GM Note -- Latimer (GERMANY) has formerly conceded to Lebling (A-H), but no word has been heard from Beyerlein (FRA), so the war is not yet over. No one submitted SPRING moves, either. Lebling, if you will submit FALL moves (being sure to vacate at least one of your home supply centers) and at least one WINTER build, you will have an official win regardless of whether or not FRANCE surrenders (unless, of course, FRANCE takes a supply center away from you....).

PKC (Regular Diplomacy Game #5) -- RUSSIAN "FLYING DUTCHMAN" DISCOVERED; WAR HELD UP WHILE EXTRA UNIT IS PURGED!

GM Note -- It has been brought to our attention that GERMANY, and not RUSSIA, should have been credited with Moscow in the Supply Center chart published in DPBA #33. This means that RUSSIA only has three supply centers, and so should have removed one of his four units in his WINTER, 1907 removals. This also gave GERMANY 11 supply centers instead of 10, although he could have built no additional units, as he only had two home supply centers open in which to make the two builds he was allowed in DPBA #33. We therefore need a removal order from RUSSIA (Schelz) NLT Oct. 22, and the SPRING, 1908 deadline is extended until Oct. 29 (although, if all players will have SPRING moves in by Oct. 22, we will publish then). Sorry for this delay in the game, folks.

PEA (Variant-Regular Game #4) (Revisited) -- FRANCE JOINS GERMANY IN CONCEDED TO AUSTRIA-HUNGARY! WAR IS OVER!

GM Note -- Word has just been received from FRANCE (Beyerlein) that he conceded to AUSTRIA-HUNGARY (Lebling). With the only other player remaining in the game, GERMANY (Latimer) already having conceded, Dave Lebling is therefore declared the winner, victory deemed to have occurred SPRING, 1911. Congratulations, Dave!

PSC (Regular Diplomacy Game #12) -- PEERY STRIKES BACK!

Propaganda --

St. Peerigrad (Timeimperium) -- His most beloved Majesty, the Tsar, Che Peeri, today spoke before the Imperial Dumas and announced he had been forced to replace His commander-in-chief, the Crown Prince Tickolas, who has demonstrated unusual (even for Russia) incompetence in the managing of the war. The Tsar announced the new Russian commander would be Prince Buzzie Bavasi.

Peeris (Timeimperium) -- The President of the Grand Peerocracy of Peeriland today announced that Peeriland had declared war on Germany in an effort to destroy the last vestiges of German militarism and Australian imperialism in Europe. The President, Dr. Heinrich Himmorher, announced three million greene rabbits had been dispatched to the European theater to carry the Greene Plague into Germany.

Mt. Peerilympus (Timeimperium) -- Looking down upon the amusing antics of mere man, Peerikles today noted: "Yes, once again a small dumb man opened his mouth once too often and the forces of right and justice and Peery jumped in and put their foot in it!"

Walla Walla State Prison for the Mentally and Physically Handicapped (Timeimperium) -- Dr. Herman Koning, director of the Prison here, announced psychopeerialsis tests on former German President Jackque Greene, Junior had been inconclusive. Said the doctor: "The body was definitely over-developed but the brain showed no corresponding growth or development. Most likely a case of a small boy trying to make good."

GM Note -- Now that both sides have had their say, thus endeth the propaganda warfare in DIPLOPHOBIA between Jack Greene and Larry Peery. At least until half the DIPLOPHOBIA games end, propaganda will, in the future, be restricted only to players in the games -- and players in the games are requested to be judicious in their use of the propaganda privilege. Thanks!

DIPLOPHOBIA is published weekly. Players automatically receive only the issues containing games in which they are a player. To receive remaining issues, send a bunch of 6¢ stamps, specifying whether you want the issues via 1st-class mail as published, or 2-at-a-time via 3rd-class mail.
