Rome -- While bowing ~~to~~ our necks to fit into the Russian yoke, along with our fellow losers, we wish only to remark that the only supply center Russia ever lost was Naples, to us. Where were the rest of you guys?

Vienna (January 17, 1908) -- Church bells all over the Empire ring today to celebrate the end of the war which has wracked Europe for seven long years. The people of the Dual Empire are almost in a state of shock at the news of the Russian victory, and the whole of Austria is in a delirium. The news of the Allied "Last Alliance" which was to throw back the Slavs, but failed, was followed within months by the declaration of the Allies that they wished to talk of an armistice. That was one week ago, and today the Allied surrender was confirmed by the ambassadors of the British, French, and Italian Empires, and the governments-in-exile of Germany and the Ottoman Empire. Although the Russians have a position of overwhelming might as far as this Empire is concerned, the populace expects generous concessions of land from the Czar, especially in the Balkans and Bavaria.

Germany -- Germany, for its part, accepts the surrender of the RAT's and requests its allies do the same. Italy is asked to surrender also and spare the shedding of any more blood.

Turkey -- I give. Abdul Hamid, Sultan of the Ottomans, Emperor of Byzantium, King of Syria, Khedive of Egypt, Prince of Assyria and Babylon, Caliph of Mecca, and King of Arabia.

Vienna -- The Emperor today issued a formal document concerning Austria's withdrawal from the war. "This was needed to silence those who persist in attributing war-like ambitions to peaceful Austria," said the Emperor. "We seek only peace."

GM Note -- With the formal surrender and cessation of hostilities by the governments of Austria-Hungary and Turkey, only Russia and Italy remain in the path of the steamrolling FEG's. The governments of Russia and Italy are asked to declare their intentions and, if they be to surrender, to lay down their arms and cease all aggressive actions. The government of France is asked to state whether it will ac-

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cept the surrender of the RAT's as did its allies. The governments of the FEC nations are asked, also, to declare a general ceasefire pending receipt of a reply from the governments of Russia and Italy to the government of Germany's request for an end to the war.

Ankara (March 15, 1904) -- It suddenly dawned on the Turkish Government that (1) Russia was growing too large, and (2) the Italian-Turko war was a mess. Russia has tremendous strength in the north and little to oppose it.

Ankara (March 16, 1904) -- Italio-Turco alliance announced, for use against Russia.

Ankara -- France: -France, you might as well know that England and Russia plan to attack you at the end of the German campaign. Notice the new fleet in the Baltic? At least, this is what the Tsar told me, and this is the truth -- I'll send you the letter if you want.

Ankara -- London: End your plan against France now, and join her in an attack on Russia. You could use some new citizens.

London -- France: Your fleet in the Mid-Atlantic is considered a threat to peace between our nations. Please retreat from the area. You have no need of fleets in the north and if they remain this next spring I will have to take defensive measures to assure the security of England.

No Source Given -- Radio Free Batavia. It was monitored here that there exist many dissatisfied elements in Holland, as the French heel continues to be felt on the land. General Van Heutz may deliver an ultimatum before long, demanding immediate withdrawal.

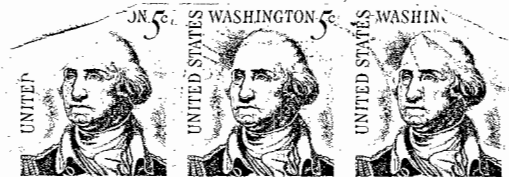
