suburb resoundingly defeated a tax referendum
this past weekend, and
as a result, the government of Riverside has
fallen.

The referendum would have increased Riverside's general fund by 30% and the police and fire fund by 250%. Riverside voters turned down the measure by 1700 to 700.

Because of the vote of no confidence, the government resigned, and STAR notable Jim Gillespie seized the opportunity to sweep into power.
