WHITE CITY COUNCILMAN INSISTS HE'S BLACK

SAN FRANCISCO (PIRATED from the Reuters News Agency)—Mark Stabbins is white, with blue eyes and ginger hair, but he insists he is black, or at least feels black and identifies with black people.

Last year he ran successfully in a local election in the city of Stockton, east of San Francisco, and became a councilman representing a predominantly black district.

This did not please the previous incumbent, whose name is Ralph Thite, but who is unquestionably black.

Now, in one of the oddest disputes in California's often bizarre political history, White is seeking to have Stebbins removed as councilman, claiming that he cheated black voters by saying he was black.

But Stebbins, whose parents, grandparents, brother and sisters are identified as white, says: "I'm black as far as I'm concerned. I m identify with black."

White, who had represented the district for 12 years and lost the election by lule votes, argues that many black voters in the district would not have voted for Stebbins if they had known that he was white-skimned.

The disgruntled ex-councilman carries around with him copies of Stebbins' birth certificate saying that both his parents were white.

So are his four sisters, a brother and all his grandparents. But Stebbins, who has spent most of his career as a social worker in poor districts of San Francisco and Stockton, still insists that, as far as he is concerned, he is black.

Stebbins: first wife, by whom he had two children, was white, but his second and third wives have been black. He wears his hair in the Afro style adopted by many blacks.

In a newspaper interview Stebbins said the trouble started when he spoke before an influential black group during the election campaign.

Many in Stockton agree that Stebbins' skin color should not matter, "If he has a black orientation, he's one of us." said Mark Faley, head of the Black Studies Department at the local university.

Stebbins is also supported by Stockton's mayor, Randall Ronk, who has won a temporary delay of the recall election procedure under which What a hopes to have Stebbins ousted from the city council, Others argue there is no reacon why Stebbins should not represent blacks just because of his fair skin.

Whatever their color, White and Stebbins are at opposite ends of the spectrum in terms of personality. The bespectacled Stebbins sometimes speaks so quietly he is inaudible, while White is a brash extrovert, often calling himself the "Black Messiah" of the local community.

While Stebbins lives and works with the poor, White is a highly successful businessman, reportedly a millionaire who made his fortune as a nightclub operator and a bail bondsman.

True to his outspoken style, White claims that he is the victim not only of a political confidence trick but also of a nationwide plot against elected black officials.

As evidence he notes that the only other black councilman in Stockton also lost in last November's election.

Of Stebbins' claim to be black, White says: "If the momma is an elephant and the daddy is an elephant ax they sure can't have no lion. They got to have a baby elephant."
