BOSTON--Alan Peters has again dropped out of the Universal Baseball Association, this time citing three reasons: the oversupply of power in UBA games, the length of the UBA schedule, and a compelling and time-consuming interest in the music of Richard Wagner.

UBA Commissioner Jim Gillespie is expected to announce a decision shortly on how he plans to handle the situation. ALLIANCE WINS TBA TITLE

ALLIANCE--In a record-setting display, the Alliance Screaming Eagles swept the Canaryville Parrots 3 games to none to win the 1984-85 TBA title.

Game one started slowly for the new champions. The Eagles appeared nervous, and the Parrots were able to take advantage of several mismatches to build a 32-24 lead after the first quarter. The lead reached 13 early in the second quarter before Maggie Sniegowski and Charles Jason went to work. Maggie surprised Irwin Mainway with a 3-point field goal, drew a foul, and within minutes Alliance had put together a run to knot the game at 50-all. The partisan crowd had a scare early in the third quarter when TBA co-MVP Charles Jason fouled out one minute into the stanza. "Buddy" had scored 24 points in the first half. The loss of Jason hurt Alliance, and the game was tied at 89 in the 4th quarter when an unlikely Eagle donned the hero's mantle. Dave Miedema, the "Ancient One," hit two buckets and blocked shot after shot from Mainway. Alliance outscored Canaryville 11-0 over a six minute stretch, and put game one in the win column with a 109-98 final.

Canaryville was the setting for game 2. Maggie Sniegowski came out gunning for the Screaming Eagles, scoring the first 12 points for Alliance. Despite some fine first half shooting by "Studs" Ramwell, the visitors quietly built a 15 point lead. The second half was strictly a snoozer, as the Parrots could not bring the deficit under 11 and actually trailed by as many as 21. Alliance walked to a 120-105 win, with 4 players at 20 or more points for the game. As was the case in game one rebounding was not a factor, and the 2 game totals showed the Parrots with 76 and the Screaming Eagles with 75.

With a standing room only crowd back at St Stanislaus Hall, the Screaming Eagles came home for the biggest game in their history. TBA coach of the year Jashu Mroz was determined not to disappoint the fans, and he turned his charges loose. The resulting carnage was not for the squeamish. With their long-suffering fans roaring, the Screaming Eagles put on a clinic. With Maggie and Oattie Ray Ditto leading the way, the champions raced out to a 31-15 first quarter lead. During the halftime break, Mroz conferred with General Manager I M Sleazy, who told Mroz to "Go for it!" Mroz left the starters in for the second half, and the result was a new TBA playoff record for margin of victory, 42 points. The final was 123-81, and once again Alliance had four players with 20 or more points. The boards were 49-32 Alliance.

In addition to the margin of victory mark, Alliance's 6-0 playoff record is the first time a team has gone undefeated in the post-season competition. The Screaming Eagles also tied the league mark of 12 home wins in a season. Charles Jason's 22 of 22 from the free throw line during the playoffs may also be a league record.

While Mroz was enjoying his first-ever championship, there were rumors of mass retirements from the Eagles starting lineup, a factor which may have influenced Alliance's decision to "run up the score" in game three. Watch the Star-Post for details.

