I am probably taking a financial loss in giving SIG members Variant game positions in BUSHWACKER at \$2.00 less than I charge everyone else, but that has nothing to do with the SIG itself.

HOBBY NEWS

OUR OWN GLENN OVERBY will prepare the 1981 Postal Diplomacy Census, which will be a list of all North American Postal players, plus those people with APO or FPO addresses participating in American games. All publishers have been requested to send copies of their mailing lists to Glenn. He hopes to have this Census ready for sale by the time of MICHICON on June 12th. When price and publication date are ready to be announced, I'll mention them here.

THE ZINE DIRECTORY is now available in a Second Edition, called Fall 1980, from Michael Mills, 1585 Quaker Rd., Macedon, N.Y. 14502. This contains a listing of all known Diplomacy zines around the world, plus lists of Hobby Clubs, Services and Custodians. Only 50¢, and well worth it for all players.

SIG MEMBER ROBERT STIMMEL is running a variant of Postal Rail Baron as a Guest GN in a zine called MIKE'S MAG. This version includes a stock market for Railroad shares, and is restricted to a specific number of turns, to keep it within a reasonable time frame. I believe the game fee is \$3.00. STATUS OF THE ALL-MENSA GAMES

One member expressed disappointment that we did not run a Mensa Game status report in the last DIPLOMAG. I had been running such reports on an average of only every other issue. I'd appreciate knowing if other SIG members would also like to see this report as a feature in every issue. When most of the games were in CLAW & FANG this seemed unnecessary, but now they're scattered among 5 different publications.

MENSA #9, 1978W, has reached Spring 1912 in C & F. ENGLAND (Johnson) has gone up to IT Centers and FRANCE (Bassett) to 10. Gary Schmidt had to resign, so a 3-Center GERMANY has gone into Civil Disorder. A vote has been requested on a 2-way draw between England & France. Russia & Turkey both survive with 5 Centers each, but are no longer SIG members.

MENSA #10, 1980AC, finds Van der Handel's GERMANY and Ron Brown's TURKEY tied for the lead with 9 Centers each, as they both get two builds in Winter 1904. ITALY (Charlie Byrne) has dropped one to 7, while ENGLAND (Walter Hodgdon) has gone up 1 Center to 7. RUSSIA has been eliminated. Arnold Vagts has taken over FRANCE from an ex-member who's disappeared, but the Republic has dropped to 2 Centers (-2).

MENSA #11, for which I don't see a Boardman No. (Isn't it 1960II,Ed?), has reached Winter 1902 with Rick Young's GERMANY in the lead with 7 Centers (+1). RUSSIA (Poppe) also has 7, but didn't get a build this year. Looks like FRANCE (Allensworth) is about to go down the tubes. Ed is happy to report he now has 3 stand-bys.

MENSA #12, 1980 IC, is running in Ron Brown's SNAFU, which is now a genuine zine, Grack with its second game (NORTH-1) about to start. As of Fall 1902, GERMANY (Bill Young) and ENGLAND (Byrne) are the leaders, with 7 and 6 Centers, respectively. FRANCE (Gaughan) has been eliminated, and Charles Letcher has had to replace Joe Marshall as RUSSIA, due to Joe's mail problems. All four of the remaining players have 5 SC's (Spain still neutral).

Five people were signed up for NORTH-1 as of January 10th. This game is open to all Canadian and Northeastern M's, but is not an official SIG game. This month's geography and history lesson is on Poland (Warsaw, Galacia and a small part of Silesia. A small part of what we call Prussia was also Polish, Ron.) A sub to SNAFU is \$2.50/year (11 issues), or you can get a stand-by alot for just a flat \$3.50 fee. I highly recommend you get one or the other. Address: R.R. 2, Maniwaki, P.Q., CANADA J9E 3A9.

MENSA #13 is filled, and has presumably gotten under way under the aegis of Chip Charnley, U.S. Navfac Keflavik, Box 7, FPO New York 09571.

We have 4 people signed up for MENSA #14, which will be run by Glenn Overby, II, in his zine, JIHAD. Please send your desire to sign up to me, and I'll send the list to Glenn when the game is filled. We need three more players, plus at least one stand-by. A stand-by slot is an easy way for novice players to get their feet wet.

Anyone interested in playing the variant game, "1885"? This is a 9-man game, which adds Spain and Sweden/Norway to the ranks of the Great Powers, in the year 1885. We have a list of 5 people who expressed interest in this game earlier, of whom three were M's. We didn't push it, as Small World II-R filled first, and I will run no more than three games at once in BUSHWACKER. However, Glenn Overby has offered to GM the next Mensa Variant game in JIHAD, so I'm thinking of trying to get "1885" filled first. To make up for the loss of Neutral SC's, new SC's are added in Ireland, Iceland, Morocco, Egypt and Persia. Write me if you're interested.
