While over 15,000 runners are expected to participate on the East Coast in the New York City marathon, almost 2000 are registered to run on the West Coast as the 3rd Annual Golden Gate Marathon gets under way in San Francisco on Oct 26. RIVERSIDE, Oct 21-

-Voters in this western suburb resoundingly defeated a tax referendum this past weekend, and as a result, the government of Riverside has fallen.

The referendum would have increased Riverside's general fund by 30% and the police and fire fund by 250%. Riverside voters turned down the measure by 1700 to 700.
