The "Golden Rules" of DIPLOPHOBIA --

The GM is doing all he can to keep the games moving and help the players get as much enjoyment out of them as possible. But his success at doing so ultimately rests upon the shoulders of the players themselves. Without their cooperation, the efforts of the GM are doomed to failure. Following are a few things you, as players, can do to help the GM do a better job of serving you:

- 1. Don't be a "drop-out" -- stick it out, no matter how bad your position. Drop-outs cause the GM mucho extra work, and often spoil the game for the other players.
- 2. If you <u>must</u> drop out, at least have the courtesy to give the GM advance notice, and to continue playing for another move or two, if necessary, to give the GM time to locate a replacement. This will ensure a more orderly transition, and won't disrupt the game as much as now so often happens.
- 3. If you enter a game as a replacement player, stick it out to the end. There's nothing more frustrating to the GM and disruptive to a game than a replacement player who himself has to be replaced.
- 4. Try not to miss moves. Missed moves generally slow down a game, and hurt the other players as well as the move-misser.
- 5. Get your moves in on time, or even a day or two before the deadline. The earlier all the moves are in, the earlier the GM can publish the 'zine.
- 6. Write clearly, and use a separate piece of paper for each game. If you must list all games on one sheet of paper, at least write on only one side of the paper. You'd be surprised how much time this would save the GM -- and how many GM errors it would help to eliminate.
- 7. Obey the House-Rules, particularly where move-writing is concerned. Don't abbreviate; and be sure to write a separate and complete order for each unit.
- 8. Go easy on the propaganda. Space is at a premium in a 10-page magazine, and we'd rather have you limit your own propaganda, instead of our having to arbitrarily lop some off or omit it entirely.
- 9. Check the published moves, positions, etc. for the games you are in promptly upon receipt of the 'zine,' and, if you discover any errors, let the GM know right away. This will also help avoid lengthy delays in the game.
 - 10. Send moves in by mail: use the telephone only as a very last resort.
- ll. Try to anticipate your SUMMER retreats & send them along with your SPRING moves. Likewise, try to anticipate your AUTUMN retreats & WINTER builds/removals & send them along with your FALL moves. Vice versa, if SUMER retreats are called for, also send in FALL moves by the SUMMER deadline; and if AUTUMN/WINTER orders are specified, also send in SPRING moves by the AUTUMN/WINTER deadline. We realize such advance orders are not always feasible because of the complexity or delicacy of a situation, but if most players would do this in most games, at least three or four weeks per game-year could be saved.
- 12. If you don't like something, let the GM know -- but try to remember he is serving many other players as well, and he can't possibly please all of the players all of the time, no matter how hard he may try. (Roster at end of 'zine)
