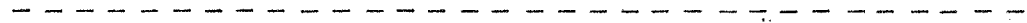

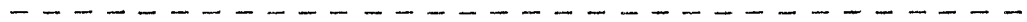

Rome -- Paris: French fleets in either Marsailles, Spain(SC), Western Mediterranean Sea, or North Africa will be interpreted by the Italian nation as an open act of war to be followed by immediate retaliatory actions.

Rome -- GM: The Italian government would be more than happy to take over England.

Rome -- StP.: Best wishes are sent to the Czar from the Italians.

Kavála (January 3) -- The Greek Government today fled the Greek mainland with a solemn promise to return again and bring peace and prosperity to their fair country. The Government withdrew, under escort from a friendly nation, to a haven on the Greek island of Khios, where, with the blessing of nearby Turkey, it will direct the efforts of all peoples dedicated to peace and freedom to free Greece from the tyrannical Habsburgs. Resistance organizations have met success already in slowing the enemy advance, notably in Thessaloniki, Árta, Trípolis, and Mégara.

Constantinople (January 6) -- The Turkish government formally denounces the Dual Monarchy of Austria and Hungary for its bloody conquest of a free nation, Greece. Turkish troops, at the request of the Greek government, have battled Austrians near Kavála for four days. These skirmishes have been successful in allowing the Greek king and His family and ministers to escape from the tyrannized mainland to the island

of Khios. Turkish forces will continue to be at the service of the Greek government in its unceasing efforts to liberate its homeland.

Tripolis (February 19) -- A small, grim band of Greek patriots is still holding out in this town high in the mountains of the Peloponnesos. "Although the Austrian bastards control the sea", said their leader, "their land forces are despicable. We will fight to the end, and will never surrender ourselves while a patch of Greek soil remains free."

No Source Given -- Beware! The Russian bear lurks in the North!

NSG -- Members of the French Underground were seen at a huge party given in their honor by the Turkish Court at Sevastopol. While the entire southern fleet of Russia undergoes extensive drydock repairs, superior masses of fresh troops enjoy the ski lodges of Norway and Sweden.

Memories of Treasure Island are recalled by drunken parties occurring over the entire British fleet. UDT forces, last seen boarding two-man submarines in the Barents and Skagerrak, have embarked under the code name "JIM HAWKINS".

But...while all of Europe makes merry, huge sea forces are nervously patrolling the Tyrrhenian and Ionian Seas. Will the free world stand by and watch...or!
