Be it hereby stated that, having obtained for the most part their objectives in the present European war, the governments of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, the Russian Empire, and the Ottoman Empire, withdraw from that conflict and declare themselves receptive to any and all offers of armistice. Due to the many changes of government which have taken place, our position is untenable. We therefore unconditionally surrender our forces to the Western Powers. We invite their mercy.

Austria -- Hell!

With the Imperial German Fleet, 17 km off the Yorkshire coast -- Admiral von Pohl, in an official release to the press, declared that the British 4th Fleet, operating in the North Sea, has been for the most part disabled, sunk, or scuttled. "A battle was joined approximately 37 km off Haligoland, when the British Battleship Cornaught and four auxiliary craft began shelling the Fleet. The battle was joined on 18 November, although visibility was poor and seas were somewhat high. In spite of this handicap, the battleship Karl von Clauswitz managed to sink two light cruisers of the British fleet, the Prince Albert and the Boston. The Quicksilver, a destroyer, was disabled and finally scuttled 50 km off the British coast. The Clauswitz was joined by the Hellenberg and the Prince, and the three dreadnaughts harried the British battleships, sinking the Chandernagore, and driving the rest of the fleet back towards the British Isles. The seven ships of the line presently were joined by nine others, and finally the rest of the fleet. By this time the British had lost one dreadnaught, three light cruisers, three destroyers, and seven auxiliary craft. The majority of those ships remaining were heavily damaged, and the Connaught had to be abandoned outside Boston. All considered, the Imperial German Navy has duplicated (and surpassed) the French and Russian victories off the Isle of Wight and Trondjem, respectively." ##### Off the record, von Pohl predicted that the final British collapse would come in mid-summer of 1903, "when the blockade begins to take effect." He denied the rumors of a coming invasion across the straits of Dover. "The English have the remainder of their fleet and Home Guard in the south of England; if there is an invasion, it would come in Cornwall or York, not near London."
