

GM Note -- We had originally planned to end DPBA with #105, and complete the games in THI GAMESLETTER: but the bi-weekly (and sometimes erratic) echedule of that publication (plus a lack of space until reportage on Fischer/Spassky Match is concluded) made this inadvisable. So, we will continue with this skeleton version of the former DPBA until the remaining four games are completed. (We'll fill empty space with general material to bring the 'zine up to an even number of pages, but no more 10-page issues.) After that, we may or may not run one or two Regular games in TGL, depending uoon the state, at that time, of our publishing equipment and our eyes. #### All subs to and trades for DPBA terminated with #105 (not yet published). Anyone wishing to receive future issues of DFBA by subscription must subscribe to TGL; one issue will be deducted from his TGL sub for ea. issue of DPBA sent (this way, we'll only have to keep track of one sub). A very few trades for the remnant of DPBA will also be accepted (in cases where alternative trade of TGL and possibly TG is less than enough for the zine(s) you are sending us, and special arrangement has been made with us for you to continue to receive DPBA); but in most cases the bi-weekly TGL should be enough to match most trades.

The Players -- All players should still have ea. others' addresses from past rosters; however, if any of you need any of the others' address, ask and we'll send it to you with #108. The few remaining players are: Ackerman (QIC; receives DPBA via air-mail sub, since he is overseas player); Beyerlein (QFC,QIC); Boyer (QIC); Calabria (QFC, QHC); D.Cochran (QGC); A.Miller (QHC; air-mail deposit on hand); Naus (QGC, QIC; became player via trade for A.D.A.G. et al, rather than via fee); Phillips (QHC; player via trade for SHAAFT!!); Power (QHC); Rosamilia (QFC & Bourse); Tonnesen (QGC,QHC,QIC); Ver'Ploeg (Bourse, via trade for PLATYPUS PIE; if he misses one more session, he will be out of Bourse, and trade for DPBA will revert back to trade for TGL; if he remains in Bourse, trade for DPBA will again replace trade for TGL). #### Traders (receive both DPBA and TGL, unless otherwise stated): Boardman (for GRAUSTARK); Buchanan (for HOOSIER AR-CHIVES); Calhamer (for HYPERMODERN; DPBA only); Feron (for MOESHOESHOE, et al); Games Research (Complimentary copy; DPBA only); Labelle (for ANTARES & PELLUCIDAR); Von Metzke (for COSTAGUANA, et al). Note also that Phillips receives both TGL and DPBA, Ver Ploeg DPBA only. #### Subbers (one issue on TGL sub for ea. issue of DPBA): Alderson; Hull (receives all issues by virtue of his having purchased last complete set of all Miller Dippyzines, rather than as TGL subber); also players Ackerman (overseas airmail) and Schelz (was in Bourse; will receive no more issues after this one, as he is two issues (34¢) in arrears). This is also lastish for former player and trader Dix, who is out of QIC. All other former traders for DPBA are now receiving TGL only in trades, in lieu of DPBA.
