withdrawn. During each game turn, 10 units of each currency will be put up for bid by the GM. Game fee for the Bourse is \$1.00.

1975/76 is no longer suitable for analysis; Edie Birson has just resigned due to the lack of time and the amount of replacement I've had to make has changed the entire structure of the game. To fill the gap I am attempting to start another game year one that will be run with more player participation in the analysis.

I have explored the possibility of

the latest Diplomacy game from my card file and I have had to reconstruct it from my second book. The list as far as I know is Bailey, Van Gale, Lachs, Farrell. If I have left anyone out or put someone in who doesn't want to play notify me immediately. Also, I need new preferences lists for all of the above.

I have revised my position on stand-by moves. When an NRI occurs, on-the-spot stand-by moves will no longer be made. I will automatically call for stand-by orders to be submitted for the next season and

the name and address of the person submitting stand-by orders will be listed with that game's moves. I will replace a player after two or three consecutive NRI's at my discretion (remember, I will extend a deadline if you feel you can't get your moves in on time). The only exception to this is 1901 moves. In the event of an NRI, Spring 1901 moves will be made as follows:

I am going to attempt a very ambitious project, but one that I think will be very successful... an Intimate Diplomacy tournament. Intimate Diplomacy is a very playable two-man Diplomacy variant invented by Adrian Bird and Steve Doubleday, revised by Steve Spett (the rules appear in the 1975 IDA Handbook). Each player sends in a preference list for countries, with the first non-conflicting preference being assigned. Bids are then placed for the right to order the pieces of the other five "minor" countries in the game (one bid per year for the next game year (S.F.W)). The

The tournament will run as follows: You will play four games simultaneously in round one. You receive 2 pts for a win, 1 pt for a draw, 0 pts for a loss; a draw occurs if no one wins at the end of 1903. You can also win by fulfilling the normal Diplomacy victory conditions. Deadlines will be every two weeks and you must include a self-addressed stamped envelope with each set of moves. 5 pts advances you to the second round. Game fee will be \$1.00, \$2.00 of which goes into a prize fund. Round one preferences lists must list at least 3 different countries in the first position. Only final results will be reported in COMMAND and no press will be accepted for these games.

A new section of MD (ND3) is open for entrants. The game master will be Bob Boardley, editor of the new Diplomacy zine Broshaha. Games is still \$1.00 plus postage. U.S. Diplomacy has been voted to an end by a vote of 4-1. I will replace the game with another variant to be determined by the majority. I would like to try either the Youngstown Variant or the 1958 rules for Diplomacy (COMMAND #9), but I will consider any other variant that I can get the rules for. Those entered in the U.S. Diplomacy game have a free entry into the new variant. Send in your suggestions along with either a copy of the rules and map or a reference as to where they are printed and I will print a list to vote on next month.

A great deal of fuss is being raised over Doug Beyerlein's decision to charge \$1.00 for each Boardman Number he issues. Some publishers refuse to pay the fee and are therefore running their games without Boardman Numbers. The Boardman Numbers are, in my opinion, a very important service; one which holds the postal hobby together. With Avalon Hill's decision to cut off it's subsidy, there is no way they can be run without charging a fee for them unless the BN Custodian foots the bill himself. There is absolutely no reason why he should be asked to do so as the number's are maintained for the hobby's benefit and not Doug Beyerlein's. I will continue to obtain Boardman Numbers for all my regular Diplomacy games and I will not pass the extra cost on to the players. Also, I am cutting grades with any zine not using Boardman numbers.

This issue may run 10 pages instead of twelve; my new typewriter has a fairly small type style, how about some of you writing some articles, game reviews, letters... whatever. Anyone have a game design for Bottom of the Barrel Publications?

Letter to the Editor:

I have some comments on your 1975 IW "Memo" game. As a novice to the Diplomacy scene, I am appalled by the apparent lack of class some of the "big names" have exhibited in this game. Because of their actions, or more properly, lack of actions, your Memo game has become a shambles.

