BATS IMPROVED, BUT NOT ENOUGH! McDADE  
 INSULTS EVERYBODY!

BROOKFIELD--the Brookfield Wombats (formerly Naperville Hawks) have improved in every aspect of the sport, but will still finish 4th at best in the divisional realignment of the UBA.

"Ours will be the tougher division, no doubt about it," says Bats skipper Spanky McDade. "The other division is full of patsies. That fluke Hattiesburg operation. And Niles, which always over-rates itself. I've got the chuckle. They'll probably be knocked off by the new girls on the block, ya know, that outfit Levin is puttin' together. That'll knock their ~~sox~~ off. I'd say Rochester will take it easy in that division. Thunder Bay still has too many holes, and Peters' team is a hodge-podge."