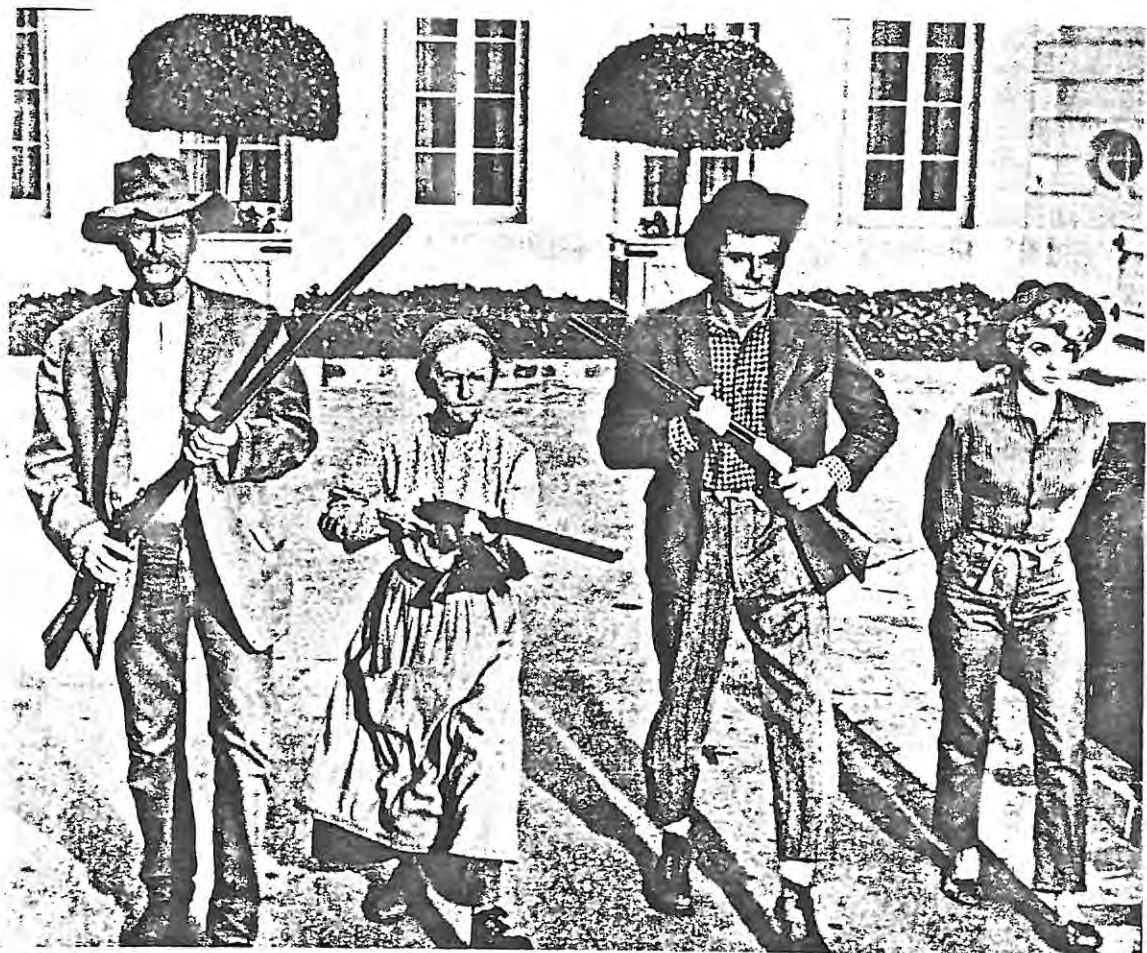

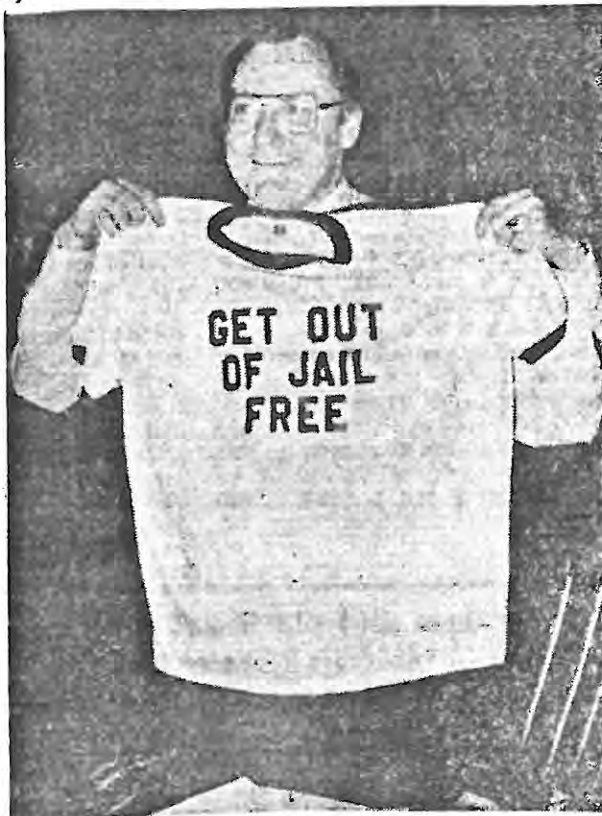
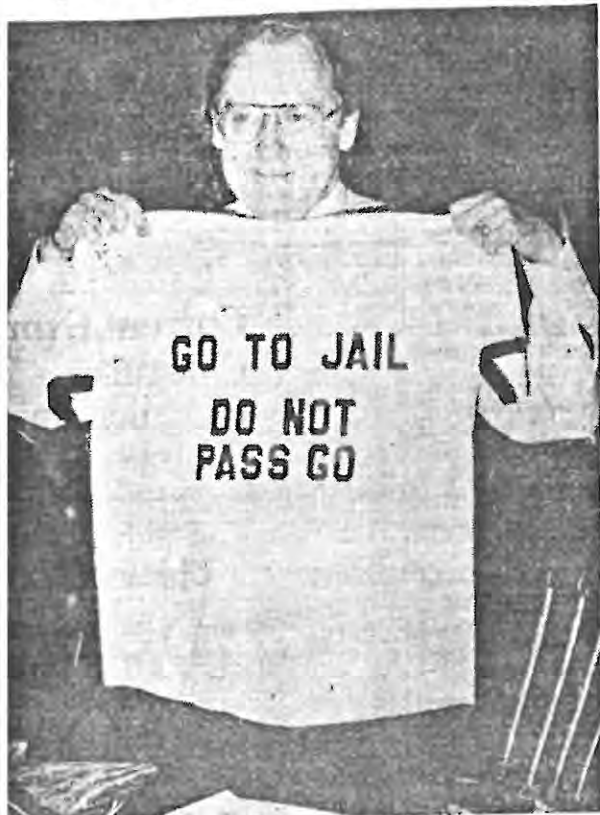
