Pwc (Continued) -Propaganda --

St.Petersburg (the Winter Palace) -- At a magnificent 51-course banquet celebrating the advent of peace in Europe, His Imperial Majesty Alexander IV, Emperor of All the Russias, arose to address His assembled guests. The Supreme Autocrat toasted the Turkish Ambassador for the faithfulness with which the Russo-Turkish alliance has been kept. "Without the assistance of our southern allies, peace would have been impossible", noted the Tsar. #### Following dinner, guests were treated to a speech by Grand Marshall Baileyov. Baileyov commended the superior performance of Russian troops during the recently-concluded war, but soon entered upon an analysis of the causes of the war. #### Noting that dangerous revolutionary tendencies had necessitated Russo-Turkish intervention in the Hapsburg and Hohenzollern domains, the Grand Marshall quickly moved to a discussion of the causes of war with France and England. "Basic perfidy!" emphasized Baileyov. "The leaders of both France and England were notoriously unreliable. Indeed, we ourselves have suffered at their hands in other realms." Listeners knowledgable in diplomatic affairs took this to be a reference to games BARAD-DUR G and X-12. "Of course", concluded Baileyov, "it was first necessary to insure the demise of England, before that of France. Whereas the French leadership was predictably treacherous, the English leadership -- against all laws of logic -- was the sort which would turn on its best ally! Such nations do not deserve to exist." With this conclusion, Baileyov's speech was rewarded with a fifteen-minute standing ovation. Partying continued well into the night.
