This is the official announcement that we will hold an election in September for a new two-year term for the Junior Commissioner post, starting November, 1, 1977. People may nominate others, or nominate themselves. Bill Young has advised me that he will run to serve a full term as Jr. Commissioner.

Please send all nominations to the Election Commissioner, Christopher Pike, 72 Berteau Ave., St. John's, Nfld., CANADA A1A 1V8. Qualifications for Office, as stated in Item 7 of our By-Laws: "All Officers must be current members of American or Canadian Mensa. Candidates for Chairman must have been members of the SIG for at least six months prior to the election." Deadline for nominations is Wednesday, Aug. 24th. If more than one candidate is nominated, the Election Commissioner will prepare and mail out ballots to the membership, and they will have 30 days from the date of mailing to mark and return said ballots to him. The Commissioner will then count the ballots and announce the results. If only one person is nominated, the Commissioner will declare him elected by acclamation.

MENSA GAMES 5, 6 and 7 are proceding in the pages of CLAW AND FANG, being GM'd under the tender mercies of the Fangmaster, Don Horton. 1975HG has reached Fall-1908, with 5 countries still alive (Russia and Germany are gone). No one has gotten out in front yet. Arndld Vagts (France) and Sid Jolly (Italy) both have 8 Centers, with Dave Reynolds (England) and Don Dewsnap (Turkey) right on their heels with 7 apiece. 1976BN (Mensa #6) has only reached Fall 1905, but Rollie Straton's Russia already has 10 Centers. Germany (Vagts) and Turkey (Bill Young) are second, with 7 each. Austria is gone, and France (Carawan) is dying, with a single unit. Mensa #7, 1977CY, has just started, with some of our newer members getting into their first all-Mensa game.

As soon as The Old Fogies' Game I'm currently in (by invitation) in RUNESTONE has ended, I guess I'll have to get into another all-M game, and get slaughtered again. Nobody expressed any interest in CM'ing, so I guess that all Regular Mensa games will continue to be in CLAW & FANG for the time being.

While the Diplomacy hobby as a whole has seen the loss of several esteemed publishers in 1977, the Diplomacy SIG continues to prosper. The SIG now has members on 4 continents. A lot more inquiries have come in, but I'm only reporting those people who've actually come up with their SIG dues and said they want to belong.

To be honest, the U.S. branch of the hobby did not grow in 1976 in terms of gamestarts or publishers. There were several reasons for this. One was the strife between the two groups trying to control the International Diplomacy Assn. between July '76 and March '77. This turned off some people who perhaps didn't realize that this situation would not last forever. Another was that several people just happened to "burn out" around the same time.

However, according to Boardman No. Custodian Doug Beyerlein, we've already turned the corner on new game starts. 1977 should show an all-time record number of new Regular games starting in the U.S. (The number of gamestarts had continued to increase in the U.K. and Europe throughout 1976, to the point where almost as many games began in the U.K. as in the U.S.). This recent improvement here is probably due, in part, to the increased sales of Dippy sets under the aegis of Avalon Hill. It's also due, hopefully, to the end of the IDA Battle (in which, I confess, I was one of the partisans). I'd also like to think that the spread of Diplomacy throughout Mensaland has had some small effect on aiding the hobby's growth. I had tried to get G.R.I. to advertise the game in the MENSA BULLETIN, and have suggested the same thing to Avalon Hill. They're missing a bet in overlooking the 24,000 potential Mensa customers.
