## AND AN ANALYSIS FROM THE HOUSE OF COOP:

Germany's builds indicate an inland thrust rather than an effort to move by sea. Unable thus far to break thru the French line, look for Germany to move toward the relatively weak Russian-Austrian border. Taking a defensive stand along the Ruhr area, she could take Munich this Spring, and probably Warsaw by the Fall. However, this would mean leaving England in the lowlands. More probable would be a renewed effort to push England out, coupled with a stall along the Ruhr. Meanwhile Germany's fleets will now take the offensive in the North since Russia cannot spare the armies that are now in the South. It would appear that Germany has to now slow her expansion in favor of more stable and solid positions. This of course shifts the advantage to France. With Italy's apparent demise, she is able to move unhindered by sea. Look for France to stall along her German border and move quickly toward BOTH Italy and England. England is alive but not well. She will need a little luck and much support from France to stay in the lowlands. And as well, she now has to confront the German fleet on her own mainlaand. Teamwork between Russia and Englnd might just save the North. There is a slight possibility that Germany might spare England in return for help against the French. We doubt it. In the East, Austria now has pressure from behind for the first time in the game. Germany's presence in Bohemia threatens bothe Vienna and Budapest via the Galacia corrider. This might be the break thaat Turkey needs to survive. With Austria's attention turned to the West, Turkey can now maneuver fro position rather than continue her defensive strategy. Russia appears to be in the most precarious position, due to threats at all three of her borders. Germany in the North, Trukey in the South, and Grmany near Warsaw. The House of Coop makes the following predictions with regard to 1904: (1) Sevestapol falls to Russia, (2) Greece falls to Turkey, (3) Venice falls to Austria, (4) England invades France, (5) France moves into Italy, (6) Germany gains three centers, and France becomes the number two power on the board, surpassing Austria.
