## REVIEWS: GAME REVIEW: The Consulting Detective Game

The Consulting Detective Game by Sleuth Publications of San Francisco is not a board game, there is no dice, nothing left to chance. You are presented with a mystery to solve and it is then up to you to trace the threads of evidence. The culprit is traced down from the newspaper and/or the ~~clue~~ clue book.

The game tries to recapture the spirit of Victorian London by providing a map of London in the late 1800's and a London address directory. The newspaper Archives add to this nostalgia feeling by providing a little insight on daily life.

Once the case is read the player(s) who may work individually or in teams, decide where they want to go, i.e. the scene of the crime or who they want to talk with, such as the victim's wife. You locate these people and places by looking up the address in the directory and then go to that address in the ~~clue~~ clue book.

The winner is determined by a net game score. The net game score is made up of the number of turns it takes the player to reach a solution; the difference between that number of turns and how many it took Holmes; and the number of points awarded to correct answers in the bonus quiz.

This game is a lot of fun and a challenge. We recommend this game especially to those of you trying to wean yourselves from Trivial Pursuit.

## BOOK REVIEW: THE MONK by Matthew Lewis

Because Alan Peters and I both enjoy reading but never seem to read the same books we entered into a pact by which each gives the other one reading assignment each January. After the reading has been completed, we are capable of carrying on an intelligent discussion of the works assigned.

This year, Alan's assignment to me was a real gem. It's THE MONK by Matthew Lewis, one of the first Gothic novels, written in 1796. Anyone who suffered thru the nuns' tales of robbers whose hands froze to holy statues when they tried to strip them of their gems and thus had to have their hands cut off will really appreciate this book. It's probably the source material for all those nuns who frightened kids with their stories.

The MONK himself is Ambrosio, a seemingly saintly man who lives in Madrid. But after he discovers some of the secrets of life in the abbey, he turns into a monster bent upon the destruction of a sweet young innocent.

Yes friends, not only is THE MONK probable source material for the nuns' tales, but also for all those Protestants who hated and feared the men (and women) of the cloth of the Roman Catholic Church.

THE MONK is ~~intriguing~~ intriguing and diabolical. Throughout it, you may find ~~yourself~~ yourself wondering what action is of man's making, and what is of some supernatural origin. In any event, it is a recommended reading.
