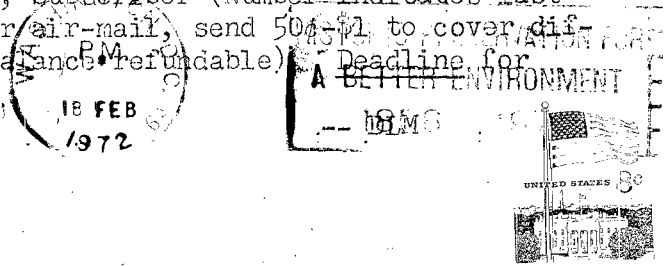

Moscow (Nov 11th 1905) -- Celebrations were held throughout Russia (including the lost provinces of Ukraina and Sevastopol) over the Czar's magnificent and total crushing of Germany. The Great, Highly Intelligent, Brave, Super Czar was quoted as saying, "This is but the beginning; We shall destroy all Our enemies, We shall liberate Ukraina and Sevastopol and all other enslaved countries under Austrian domination. Justice eventually will be achieved. Germany broke a solemn bond between us by entering Our territorial waters and I, acting as an instrument of right did destroy the intruder. Now it is Austria-Hungary's turn."

Moscow (Nov 12th 1905) -- The Great, Highly Intelligent, Brave, Super Czar today declared war upon England saying, "I have been extremely honest and kind to the nation of England; I forgave it even for direct attacks upon Our territories; I spoke true to it warning him of my Scandinavian assault while he requested an alliance; I offered a sharing of German spoils with him--and, after all this, he, the Stupid King of England, still conspired against Me and still directly attacked Me. No nation has ever shown more kindness and forgiveness than that which Russia extended to England, but there must be a limit for the sake of My peoples. England, we are at war!"

Aaaaaa, Hawaii (1 Jan 1904) (A Gas-Par) -- In this quaint Hawaiian town (whose name means "the lazy lava", in case you were wondering), now the capital of the Hawaiian Islands, Queen Lottahuuaha II today declared Her nation's alliance with the Kingdom of England. Her Majesty, in a Royal Rescript, denounced the "treacherous Frogs" and "blockheaded Huns" whose machinations against King-Emperor Huon XVIII's realm "mark a fundamental assault on the High Culture of Europe". Her Majesty deplored the Froggo-Hun occupation of England and threatened to dip the Frog and Hun ambassadors in boiling hot poi unless something were done about it. Much has been said about the English locked-up position of A StP, A Nor, A Den, F Por, F Mid, and F Natl which, assuming no fleets behind the line, locks up eight supply centers (Lon, Lvp, Edi, Nor, Swe, StP, Den, & Por) with only six units. However, very little has been said about the corresponding French locked-up position, which is even stronger once obtained.

The key is the land blockade of A Bur, A Ruh, and L Kie, where Kie replaces Den in the above English locked-up position (note that you could get by with Hol and Den in place of Kie, but this would require one more unit for one less supply center). If Germany is still alive and capable of building Fleets in Berlin which could attack Scandinavia through Lvn and Ber, the addition of F Bal and F Bot would suffice for 100% safety in the north.

The southern half of the French position is a little more difficult. The minimum would be F Mar, F Spa(SC), F Lyo, with F WMed and F Naf. This provides a total of 15 centers for 10 units (12, with two Fleets in Bal and Bot). By replacing Naf with Tunis, we obtain 16 centers for the same 12 units.

Additional expansion could add Ven, Rom, and Nap by replacing the above five units with A Pie, A Ven, A Tus or Rom, A Apu, A Nap, F Tyn, and A Tun. This provides 19 centers (StP, Nor, Swe, Den, Kie, Hol, Bel, Edi, Lvp, Lon, Bre, Par, Mar, Spa, Por, Tun, Nap, Rom, and Ven) "locked-up", with only 14 units maximum (A StP, Nor, Kie, Ruh, Bur, Pie, Ven, Rom, Apu, Nap, Tun, F Tyn, Bal, Bot) (note that A's StP, Nor, Kie, Ven, Apu, Nap, Tun could be replaced by Fleets).

If you think the position is unobtainable, I refer you to EREHWON 1971F, where--if I elected to do so--I could easily conquer Scandinavia and obtain the above position.

For those to whom the orders are not obvious, the locked-up orders would be: A StP (H), (S) by A Norway; F Bot & F Bal (S) ea. other, A Kie (H); A Ruh (S) A Kie; A Bur (H); A Ven (H); A Pie & A Rom (S) A Ven; A Apu (H); A Nap (S) A Apu; F Tyn (H); F Tun (H).

The key to it all is the "Holcombe Line" of A Kie, A Ruh, A Bur. Any English-French alliance which can establish this line would become virtually impregnable in the north, and would have all kinds of units to play around with in the south. Similarly, it should be noted that a French-Italian alliance wherein France controls the northern seas would be equally powerful. It goes without saying that an Eng-Fra-Ita alliance would be extremely hard to stop.

Note: S means the score or total points tabulated from the ballots, N means the number of ballots listing the player's name on the top board or the second board. QBC -- Final Comment (from Rod Walker): In the end, I was unable to follow any consistent policy. I had to remain friendly with Russia, and yet when he began to move against me, toward the end, I launched an attack on his Italian possession. Gene wrote to say he was only protecting himself, which was convincing enough, but I simply forgot to send in any change to my orders. Hence, by a fluke, we would up tied for second, a state of affairs I had not envisioned. ##### On the other hand, it was obvious that I could not stop Ver Ploeg from winning. A war in the Mediterranean could only result in my loss of a center or two, so I followed a defensive, but hardly friendly, policy in that area. ##### The single missed move by Russia of course set at nought my more elaborate plans: cooperating with Ver Ploeg while pretending to cooperate with Prosnitz, in order to create some incongruous situations. Or letting the two of them deadlock and then attacking them both with the intent to win the game myself. ##### This was a game situation I had never encountered before: two great powers locked in struggle in such a way that a third minor power had little to fear from either and little to offer--save nonaggression--as well. I could have helped Ver Ploeg by attacking Prosnitz--but my one overriding policy in this game was to keep it going as long as possible and to see what developed. Alas, it didn't work.

Re DPBA #92 H-R's Change Section & comments therein:

John Boyer -- I read Phil Sageser's comment concerning taking control of a supply center. It seems to me that we ought to look at the game historically in order to see any sense in the ruling. In those days, winter was normally not a time to wage war, and probably resulted more often in the replenishing of the armed forces for the coming spring attacks. Thus, we have our builds during the winter season. However, one cannot take control of a foreign hostile province in spring and then leave it in the fall of the same year without running the risk of the local populace rising up against the conquerors. It would seem more logical that in order to obtain the supplies for building another unit, it would require a force to be stationed in the occupied area to make sure that the local populace does not refuse to help in building an enemy unit. All we have to remember is the trouble the Germans had in France during World War II with the French Resistance.

Rod Walker -- You might note that the new postmarks include the first three numbers of the ZIP code, which is sufficient to identify the city or area of origin. For instance, all "921" letters originate in San Diego. It is no more difficult under the old system to send in orders from someone else's ZIP than it is under the new system.
