On 29 October, 2001, I got to visit "America's Attic". Well, that's what I called it anyway. Technically it's called the "Popular Culture Library", on the campus of Bowling Green State University, a few minutes south of Toledo, OH. As a matter of practicality, it's a monument and testament to America's leisure time, a history of America's hobbies.

What's there? LOTS of things. The largest comic book collection in the world. The Romance Writers of America Office Archives. Anything that someone might want to research on America and how it spends its free time (and apparently those researchers come from all over the world). I got an hour-long tour from librarian Linda Babcock (I'd like to think she took the time because I'm a great guy, but it was probably because I once sent a check there...on another note, my perception of librarians *has* to change...since Jamie McQuinn and my sister Jean are both librarians I *should* know that they can be very outgoing and exuberant, and still Ms. Babcock caught me off guard with her enthusiasm...but I Digress...), who showed me 1.5 floors of the 8 story building, all dedicated to Popular Culture. Ms. Babcock told me that the most often researched item was the TV Guides they have there.

We travelled up and down rows of stacks of collections of anything that collectors collect and donate. I saw boxes of pulp magazines. I saw TV scripts. I saw a box labled, "Mystery & Detective Monthly, #1 - #119." Sci-fi books and magazines. Posters. One box was labled, "Star Trek Box 17-A, Galaxy Globes." Thousands of books on the Occult. The Library of Congress of Paranormal. Greeting and post cards (over 60,000). JC Penney catalogs. Emmy screening tapes. And on and on...

So why was *I* there? Diplomacy of course. Jamie McQuinn had taken the Hoosier Archives up there, and the PCL had organized them. Ms. Babcock took me up to the top floor (insert your own joke here) and showed me many shelves full of postal Dip zines once owned by Walt Buchanan. One box was labled, "Graustark #1 - #616." She opened it for me, and I got to read a copy of the first-ever postal Dip zine. In case you've never seen one, Graustark #1 is two pages long, has John Boardman's houserules, is trolling for players for a postal Dip game that he is going to GM, and is dated "May 1963". Humbling. (When I got home that night Graustark #727 was in my mailbox...John should get sponsorship from Energizer.) Many boxes of many zines that I had never heard of, probably because most of them were from the 70s. A partial history of our hobby from the glory days.

Along one row of tables was a set of 26 boxes, recently arrived from Pete Gaughan. Ms. Babcock opened one for me, and it was stuffed full of...well...paper. There were probably postal Dip zines in there, but she estimated that it would take a student intern a semester to organize it. She may have been optimistic.

Sadly, I was running late and had to cut the visit short. But I'll be back, and I want some ideas from the readership of what to look for in the old zines. Whose zine should I look for? What controversial item should I research? What old-time player? I need ideas here folks. I might only have an hour, but I might have several hours. Throw something at me. I've not been around that long, and I want to learn, but I don't know where to start.

Until then, if any of you are driving south from Detroit or Toledo on I-75 (or north from Dayton for that matter), stop in, and tell Linda that Goz says 'hi'. That'll freak her out.

From a Reuters report, dateline Strasbourg, France, dated 11 July 2001:

More than 100 garden gnomes and other gaudy statues were discovered today assembled on a roundabout, or traffic island, in eastern France, a police spokesman said.

Some of the statues were set up to spell out, "Free the Gnomes." No one claimed immediate responsibility for the stunt, but police said it bore all the hallmarks of the shadowy Garden Gnome Liberation Front.

The kitsch little creatures were reported stolen from numerous gardens around the town of Chavelot overnight and subsequently gathered together on the roundabout.

"It was a bit like a creche. Everything had been carefully set up," a police spokesman said.

The Gnome Liberation Front rose to prominence in the mid-1990s following a series of raids on gardens to "free" gnomes and "return them to the wild."

The group suffered a setback in 1997 when a court handed its ringleader a suspended prison sentence and fined him for his part in the disappearance of some 150 gnomes.

Last year the group struck Paris, stealing around 20 gnomes during a night raid on a Paris garden exhibition.




