**BOOK REVIEW: The Contaminant by  
Loonard Reirroi**

Here's something new for you to worry about: an obscure general hidden deep within the bowels of the Pentagon has headed up his own secret project for the past ten years: all of the grain that the

US has sold to the Soviet Union has been contaminated with a carcinogen. As a result, the cancer rate within the USSR has exploded, thus weakening the population as a whole, and the ruling class in particular, since it most benefits from American foodstuffs.

Impossible? Scary, we're afraid it's quite possible given the technology of the day. And, it's nearly undetectable as well, since ~~undetectable~~ additives in the parts-per-million or parts-per-billion range are all that's needed to do the job. And, as well, there have been at least two cases of murder-by-cancer in the world to date that have resulted in ~~ix~~ trials and convictions.

In The Contaminant, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff finds out about the project after months of fiddling with a super-sophisticated computer system. He's on his way to tell the President, who's campaigning for re-election when his jet crashes. But a newsman finds a copy of his report, the newsman's colleague steals it, and thus the world begins to find out about the project known as "M 10."

What happens? Well, the Soviet population screams for revenge, and the US population, fearing revenge in the form of a nuclear attack panics. There are some very tense moments as the President tries to deal with the Russians, and with the man who has defeated him ~~in~~ in his bid for re-election. Not until six pages are left do we find out whether or not The Contaminant is the spur that causes World War III. We won't tell you the outcome. This is an excellent thriller. The Contaminant is a Dell paperback. Rate it \*\*\*\*.
