


Press:



There are 2 Gargoyles, 8 Centaurs, and 9 Ogres loft.

6 TITANS, 6 ANGELS, 16 Ogres, 17 Centaurs, 19 Gargoyles, 2 Rangers, 10 Cyclopi, 5 Trolls, 7 Lions.



JASON BERGMANN AS GM - Others may disagree!

Hy rulings regarding possible ambiguities in these Downfall rules, just in case it comes up.....

1)Initial placement. The ring may appear in Erech. In that case only the Ranger unit would be able to claim it.

2)Personality units. A player may submit standing orders regarding certain personality units (ie. if I run into Saruman, attack him). This would override the need to make provisional orders for each move. This standing order is in effect, though, until countermanded.

If a personality unit is to move with another unit, then the orders for that unit must say "moves with". For example: "Faramir moves with Rohan army Anorien-North Ithilien". If a personality unit (including Gandalf and the Nazgul) does not order to "move with", then the additional strength is not added to the unit while moving, but the presence of the personality unit is not reported.

3)Gandalf. The same "moving with" ruling regarding personality units applies to Gandalf as well. If Gandalf "moves with" any good or neutral unit, his location is reported to all players.

If Gandalf "moves with" the Ranger or Fellowship his whereabouts are not automatically reported. If, however, the Ranger or Fellowship unit is attacked by another player, and Gandalf is present, Gandalf's location will be public knowledge.

If Gandalf destroys the Balrog, he is not informed of the number of missed moves until the turn before he is to reappear.

4)Nazgul. The rules make it unclear whether or not the Nazgul may paralyze and move at the same time. My ruling is that they may not, just as the Rohan cavalry units may not combine supports and moves. The Nazgul may only move with a unit of its master on first phase.

5)Easterlings. The Easterlings may stay off the board as long as they want. 5)Cavalry. Cavalry may not move first phase and support second phase or support first phase and move second phase. No mixing is allowed. Cavalry may not support in both phases, but may move in both phases.

7)Herd. Note that Fangern is a fortress area, and that the Herd may not be moved into that province. Personality units may not move the Herd.

d.Ranger. When the Ranger unit becomes a 2A, the Gandalf player has until the next Build phase to decide whether or not he will build another Ranger in Menuial. If the Gandalf player fails to build the Ranger, then building armies has been chosen as the option.

 ${\mathbb G}$ Fellowship. The ents march the turn <u>following</u> the Fellowship's entry into Fangorn.

10 Fangorn. The Saruman personality unit moving alone into Fangorn would be destroyed, as would any single Saruman unit. A single unit moving with Saruman would not be destroyed in Fangorn, unless Saruman left and the single unit were to remain.

11) The Ring: The ring may be put on only at the beginning of a particular turn. It takes effect on that particular turn, before the first moves of all units. Orders may be conditional upon the wearing of the ring. The Mordor 2A units immediately become single armies, but the loss of the Easterling centers is not resolved until the next build/removal phase.

The ring may only be taken from a unit which is carrying or wearing it by a successful attack upon that unit. The "order of claim" is only important if two units simultaneously "find" the ring.

12)The map. The moves Ered Lithui - South Rhun and Nurn - Khand are legal.

Gendalf: The null set, the donut hole, the big black hole Gondor: Home, Druwaith Laur, Anorien, Harad, adds City of Corsairs = 8 (may

build one)

Mordor: Udun, Baraddur, Minas Morgul, Nurn, South Rhun, 3 easterlings, Osgilath, South Ithilien, Khand, South Gondor, loses Dol Guldur, adds Wold,

adds Harad = 14 (may build two as one was popped in Rethe I)
Rohan: Herd, Edoras, Helms Deep, East Emmet, loses Wold = 4 (due one build or

two depending on retreat, although no home centers open to build in)

Sarumen: Home, Hollin, loses Minhiriath = 4 (must remove one)

Umbar: adds Minhiriath, loses Havens, loses City = 1 (removes one or retreat OTB and even)

When, I hope that I got all of that right. That mess above with many retreats, centers changing hands etc., seems a good time to separate the seasons if you suk me.
