RENO, NEV, Nov 1--Nevada Desert Rider Coach Fireball Murphy today said that he would allow center Mickey Rumball-Petre to attempt no more than 20 free throws in any game, effective immediately.

At a jammed press conference at Snake-Eyes Palace, Murphy told reporters that Rumball-Petre had complained that the "pun-nelling and hacking" was taking its toll on his body and that the welts and marks at game's end weren't worth the price he had to pay for success. This plan, if approved, could become known as "Murphy's Law," means that after the big man attempts his 20th foul shot, he would then leave the game at the next dead ball. Approval should become final after Commissioner James "Theo" Benes reviews the proposal.

In Denver, TBA Commissioner Benes told the STAR, "The plan is strictly voluntary, so Murphy doesn't need my approval. But I salute him. It's something that's long been needed in the TBA, a voluntary restraint on the drawing of fouls. Let me put it this way: Any TBA owner who wouldn't go along with such a plan for his own team is a bum!"
