



In game one, led by Murray Bannerman's 33 saves the Hornets won 4-2 while being outshot 41-26. Then in game 2, goals by Dave Christian and Wayne Gretzky in the last 5 minutes of the game gave the Hornets a 5-4 victory, a 2 game leadin the series, and the prospect of playing the remaining games on home ice was where the Hornets had only lost 5 games all year including 2 to the Cougars.

The Hornets lead 1-3 in game 3, when the Cougars pulled their goalie and tied the game with just 32 seconds left in the game. The Cougars then won on a power play goal at 7:06 of the overtime period. Dishearted, the Hornets then lost the remaining two games 7-3 and 6-3 allowing 3 power play goals in each game. Disappointing yes, but wait till next year!

There are 16 teams in 4 divisions in the NAHL. The Huskies, with a record of 47-14-7 compiled the best record. The worst was the 10-50-8 mark set by the Dynamo. John's Hornets won the Mazeika Division with a record of 39-17-12.
