CHICAGO/HINSDALE,
August 13—Channel 2 (CBS) news announced today that it has hired Andrea Wiley to head up the news department's planning unit. Ms Wiley has ended nearly ten months of indolence, and reports for work this coming Monday.

Her work will entail long-and-short-range story planning, as well as planning for special projects, such as election coverage. As Nancy Slonim has pointed out, now it will be possible for you to see stories you read about in the STAR translated into stories on Channel two.

But, because inside every silver lining there's a dark cloud, the new job means Wiley and hubby Jim Benes will have to cancel their 5-week European tour, two years in the planning.

All over Europe, merchants in Prague, Vienna, Florence, Rome, and Athens expressed distress that the bubble of expected booming business had burst.  nothing short of disaster!"

The Wiley announcement came the same week as the Czech government's granting of the Wiley-Benes application for visas.

Benes, who has long been in contact with friends in Prague, admitted that he was both disappointed and happy at the same time. "I'm glad she'll be bringing home a paycheck," he said, "with any luck we'll shoot for the Prague Music Festival next Spring."

Benes immediately cancelled his request for a leave-of-absence. But that still leaves him with four weeks of vacation in September/October. He has contacted the Chicago Cubs about getting playoff and World Series tickets, and he reportedly is thinking about flying to San Francisco or Houston to pester Tom Eng and/or Bob Benes.
