To pick up where we left off last ish: In sizing up the situation for Fall, it looks as if no single power is going to make substantial gains. What we have developing on the board is two threecountry alliances with Germany as a wild card. It appears that France-England-Russia form one, with Italy-Austria-Turkey as the other. This of course is not definite but rather what seems to be at this time. France should hold constant with regard to supply centers but stands to make gains in the Med. England will lose Edinbourgh and Holland but should take Belguim to remain at four centers. Russia stands to lose Sevestapl and possibly Sweden. England could support Sweden but then forfeits her opportunity to regain the North Sea, which might p prove essential to her defense. Russia might decide to abandon Sevestapol and retake Rumania, but this would prove to be only a temporary respite. Turkey stands to gain Sevestapol if Austria cuts the Ukraina support. However, Austria is in a position to strike Turkey in Bulgaria. Austria must decide whether to push into Russia or support the Turkish thrust. The latter would prove the mst beneficial to har, as she is vulnerable in the center. Italy is in good shape as far as the Fall move, but will probably lose the WesMed. She gains one from Munich, so should be able to build a fleet in time. Germany is undoubtedly in the most tenuous position. She has a multitude of choices: 1) take Edinburough 2) cut Norway support and take Sweden 3) retake Helland 4) protect Berlin or 5) support Belguim. By choosing (1) she hinders England's growth, which at this point might be best. But by choosing (3) and (2) she stands to hold England steady and ensure that Russia gains no new units. This might also be done by choosing (4) and (5). Whatever she decides, Germany holds the key to Fall, 1902 in the lowlands.
