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WHICH WAY SHOULD THE SIG GO?

I really appreciate the voluntary contributions which came in from many of the members. Some contributions of more than \$1.00 were received for the Cause. However, I think it's time we decided on how we want to handle our finances on a permanent basis.

When the SIG was first formed, I thought we'd be lucky to get 15 members. If we'd stayed around that size, there would have been no problem keeping our records current, and mailing out a short newsletter when the occasion arose. To my surprise, we shot up to 42 members before we began losing a few due to non-renewal of Mensa membership or people dropping out of the hobby. As a result, it's becoming a chore keeping track of who is still a SIG member, and who isn't. The 1976/77 Register shows that 3 people have let their Mensa memberships lapse; therefore, they will be dropped from SIG membership as of December 31st. There is no way I can check on whether Canadian members are still duespaying M's. Furthermore, there is always a question as to whether someone is still in the Diplomacy hobby although he's not playing postally.

As I see it, we have three choices. One, we could just go on the way we have, being dependent upon voluntary donations for the cost of mailing this newsletter. Obviously, the larger the SIG gets, the more expensive the mailing will become. Under this procedure, I'll feel no obligation to put out DIPLOMAG on a regular basis, and will continue to print only on a once every two or three month basis, as conditions warrant.

Two, we could become a more formalized SIG, and charge regular annual dues, as many of the other SIG's have begun doing. Then, anybody who does not pay those dues (or render substantial services as a GM) can be deemed to be no longer interested, and culled out of the rolls. This would save me a heck of a lot of work, checking registers and writing to people. I would see these dues as being \$1.00 per year, for which I'd guarantee to publish DIPLOMAG six times a year (bimonthly). We might consider publishing Dippy articles in an expanded newsletter, if people will write them for us.

Three, we could incorporate DIPLOMAG into the pages of my BUSHWACKER, and require all SIG members to subscribe at the regular rate of \$2.50/year, unless they are already a player or trader for same. I don't like this solutions because: a. It would obligate me to reserve a page of BUSHWACKER for the SIG every issue. b. BUSHWACKER is primarily a variant game zine, and many of our members are not interested in variants. c. It would look like I was trying to inflate my circulation figures at the expense of a captive audience. (In truth, BUSHWACKER's circulation is as big as I want it to be).

Please let me have your opinion on the ballot you'll find elsewhere in this issue.*
We will follow majority rule, providing at least 50% of you vote. If Proposal Two is adopted, we'll phrase this in more elegant language for an official By-laws amendment, since the current By-laws prohibits collection of any dues. 1977 will be the first year for which dues would be required, and everyone who has contributed a dollar since August 1, 1976, will be credited with having already paid their 1977 dues.

THE MAKEUP OF OUR MEMBERSHIP

The new 1976-77 American Mensa Register is out. It was interesting to look up our SIG members in it. 30 of our members furnished detailed information on themselves. The following characteristics were noted:

SIG members' ages ranged from 18 to 55, as of December 1976. There were clusters of people at ages 19, 25, 29/30, 34/35, 38/39, and 46/48. The average age of the 30 M's for whom this data is available is 34.3. The median age is 34. Four members are 25, and 3 each are 19 and 30. This is considerably higher than in the hobby as a whole. As of a year ago, I believe the average age of Postal Diplomacy players in North America was about 25.

Our membership includes 10 people who are 4-year college graduates (some are now working on advanced degrees), two with Masters degrees, and two with Doctorates. Several others are now in college, or have completed two-year college courses. 17 are Single or Divorces, and 13 are Married. (Anyone want to join the Diplomacy Widow's Assn?) We now have four female members.

Consistent with Mensa as a whole, we are not a very religious group. Our SIG member-ship includes 8 Agnostics, 3 "Nondenominational", 3 "None" and 1 Unitarian, which adds up to 15, or half the known sample, as being on the "detached" side. Denominations showing more than one member were 3 Lutheran, 2 Catholic and 2 Methodist M's.
