Avenue, LaGrange, Illinois 60525) The war got off to a quick start, as
all 34 supply centers were owned by someone or other after Fall, 1901.
Germany executed a quick invasion of Burgundy, but was deterred from
further action by the advances of the Russian and Austrian armies from
the East.

Meanwhile, Italy, Turkey and Austria more or less stalemated them-
selves in the south.

Germany, fighting on 3 fronts, surrendered in 1904; Italy followed
the next year, as French fleets marauded along the Italian coast.

By 1904 1905 the situation had polarized, with the Vienna-Budapest-
St Petersburg axis taking on the rest of the world. The forces of the
Anglo-French alliance, aided by the Ottomans, tried to hold them off,
but by 1907 over half of Europe was under the flags of Russia and Austria-
Hungary.

In 1908, after the Turkish army had been decimated, their fleet dis-
banded, and their country looted, a peace conference met at Geneva and
awarded control of the world to Austria-Hungary and Russia.