I would think that a player who can no longer participate in a game would have the courtesy to resign immediately, so the position may be reassigned immediately to a stand-in, who will play the game. Evidently Messrs. Lakeika, Keinsel, or Hagan did not possess that quality.

However, nothing is to be feared from this new generation of German-Russians since the ministry has also stated that most of the babies born are retarded.

(Moscow) The Czar of Russia today was on Kaiser Wilhelm of Germany as he left for Berlin after a state visit. In a going-away speech the Kaiser expressed his great love of Mother Russia and said that on his many trips to Russia he had never failed to stop on his way and communicate this love directly to the people. The Czar wished a quick journey home.

(Ankara) With an official communique today, the Young Turk committee proclaimed the creation of the new Turkish Islamic Republic to be headed by Kemal Pasha, hereafter sometimes known as Attaturk. The Sultan retired to his harem where his wives are seeing to his "security". In the absence of any communication from Russia, who had been forewarned of the coup, Turkish forces assumed a purely defensive posture to the north so as to ward off any possible blows by Czar Hamid's forces. The new government pledged itself to good relations with all friendly states, especially Italy. Those good king John had graciously permitted his Sicilian vassals to continue to carry out their traditional trade relations with Turkey and New York via Palermo and Marseilles. In conjunction with this the new Minister of Secret Trade, H. Linsky (a Russian immigrant), assured the press that the legendary New York Gallion would leave on schedule....

(Vatican) In a dramatic reversal of previous policy, his Holiness the Pope today announced excommunicated the Austria-Hungarian Empire. Siting the Austrian government as corrupted by greed, lust, dishonesty, and sexual perversity (subjects on which he displayed a most remarkable familiarity) he called upon all good Catholics to reborn the Austrian government and return to the ideals of Christian charity, through violence if necessary.

(Rome) The Minister of Defence revealed today that Field Marshal Caesar Disgustus, commander of all Italian Armed Forces in the Venice military district, following the emotional appeal made by his Holiness the Pope yesterday, had mutinied along with his troops and charged head-long into the Austria-Hungarian Empire. It is not known whether his Majesty the King will be able to regain control over Army Venice.

GAME REVIEW MR. PRESIDENT (3M/AH)

I've always had a lot of respect for the 3M line of games. Acquire is my favorite and one that my non-wargaming friends are willing (nay, eager) to play. After playing Mr. President, I am forced to admit that Acquire is no longer at the top of my list.

Mr. President is a very balanced quite realistic, extremely exciting simulation of a Presidential campaign and election. As a candidate you must decide where (and how much) to campaign, where to advertise, where to try to raise funds, if and when to debate your opponent and about what. Rumors can swing votes toward your opponent, events can swing votes to the undecided column, press endorsements can swing votes your way. Even before the campaign starts you must chose your Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates. Do you nominate the Governor of New York hoping his influence in the state will carry it's 41 electoral votes or do you go with the Congressman from Rhode Island and his strong financial support? Or how about the Senator from Arkansas who is extremely competent at debating?

The mechanics of the game are fairly simple. Each turn you select a region to campaign in; East, South, Mid-West or West. Depending upon the roll of the dice you can campaign in two, three or four states, debate, advertise, or go to campaign headquarters and take your chances on the events of the day while strengthening your home state. You know which states your opponent is campaigning in but you don't know (other than how many times he's campaigned there) how much strength he is building up. In the end, however, it is how well you do in capturing the undecided vote that ultimately decides who runs the country.

While the luck factor is definitely present in this game, it accents the game rather than detract from it. Tactics are all important and a badly run campaign has very little chance of succeeding. But a solid campaign that falls somewhat short coming into the homestretch can turn around fairly quickly as the undecided decide. The best part of the game is counting the vote (popular and/or electoral) and finding out that that last little push in Hawaii has given you the last 4 votes that spells the difference between victory and defeat.

If you decide to buy the game, try to find a copy of the 3M version as it has the outer sleeve for the game box. I haven't seen the Avalon Hill version yet, but I'm sure they must have cut corners.
