

Grandpa Havlicek worked as a set-up man in a door-and-window factory, and though never rich, the family did manage, and more importantly, always were close and happy. Grandpa used to take Grandma to look at the skyscrapers going up in downtown Chicage during the Daley years and proudly proclaim that his handiwork was part of the window-and-door work of those buildings.

Grandpa died in 1968, and Grandma lived on, finally succumbing this week to the leukemia she had been fighting for six years. To the last, she was a medel patient, accepting her afflictions, and cheerily joking with her family, friends, and even her nurses.

The many STAR readers who knew her, we're sure, can realize the magnitude of her less to this family. To those who really didn't know her, we can only say that had they, they would have recognized her as a truly great lady.
