 all we can say for sure.... Hal Naus was asked to send moves for Inman (GER),  
 which he did. Inman sent moves for other DPBA games, but not for FQC, so, having  
 missed twice in a row in FQC, is out. However, Hal Naus also sent moves for A-H  
 (Beyerlein), since Doug asked (according to Hal) him to send in moves for him,  
 and to replace him temporarily until the press of his studies lets up (in June).  
 Now, we know Doug was seeking a replacement, but he never said Hal was to be it  
 (not that we are questioning this -- it's just that we must hear from the player  
 being replaced when he names his own replacement). The problem is, we also have  
 moves from Doug for A-H.... #### So, let's resolve it this way. Dean is playing  
 ITALY, eff. immediately; Hal Naus will take over A-H temporarily from Doug Beyer-  
 lein, eff. either S'12 or F'12 (Doug, please let us know whether to use your S'12  
 moves or Hal's); and we will skip Stand-By Replacement Player Grayson, who has been  
 missing moves himself of late, and ask Dave Lindsay to take over the play of GER-  
 MANY, effective with the current (SPRING, 1912) moves.

DER REICHSBLAD (Namur -- Monday, 17 August 1903) -- When the Chancellor's ultimatum to the oppressors of Belgium expired five days ago without any reaction from Whitehall, it was the general opinion that this sleepy little town would see some action soon. 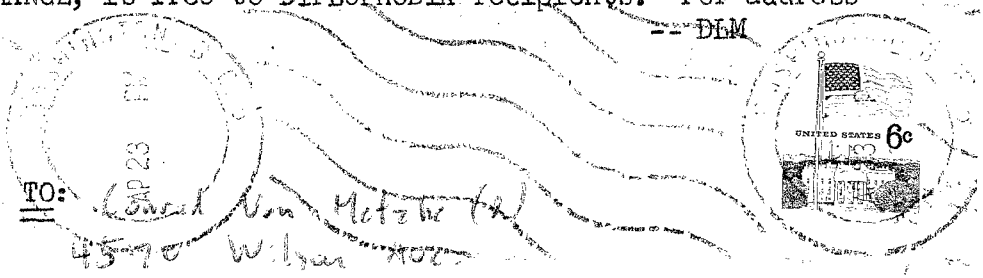
QEC Bourse -- The "Stock Market" Bourse -- completely unlike any Bourses being run so far -- should be fun -- see page 2 of THE EXCHANGE #9 for summary of rules, and DIPLOMANIA #30 for complete rules. If you don't subscribe to DIPLOMANIA, send 35¢ (30¢ if G.B. Reg. member for 1970) for #30, or a 6¢ stamp for an extract including the complete proposed rules for the QEC Bourse. Extract will also include complete proposed rules for "Q-Series" Bourse (see below).

"Q-Series" Bourse -- A single Bourse to be run around all the "Q" games being run in DIPLOPHOBIA now and in the future. Each time a game is completed, holders of winning player's currency are paid bonuses, so that all currencies should eventually pay dividends. In other words, if you figure the outcome wrong in one game, you are still in the running for the remainder of the games. BM auctions off currency each session, and players may auction off their own currency through the BM, or make whatever deals they wish between themselves (subject to it's being reported to the BM -- with the reporting procedure allowing for some interesting double-crosses....). Holdings of dropouts (currency and New Dd) are also auctioned off by the BM. Proposed rules in DIPLOMANIA #30 (35¢ (30¢ to G.B. Reg. members)); for extract including complete proposed rules, send 6¢ stamp.

QFC Bourse -- Will include suggestions made by Charles Wells and John McCallum, plus a couple of ideas of Ye Olde BM. Basically like QAC-QDC Bourses, except that Dd themselves have an intrinsic value which they do not have in the current Bourses (since currency is exchanged at end of Bourse for Dd, rather than New Dd...thus person who makes a killing in Dd by playing Market should do as well as player who speculates on winning currency....). Other rules will be announced when game QFC roster has three or four paid players on it.
