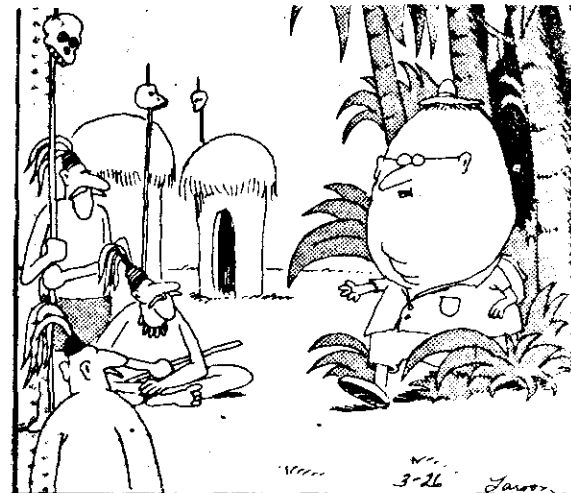

**CANARYVILLE TAKES WHITEHORSE TO FIVE;
 MAINWAY IN DOGHOUSE**

CANARYVILLE, April 2—Down two games to one and fighting for their lives, the Canaryville Parrots evened the best of five x affair at two apiece with a 107-94 pasting of the Whitehorse 98ers. But, as has been the case throughout this campaign, it didn't come easy.

The Parrots opened up an early 12-6 lead, extended that to 22-12 by the 7 minute mark, and coasted through the first quarter with a comfortable 34-25 advantage. Maury Eaton led the ~~xxxxxx~~ way with 6 buckets, to the delight of the 12,682 Parrot fanatics attending the contest. Irwin Mainway, a midseason acquisition obtained to bolster Canaryville's overall playoff chances, chipped in with 6 pts and 5 rebounds.

All seemed well until, with five minutes gone in the second quarter and Canaryville ahead 42-32, Mainway suddenly and inexplicably took himself out of the game. He would not return. The 98ers immediately took advantage with a 10-2 run, and with 4:13 left in the quarter it was 44-42 Parrots. Parrots Coach Blovinski Skelvankovich called time, the Parrots regrouped and promptly exhibited one of x the most awesome offensive displays in recent memory, outscoring the Prospectors 18-11 in the closing minutes of the half. This pivotal stretch seemed to take the wind out of the 98ers' sails, as the Parrots coasted in the second half to an eventual 107-94 final.
